## Interstate 20 Due Frontage Roads Virtually Across Entire County

Interstate Highway 20 through Eastland County will have frontage roads clear across the county, with but a few isolated exceptions, a Texas Highway Department spokesman said this week.

Major addition to the proposed highway's access roads is the addition of frontages along the stretch from Cisco to Eastland. Originally only a part of this area had been scheduled for a frontage road to a land-locked oil production between the two towns.

However, in revised plans and preliminary drawings to be presented in a public hearing in Eastland, Friday, Dec. 10, at 10 a.m., frontage roads are now a part of the plans, it is reported. The additional accesses are the result of requests made by Eastland citizens before the Texas Highway Commission in July.

The Eastland by-pass hearing on the 10th, and another with Ranger revisions, date to be set, are the only remaining hearings to be conducted in the county. The Ranger revisions will reflect requests by citizens before the commission, it is said.

Most recent hearing was at Olden, Nov. 10, at the Olden High School Auditorium, at which Tommy Magness presided and conducted the hearing to inform interested citizens of that portion of proposed Int. 20 that lies one mile east of the city limits of Eastland to .8 of a mile south-

west of the city limits of Ranger.

The proposed highway will follow the present route of Highway 80. The proposed geometrics and design were explained. One interchange is proposed at the present west entrance to Olden on the county road adjacent to the Texas Electric spur line, and a grade separation is proposed at the Eastern edge of Olden.

(Grade separations do not provide exit or entrance to the main lines of traffic, but only to the access roads.)

Approximately 40 persons attended the Olden hearing and a request was made by School Supt. Travis Hilliard that the eastern grade separation be made a "split-dia-

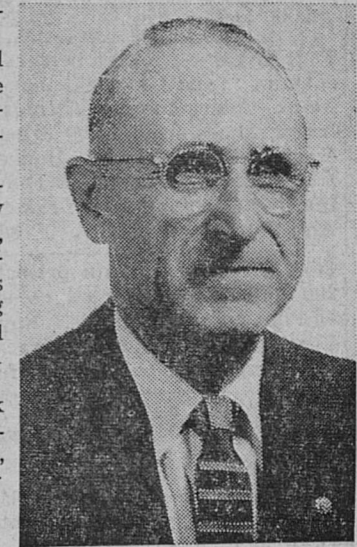

## Temps Drop, Moisture Is Light As Harvest Nears End

Perfect peanut-harvesting weather continued through the week after temperatures tumbled, with dry, sun-shiny days continuing.

Rains, heavy in September, remained light through November, providing the dry harvest weather necessary. Total rainfall for the year through the last day of November, Tuesday, is 26.22 — just a fraction below the Texas Almanac 26.54 average for 12 months.

Total this year is above the first 11 months last year which amounted to 19.63 inches. The mercury really took a tumble as the month neared its end. On the 26th, Friday after Thanksgiving, high reading was 85 degrees, according to official County Weather Observer James Smith. It dropped to 31 the next night, then on down to 28 on the 28th; 25 on the 29th; and 25 on the 30th.

Rain during November amounted to 1.79 inches and fell on four days — 25 of an inch on the third; 38 on the fourth; 30 on the eighth; and .86 on the ninth.

First freezing temperature in November last year was 29, registered on the 20th, and the month closed out last year with a 24 low on the 30th day.

Two years ago, in 1963, first freeze in November came on the second day with a low of 28 recorded. Neither 1963's nor 1964's November had highs as great as this year's 85.

The ASCS office reported late last week the peanut harvest 60 per cent complete, and estimates are that that last 40 per cent will move fast this week and next—if the weather stays dry, and the long-range forecast indicates that it will.

## Medicare Plan Will Be Explained For Elderly in Special Meetings

The Eastland County Committee studying problems of the aging, and visitors heard H. L. Weatherly of Abilene explain provisions of Medicare at a meeting in Eastland Tuesday evening and voted to set up special meetings throughout the county to carry the same message to elderly people.

A tentative schedule was arranged and either Mr. Weatherly or another representa-

tive of the Social Security will be at each meeting to explain the incoming program and answer questions.

Most important data at this time, he said, is that persons who are 65 years of age, and who have not made application for social security, must do so for the Medicare benefits whether they ever plan to draw

cards, should mark their intentions as to whether they plan to participate in the supplementary medical provisions or not. Those already on the roles automatically are enrolled in the hospitalization part but must consent, and agree to pay \$3 monthly, for the supplementary service he explain ed.

working with the Company May 25, 1921, at Petrolia. June 6, 1923, he was promoted to chemist at Brazos. September 1, 1929, he was transferred to Cheaney as superintendent. January 1, 1930, he was transferred to Pueblo, and January 1, 1931, to Breckenridge. He became assistant district superintendent at Ranger November 11, 1943.

He was promoted to district superintendent at Ranger December 1, 1945, and to field superintendent, Gasoline Department, October 1, 1956.

One of his most memorable experiences in 43 years with the Company was the January 1963 Opelika plant fire. "I had been in bed with the flu, but was at Gordon all Sunday, and part of the night. When I got home, I was called about the Opelika fire.

"I headed out for Opelika, knowing that gas from the area would be badly needed during the bitter-cold weather."

Continuing, he recalled getting two hours' sleep in Corsicana, and pushing on to Opelika.

"It was about 6:00 when I got there, and I knew the men would be worn out from fighting the fire all night."

"During the night, Dispatching was waiting for news about the line. They had to know by morning and the peak load whether the line would hold need pressure.

Shortly after daylight, "Johnny" was on the "phone, and reported that Line "D" could take the load.

"As he later commented, "With excellent cooperation from all departments, we were able to keep the gas in the line without a single curtailment during three cold spells.

After the excitement is over, and he has retired, his plans for retirement activities are incomplete.

"I've got a lot of things in mind," he said, "but I'll have to wait and see what develops."

For one thing, he and his wife, the former Juanita Ray, whom he married July 14, 1923, plan to do some traveling to see their daughter, Mrs. J. W. Brock, Midland, Texas, and their two grand-children.

He also plans to start playing more golf than he has been playing.

Active in community affairs, "Johnny" has been president of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, president of the Ranger and Eastland School Boards, and president of the Lions Club in both Eastland and Ranger.

He is a member of the Methodist Church, Lions Club, Masonic Lodge, and is a professional engineer.

Proud of his company, its employees, leaders and retirement plan, he said: "One of the things I enjoyed most, was seeing the men I helped train as a supervisor coming up through the Company ranks."

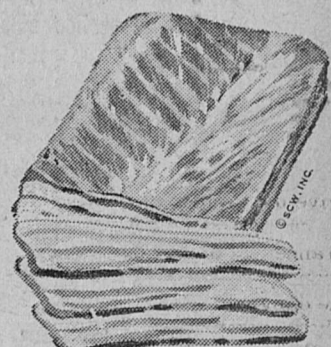

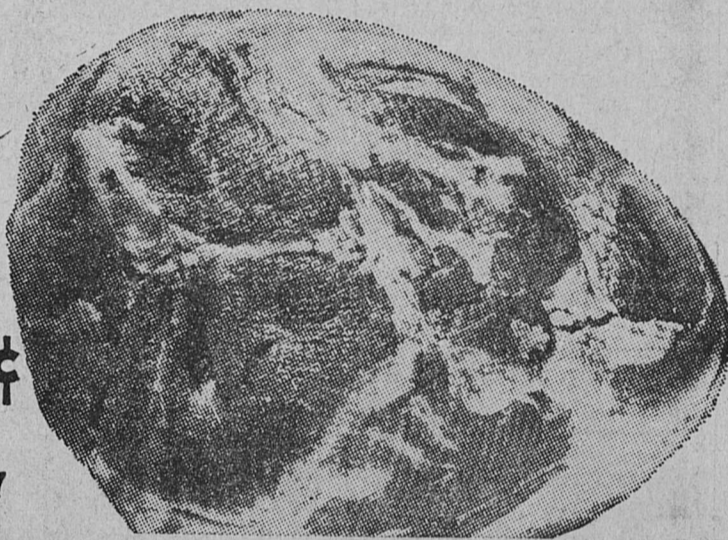
