Hedley School States | School Favorites Its Free Lunch Policy Are Elected

Superintendent Garlon Freeman has announced that the Hedley schools will again this year provide free, or lunches at a reduced price to children whose families cannot afford to pay the full price Regular priced school lunches are Elementary 35¢, High School 40¢ school employees 40¢ and visitors \$1.00. He said that forms had been made available showing family size and income eligibility requirements.

In deciding if children are eligible for either a ree or reduced price lunch, we will also take into consideration any unusual circumstances such as prolonged illness, unexpected expenses due to disaster, seasonal unemp oyment and similar emergency situations

All applications will be rev ewed by Freeman within three days and parents notif ed promptly as to the decision. Freeman said that if children were found to be elgible to receive reduced price lucches, parents would be notified as to the amount they will be expected to pay

Any parent who feels that they cannot pay the amount listed, or whose application is rejected may appeal the decision Freeman said. Notice Of Special Election

To the duly qualified resident voters of the City of Hedley, Texas and to all other interested persons:

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in and throughout the City of Hedley, Texas on the 18th day of September, 1971 on the question of the adoption of a One Percent (1%) Local Sales and Use Tax within said City, in keeping with the following ordinance adopted by the City Council of said City, as follows, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF HED. LEY, TEXAS, ON THE QUEST-ION OF THE ADOPTION OF A OEN PERCENT (1 %) LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX WITH-IN THE CITY; DESIGNATING THE DAY OF THE ELECTION AND THE POLLING PLACES: APPOINTING ELECTION OFFI-CIALS THEREFOR PAOVIDING THAT ALL DULY QUALIFIED RESIDENT ELECTORS SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO VOTE; PRESCRIBING FORM OF BAL-LOT; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF ELECTION; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELAT-

ING TO SAID ELECTION; PRO-VIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMER-GENCY.

Whereas, Article 1066c, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 36, Page 62) authorzes the governing body of any city, town or village in Texas to call an election for the purpose of adopting a local sales and use tax within such city, town or village, Now Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEDLEY, TEXAS:

Section 1. That a special election shall be held in and throughout the City of Hedley, Texas, on the 18th day of September, 1971, at which election there shall be submitted to the residents qualified voters of said City, for their action thereupon, the following propositions:

"FOR adoption of a one percent (1 %) local sales and use tax within the city."

"AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1 %) local sales and use tax within the city."

Section 2. That said election shall be held at one polling place for all qualified voters of said City, and the polling place and presiding officers for said election shall be, to-wit:

Polling Place: City Hall, Hedley, Texas.

Presiding Officers:

Presiding Judge, Ross Springer. Alternate Presiding Judge, L. D. Messer.

The Presiding Judge at such election shall appoint two clerks.

Section 3. That said election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and all duty qualified resident voters of the City of Hedley, Texas, shall be qualified to vote.

Section 4. That the ballots of said election shall conform to the requirements of Section 2, Subsection G, of Article 1066c, Vernon's Tevas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 36, Page 62), and to the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended, and the language to be printed thereon shall include the following:

INSTRUCTIONS: Place an "X" in the square beside the

statement indicating the way you wish to vote.

FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city.

AGAINST adoption of a one percent (%) local sales and use tax within the city.



The City of Hedley baving received a petition, bearing the names of a sufficient number of qualified voters, requesting that an election be held to adopt the local sales and use tax in the City of Hedley an election for such purpose has been called for Sept. 18, 1971, at the City Uail in He l.y. Ross Springer has been named Pre iding Judge and L D Messer Alternate Presi ing Jud e. and two clerks will be appointed by Mr Springer

If the is-ue carries, the tax will be at the rate of 1%, and will be collected together with the state sales tax making a total of 5% sales tax, which is the same as in most of our neighboring towns


