The Hedley Owls covered themselves with glory last week end by winning the regional tournament at Levelland and qualifying for the state tourney for the first time since 1959. A large number of fans accompanied the team.

In the first game Friday Hedley defeated Anthony 59 to 49. Tony Rieken made 19 points. Daniel Bolin 18, Raymond Woodard 9, Leon Freeman 8 and Terry Collins 5.

In the semifinals Saturday Hedley won from Channing 46 to 37. Dan Bolin had 19. Leon Freeman 12, Tony Rieken 8, Raymond Woodard 4 and Terry Collins 3.

Then in the finals Hedley defeated Spade 69 to 60. Raymond Woodard made 23, Tony Rieken 18, Leon Freeman 16, Dan Bolin 10 and Terry Collins 2.

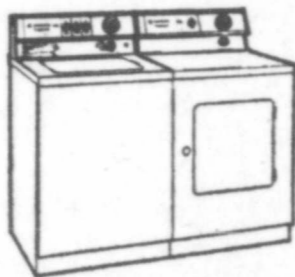

6 WAYS TO CONSERVE AND SAVE

ON HOME LAUNDRY



1. Wash and dry a full load, but never overload ... it is essential for each item to move freely for proper cleaning and drying.
2. Choose the correct cycle for washing modern materials. Perhaps hot water isn't needed, and only a gentle drying temperature.
