Road Contract Let

Austin—A contract for highway construction in Donley and Hall Counties was awarded by the Texas Highway Commission during its February meeting according to District Engineer V. J. McGee of Childress.

Ivan Dement Inc. of Amarillo and J. H. Strain & Sons of Tye were awarded the contract on a low bid of \$1,378,830.44.

The project includes the construction of grading, structures, flexible base, asphalt stabilized base, hot mix asphaltic concrete pavement and a safety rest area, and is located on US 287, FM 2361, FM 3032 and Spur 2361. The work extends from 0.3 mile east of Hedley to the Hall County line; in Memphis from State Highway 256 to US 287 and from SH 256 five miles east of Memphis to FM 1619.

Carroll B. Hudson of Clarendon is the Highway Department engineer in charge of the project which is expected to take 250 working days.

Secretarial Course

A new secretarial course will be available at Clarendon College in the 1968 fall semester. The course, entitled the Concentrated College Training for business (CCTB) is being pioneered by Clarendon College, South Plains College, and West Texas State University. It was conceived by Mr Milton Morris from West Texas State University, who also fathered the Texas Opportunity Loan Plan. The course was designed according to criteria formulated by a combined committee composed of area college and industrial personnel and offers training in those skills which employers seek in a potential employee.

CCTB is a unique course and is the first of its kind to be offered in the state. It not only provides a concentrated series of business training courses, but it also carries college academic credit. It is designed for high school graduates who desire a short but intensified

training in secretarial skills without obtaining college degrees. However, should a student decide to continue with her college work, the semester credits earned can be applied toward a degree.

Any student interested in enrolling in the CCTB program should contact the Registrar's Office at Clarendon College or Mr Milton Morris, Box 215, W. T. Station, West Texas State University.

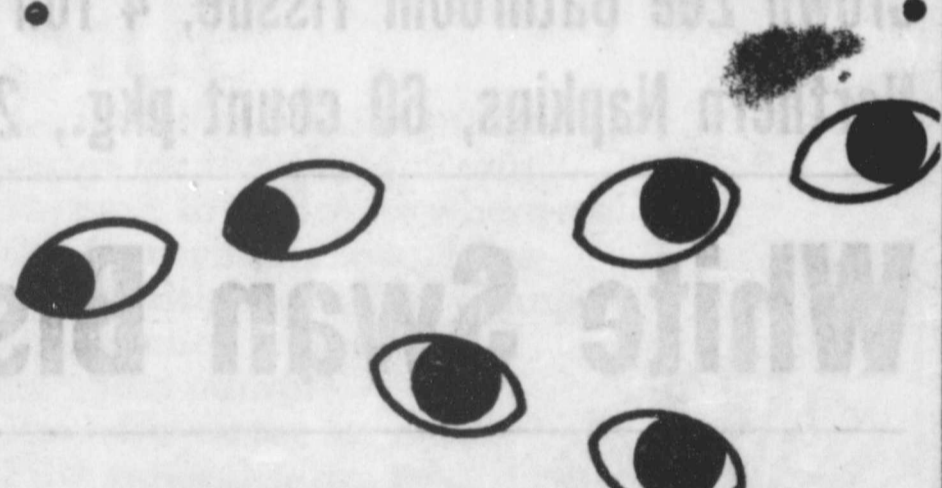

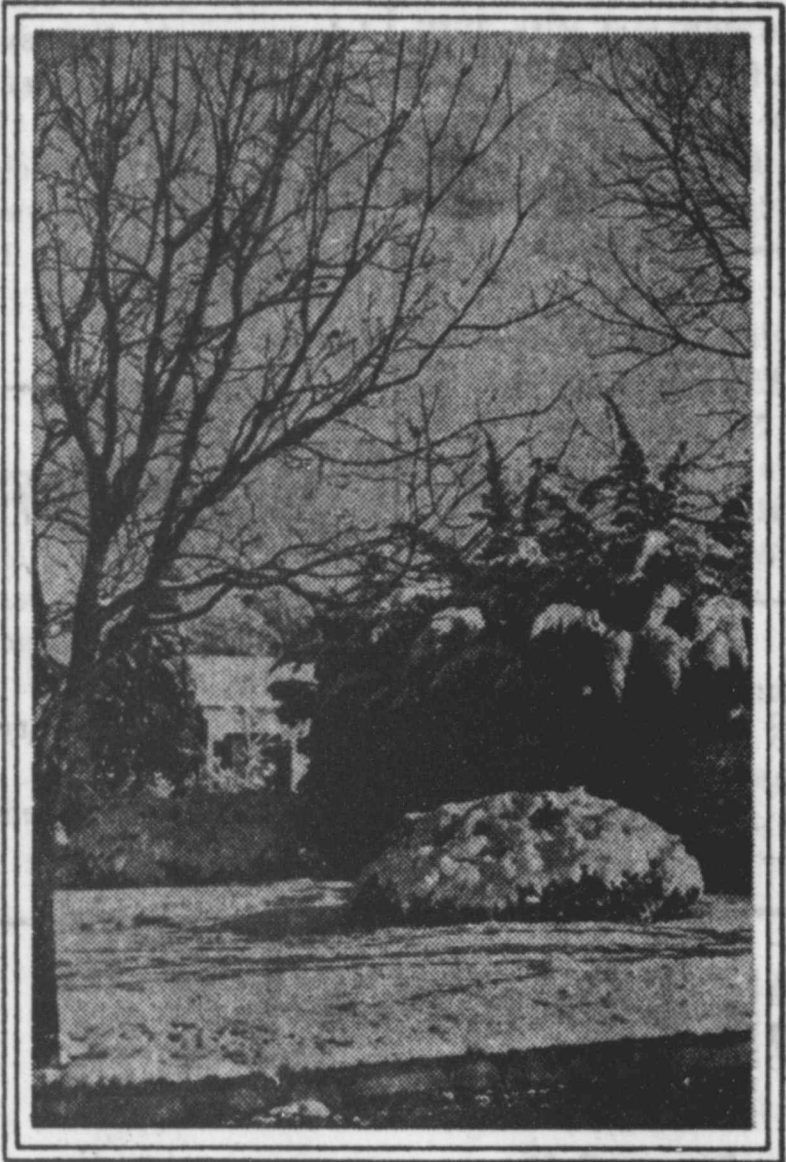

Easter Seal Appeal

Because of the steady growth in numbers of crippled children and adults in Texas, the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Texas has stepped up its rehabilitation services. According to Mr Wesley Knorpp who is the Easter Seal Representative for Donley County, a total of 17,622 handicapped Texans received Easter Seal treatments during 1967. The largest group served include those with major deformities of bones and joints, severe speech defects, cerebral palsy, arthritis, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis and stroke. The Easter Seal Campaign which provides funds for continuation for these services began March 1 and continues through April 14, Easter Sunday.
