Secretarial Course

A new secretarial course will be available at Clarendon College in the 1968 fall semester. The course, entitled the Concentrated College Training for business (CCTB), is being pioneered by Clarendon College, South Plains College, and West Texas State University. It was conceived by Mr. Milton Morris from West Texas State University, who also fathered the Texas Opportunity Loan Plan. The course was designed according to criteria formulated by a combined committee composed of area college and industrial personnel and offers training in those skills which employers seek in a potential employee.

CCTB is a unique course and is the first of its kind to be offered in the state. It not only provides a concentrated series of business training courses, but it also carries college academic credit. It is designed for high school graduates who desire a short but intensified training in secretarial skills without obtaining college degrees. However, should a student decide to continue with her college work, the semester credits earned can be applied toward a degree.

Hansard Nominated

Congressman Bob Price has announced the names of 37 Panhandle youths who received his nomination for appointment to the US Military, Naval, Air Force, and Merchant Marine Academies. The students made application for the nominations and were chosen on the basis of Civil Service Test Scores, high school academic records, athletic participation, and extracurricular activities.

Congressman Price stated that he made the nominations on an equally competing basis and that actual appointments would be announced later in the spring after the young men have been given physical examinations and College Board grades are known.

There are two vacancies at the US Air Force Academy and twelve young men will be competing for these vacancies. Among the six candidates for Vacancy B will be Wendell Allen Hansard of Hedley, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Hansard. His competitors will be two candidates from Amarillo, one from Canadian, one from Tulia and one from Canyon.

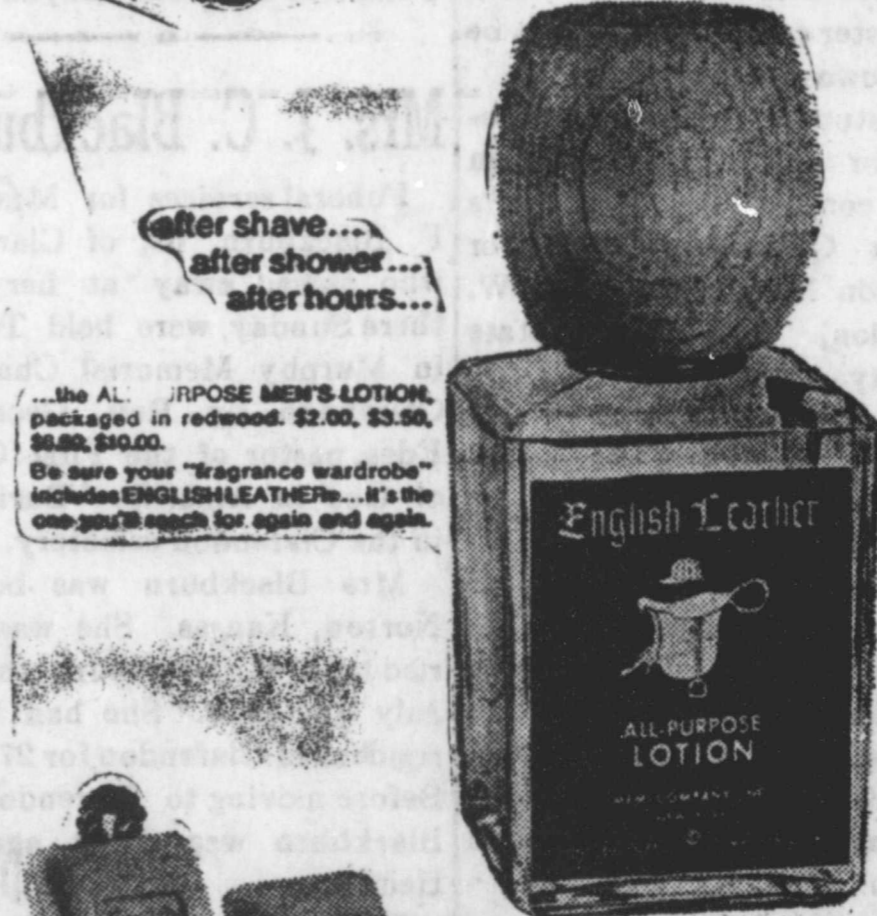
