BUSTNESS BLOCK IN ASEFS. Sunday Morning's Five Represents A Boat $\$ 300,000$ Loss.

Sunday mrning about 1.30 o'lock rae Nacogdoches fire manner -nd the bucket brigade turned out to a man to do battlacith the flames. But the drath had gained such headway that the efforts of the men to extinguish the flames seemed only to add fuel to the fire. Just where the fire first start ed no one has been able to say, but the early comers are of the opinion that it started from the flue in the rear of the Blount building that was occupied by the barber shop. At any rate the fire started in the any rate the fire started in the middle of the block and burned east to Fredonia stre
West to Pecan street.

The only thing that saved the town from total destruction, was the fact that the wind was not blowing hard. Had the wind been blowing total loss to properiy would have run up into the millions Had the wind been blowing
from the south the fire would have wiped out the principal

Had the wind been blowing rom the west, the entire ibusiness portion of Nacogdoches would have been in ruins today.
