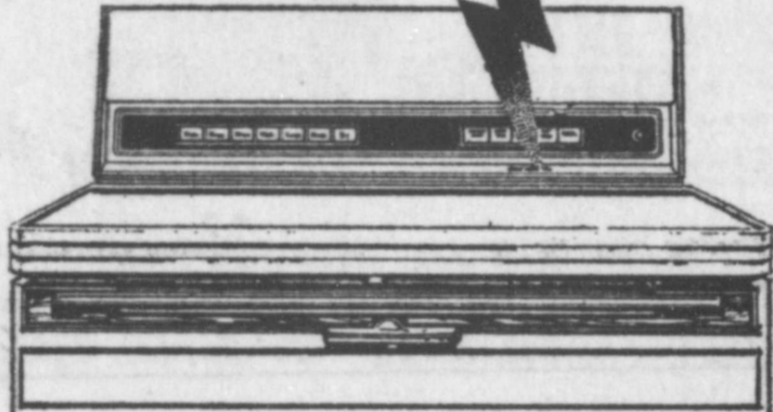
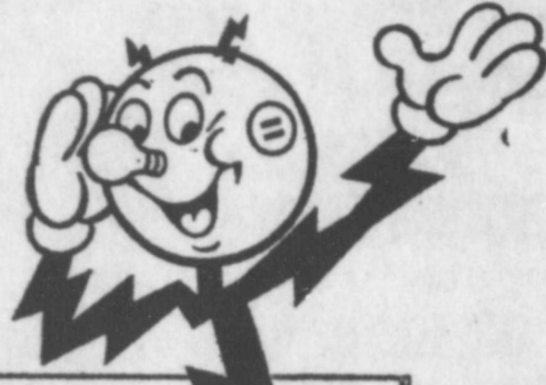

## Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Colonel Wilson E. Spair, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today that motor vehicle inspections in Texas are running almost 30% behind the inspection rate at this time last year.

"Unless the inspections rate increases, there are going to be some

awfully long lines at inspection stations prior to the April 15 deadline," Spair said.

During the year which ended Aug 31 some 63 million vehicles were inspected in Texas. Since Sept 1, only 538,000 have received the required inspection.

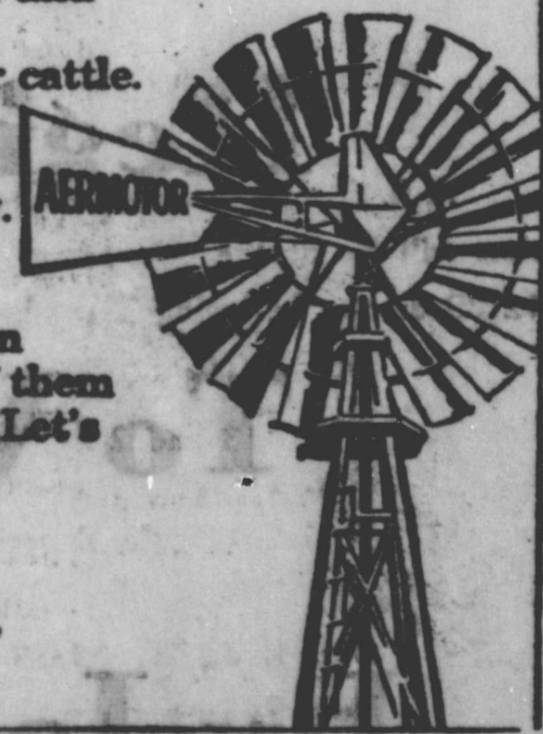
