Illegal immigrant dies during crossing

Javier Martinez Razo, 38, of Colonia Neza Valcollo, Mexico, was pronounced dead by Kinney County Justice of the Peace Narce Villarreal at 3:56 p.m. on June 19.

Razo, his cousin Estevez Razo Raul, and two others were

making their way across the Circle D Ranch when Razo collapsed and died, read a report from the Kinney County Sheriff's Department.

Raul said he was walking with Razo when he started breathing heavy and fell to the ground. Raul said the coyote, or a guide paid to lead them from Mexico into the United States,

and the other man in the group, ran away leaving him alone with his ailing cousin. Raul stated he did what he could for Razo, but left him in order to run up to the highway to get help. Raul stated he had a hard time getting anyone to stop and assist him and his cousin was alone for approximately 45 minutes to an hour.

The men had reportedly been traveling for three days, walking only at night. They ate canned beans and tuna fish and drank from water troughs and stock tanks.

When questioned about whether or not Razo complained of being ill, Raul said his cousin never complained, but was heavy man and would fall be-

hind, and the coyote would hurry him up.

Razo had 164 US Dollars and several religious items in his pockets.

Judge Villarreal released Razo's body to Sunset Funeral Home, along with family contact information that will be passed onto the Mexican Consulate. No autopsy was ordered.

The Gonzalez Family, like many other families, chose to hold their biennial family reunion at Fort Clark Springs the weekend of June 24.

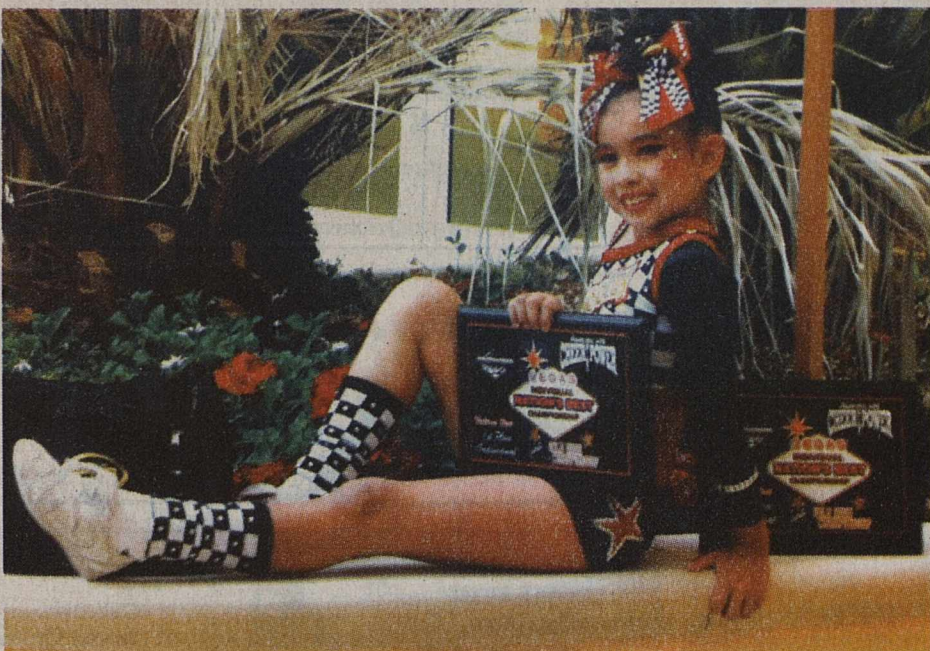

Court accepts donations; Votes to pave another road

Kinney County Commissioners voted to accept donations from business and private citizens to complete the School Paving Project at a Special meeting on July 5.

Sections of Fulton, Fort and Thomas streets were selected to be paved after the county received special permission to use \$110,000 in left over grant money from the Spofford paving project for a project in Brackettville, however, the cost of the project totaled \$130,000. The county and city contributed \$20,000, but \$10,000 was still needed. In a matter of days the money was pledged and Contractor AE Hiller and Sons, Inc.

began work on June 20.

At Tuesday's meeting, donations totaling \$13,500 from Jeff Janca, Sam and TJ Holloman, Don and Jean Hood, D. Harold Byrd Jr, Tim and Debbie Ward, CEC-Community Education Centers, Woody Massingill and Brackett News Weekly had been received, and another \$4,400 had been pledged.

The commissioners voted to approve and proposal by AE Hiller and Sons, Inc. to pave a section of Thorn Street for a total of \$4,670.

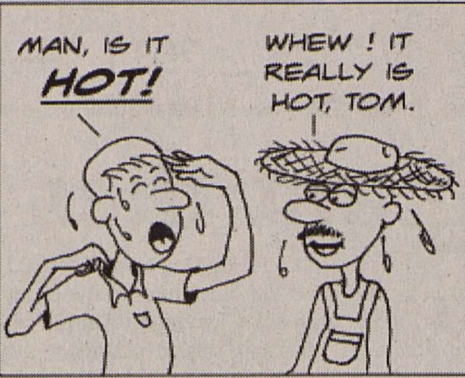

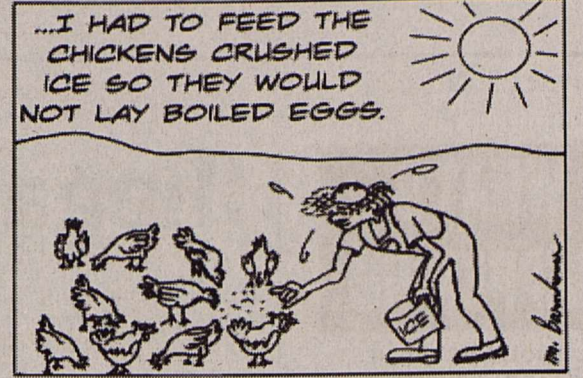

Jack says: Take the cover off the on the exterior of your refrigerator. You will be looking for a mustard colored powder.

If you see the powder it could be that cooling unit has a leak and the cooling unit will need replacement. The burner tube and orifice should be cleaned by certified technicians should you notice cob webs and rust around the burner tube. The refrigerator needs a clear flow of air to run properly and keep your food properly. There should not be any restrictions hindering the flow of air. Do not put screens over the outside cover or use a hair dryer on hot to defrost your refrigerator.

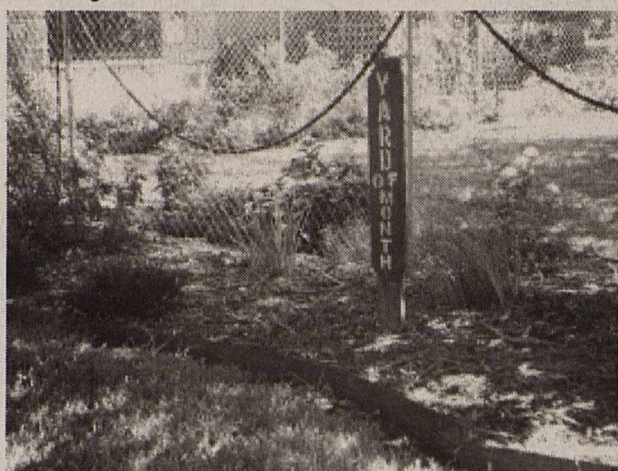

Texas NRCS offers additional funding following wildfires

Submitted by Hayden Keyser - San Angelo, TX, July 1, 2011—Landowners affected by wildfires in the West Texas region can apply for financial assistance through the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) for range deferral of all livestock grazing throughout the growing season, plant health concerns and cross fencing assistance.

EQIP is a continuous sign-up program and NRCS will be accepting applications for current funding assistance through July 29, 2011. In order to apply, landowners must visit the local NRCS office in the USDA Service Center in their county to fill out an application. Applications will be ranked and those approved for funding will be offered an EQIP contract.

Elisha Kuehn, NRCS assistant state conservationist said, "NRCS is prepared to assist landowners with prescribed grazing for deferral to rejuvenate plant health and prevent soil erosion due to drought and the effects from wildfires.

"We want to provide assistance that will enable landowners and livestock producers to accelerate the recovery of the health and vigor of affected grazing land," she said.

Kuehn suggests landowners consult with their local NRCS district conservationist to develop a conservation plan, which can be an effective strategy for pasture and rangeland recovery and mitigating the effects of the dry conditions that Texas is experiencing.

Wildlife habitat also can be impacted by wildfires and NRCS can provide technical and financial assistance in re-establishing the habitats for desired species.

For further assistance in evaluating your land and planning practices to address concerns following a wildfire, contact your local NRCS office or Soil and Water Conservation District. For more information about EQIP, visit Texas' NRCS website at www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov/programs/eqip.

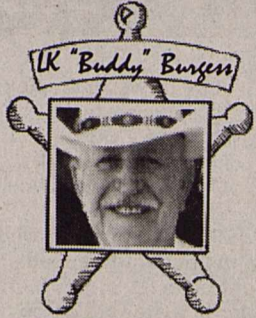

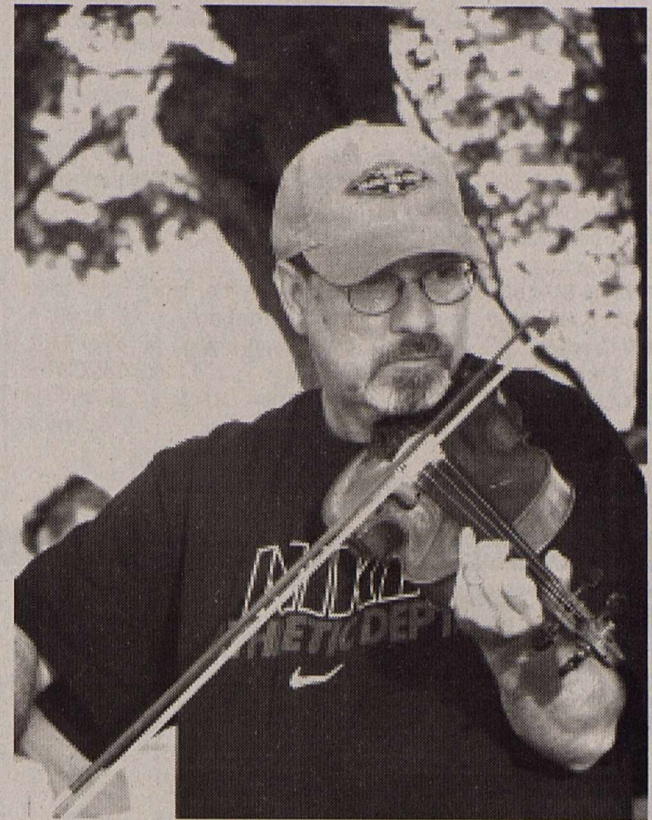
