Excellent Science And Mathematics Teachers Nominations Being Sought

Excellent kindergarten through twelfth grade science and mathematics teachers may be nominated from now through February 14, 1991, to be considered for a Presidential Award for Excellence in Science and Mathematics Teaching.

The White House, in a program administered by the National Science Foundation, will recognize two elementary and two secondary science and mathematics teachers in each state this year. The teachers are judged on their knowledge of science or mathematics and their abilities in communicating these subjects to their students.

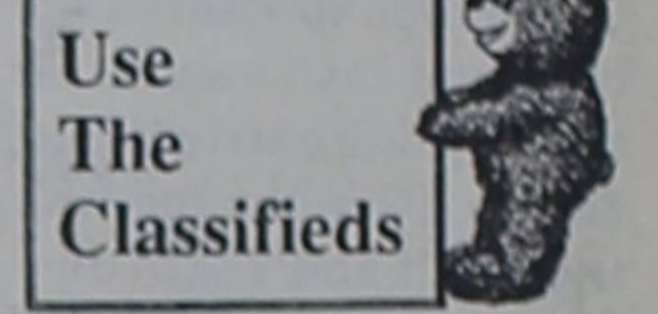
The Presidential Award

includes an expense-paid trip for the teacher and a guest to Washington, D.C., local and national recognition, a \$7,500 grant for the teacher's school, and many other gifts and leadership opportunities.

To be eligible, a teacher must have worked five years or more in a public or private school teaching science or mathematics at least half time.

Nominations can be made by a colleague, administrator, parent, student, by self nomination, or by anyone famil-

iar with a teacher's abilities and performance. Applications from teachers in urban areas and from historically under-represented groups, as well as middle/junior high school teachers, are especially encouraged. ## Extension Home Economics

The holidays season without poinsettias would be like Thanksgiving without turkey.

Poinsettias are the nation's largest selling potted plant. The plants grew wild in Mexico and Central America for centuries before the first U.S. Ambassador to Mexico made his name synonymous with the holiday spirit by bringing the flowers north of the border. When Joel Robert Poinsett returned to North Carolina after his Mexico tour of duty in 1825, he shipped home more than a dozen of the festive plants. As an amateur botanist, he successfully transplanted the colorful bushes to his greenhouse, and they became known as poinsettias in his honor.

Here are some tips from the experts about selecting and maintaining poinsettias.

**SELECTING:** Check the leaves at the base of the plant. They should be green, without a tinge of

yellow. The tiny flowers in the center of the bracts should be closed or just beginning to open.

Examine the soil around the plant. If it's dry and shrinking from the sides of the pot or if it's drenched, leaving the pot standing in water, the plant probably has suffered shock. Improper watering will cause the leaves to wither and fall quickly.

**MAINTAINING:** Poinsettias need light. Full daylight, but not direct sun, is best. Temperatures in the room shouldn't exceed 72 degrees during the day or 60 degrees at night. The plants do best in the cooler temperature with high humidity.

Never place a poinsettia on top of a television set or in a spot where the plant is exposed to drafts from heating ducts or exterior doorways.

Check the soil daily and water thoroughly when it feels dry to the touch.

Drain off excess moisture after watering. Poinsettias don't like wet feet.

You can nurture a poinsettia plant from season to season, and a holiday calendar for carrying out the project.

**New Year's Day:** Continue light water and fertilizer.

**Valentine's Day:** If the plant has gotten long and leggy, prune it five to eight inches above the soil.

**St. Patrick's Day:** Remove faded and dried stems and bracts; add more soil, preferably a commercially available sterile mix.

**Memorial Day:** Trim off two or three inches on each branch to promote side branching. Repot and move plant outside, first to indirect, then direct light.

**Fourth of July:** Trim again. Make sure plant has full sunlight. Slightly increase amount of fertilizer, and root cuttings in floral foam.

**Labor Day:** Move plant indoors, but make sure it has six hours of direct light. Reduce fertilizer.

**Autumn Equinox:** On or near September 21, give plant 13 hours of uninterrupted darkness and 11 hours of bright light daily. Night temperature should

be in the low 60s. Continue to water and fertilize. Rotate plants in light for balanced color.

**Thanksgiving:** Discontinue day/night treatment. Put plant in sunny spot and reduce water and fertilizer.

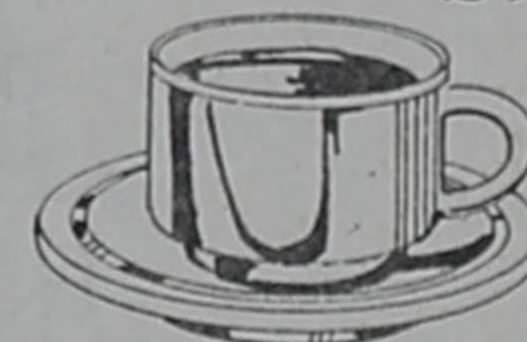

## Use Care In Decorating For Safe Holiday Season

Decorating is half the fun of the holidays. But those festive items that brighten your home and office can darken your holiday cheer if they aren't handled safely.

If you're using a fresh-cut Christmas tree, Texas Safety Association reminds you to keep it fresh by adding water every day. Over 600 fires are started by Christmas trees each year. Keep your tree away from fireplaces and space heaters and use electric lights, not candles. Use care in picking the tree, too. If the tips of the branches won't bend without breaking, the tree is already too dry.

Artificial trees should be labeled flame-retardant. Never put electric lights on a metal tree.

Inspect strands of lights for fraying, bare wires, loose connections, and broken sockets. Make sure that they carry the Underwriters Laboratories (UL) symbol, and that outdoor lights are labeled for outdoor use. Unplug lights when you leave the house or go to bed.

Tinsel, garlands, and evergreen wreaths shouldn't be hung too close to heat sources. Be especially careful with candles. Keep them out of a child's reach, and always extinguish them when leaving the room.

Holly berries and mis-

tletoe are poisonous. Poinsettias are not, but eating the leaves can lead to an upset stomach. Man-made decorations are for fun, not food. Avoid hanging breakable ornaments near the bottom of the tree, where children and pets can reach them.

If you use a fireplace for holiday warmth, keep a screen in front of it to keep flying sparks off carpets and furniture. And don't burn gift wrappings — they may contain dyes that will give off toxic fumes. Put the wraps in the trash can instead, or recycle them next year!

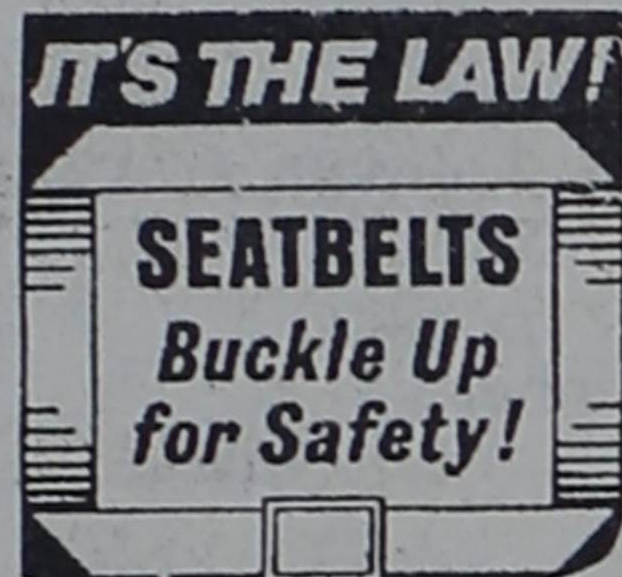

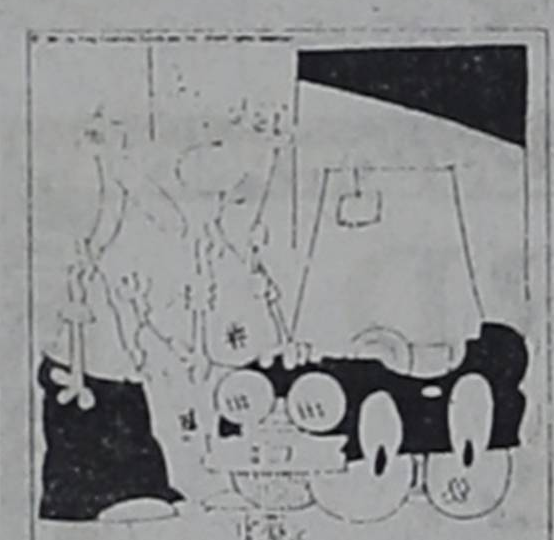

### Decorate With Care For Safe Holiday Season

Decorating is half the fun of the holidays. But those festive items that brighten your home and office can darken your holiday cheer if they aren't handled safely.

If you're using a fresh-cut Christmas tree, Texas Safety Association reminds you to keep it fresh by adding water every day. Over 600 fires are started by Christmas trees each year. Keep your tree away from fireplaces and space heaters and use electric lights, not candles. Use care in picking the tree, too. If the tips of the branches won't bend without breaking, the tree is already too dry.

Artificial trees should be labeled flame-retardant. Never put electric lights on a metal tree.

Inspect strands of lights for fraying, bare wires, loose connections, and broken sockets. Make sure that they carry the Underwriters Laboratories (UL) symbol, and that outdoor lights are labeled for outdoor use. Unplug lights when you leave the house or go to bed.

Tinsel, garlands, and evergreen wreaths shouldn't be hung too close to heat sources. Be especially careful with candles. Keep them out of a child's reach, and always extinguish them when leaving the room.

Holly berries and mistletoe are poisonous. Poinsettias are not, but eating the leaves can lead to an upset stomach. Man-made decorations may contain toxic materials, too. Teach children that decorations are for fun, not food. Avoid hanging breakable ornaments near the bottom of the tree, where children and pets can reach them.

If you use a fireplace for holiday warmth, keep a screen in front of it to keep flying sparks off carpets and furniture. And don't burn gift wrappings — they may contain dyes that will give off toxic fumes. Put the wraps in the trash can instead, or recycle them next year!

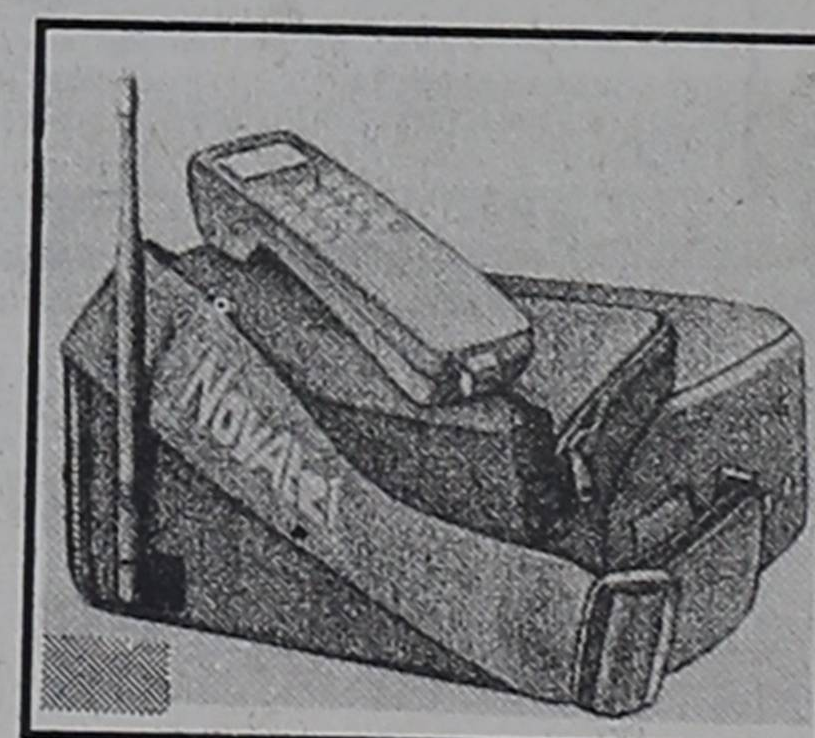

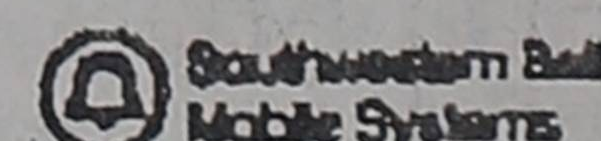

## Guest Slot

GIVEN A choice, which spot would we re-visit? Which was top choice?

In a minute -- **ROTHENBURG** On The Tauber, Jewel of the Middle Ages: an absolute fairy-tale town; walled; compact; unbelievably unique. A real "let's come back here" place: "Disney-land for grown people."

West of Nuremberg, it's a short afternoon's drive, and we chose the rural, backroad route rather than the autobahn, so saw much more of Germany's farmland and tiny villages. We were using Frommer's, Fodor's and Amy's Officers Wives' "Never a Dull Minute" guides so were able to find the picks of the litter, and in Rothenburg, we found the absolute ultimate little guesthouse, just off the main square, on a little side street, and near the city wall. From our upper room the view across the little valley beyond the wall was fantastic. We walked the little streets on a cold and drippy night, and found a snug, cellar cafe with inviting dining room and warm, filling food. They knew we were tourists, but they treated us like regulars who lived down the street.

The little town was virtually wiped out by the Thirty Year's War, and slumbered for years until modern tourism resurrected it. Today, the

guide book says, "it's milking its best-preserved-medieval-town-in-Europe image for all its worth." There's really no other place like it, and the locals admit that the population (12,500) is dedicated to serving visitors: 19 hotels, 35 inns, 90 restaurants, taverns and cafes AND a few hundred, unique shops offering as much and more than all tourists would want -- but it's not brash. It's fun, and we relish the memories.

History abounds: The Thirty Years War 1618-48 (relate that to the settlement of Jamestown in 1620?); the town is besieged and taken by Tilly, and according to Legend, City Councilman Nusch's so-called Master Drink saved the city from wholesale destruction. The invaders challenged any to empty the tankard (six pints of brew); he did and saved the town, says the tale, and the city re-enacts and thrives on the legend.

The railroad came in 1905 and in 1945, the city was partially destroyed by bombs. An American general hinders its total destruction,

and the town is rebuilt in the old style, with the support of friends and well-wishers from all parts of the world. One of the city's churches, St. Wolfgang, is actually joined to the city walls, and was a part of the original fortification.

St. Jakob's (James) is the city's imposing church; it is beautiful and artwork abounds. It houses the Holy Blood Altar, a beautiful, gigantic carving in limewood, which was commissioned to house in a gold cross repository for a relic: "According to legend, it is said that 3 drops of Christ's blood is contained within a capsule of rock crystal in the gold cross." The carving of the Twelve, in which Christ confronts Judas, saying "One of you shall betray me," is ultra-fine detailing, even to latticed windows in the background. It is a beautiful piece of art. Stained glass abounds.

Fine, heavy wood furniture, including an unbelievably detailed and heavy stand-alone wardrobes made our little double and single rooms really inviting. Power is 220 and you use your converter for electric razors, curling irons and hair dryers. Heat is from radiators, and lighting is on the dim side (40watts in little glass shades). The down pillows

kinda let you down to nothing, but oh, those down comforters are s-o-o-o snugly. We rose to a little quartz alarm clock, whose battery took care of us, up until the last day when it let us down, but more of that later.

After a genteel breakfast with what must have been home-made strawberry-light preserves, we took a horse-drawn carriage ride of the city and hit the shops again, including their trademark blue ironstone pottery factory before reluctantly saying Goodbye to Rothenburg, and heading to Wurtzburg to the north.--(Next: Train to Rome)

The Morton Valley Extension Homemakers helped the Eastland Manor Nursing Home decorate for Christmas December 9, 1991.

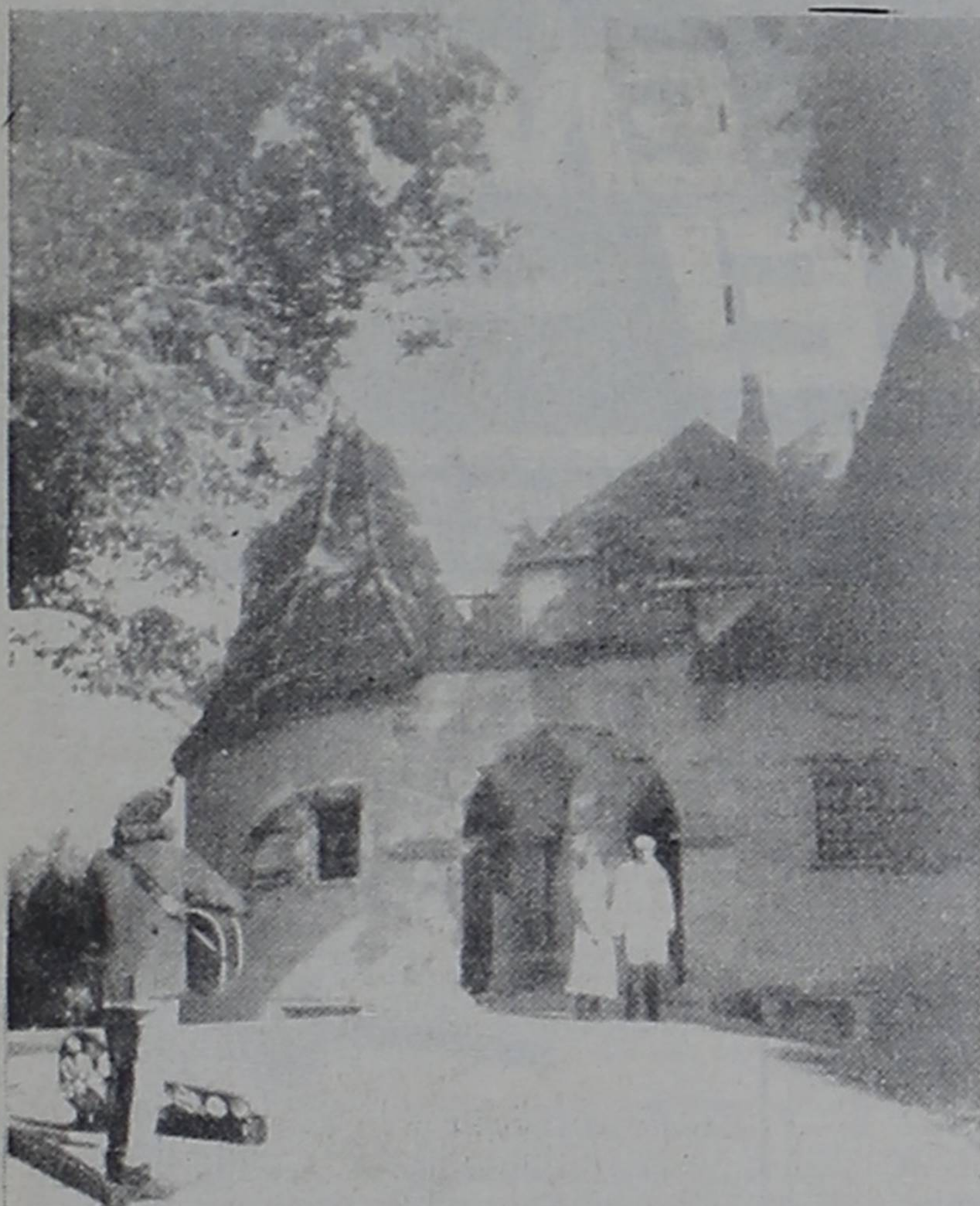
Decorations were put on each patients door and a tree was decorated in the dining room. When finished the whole building looked very beautiful.

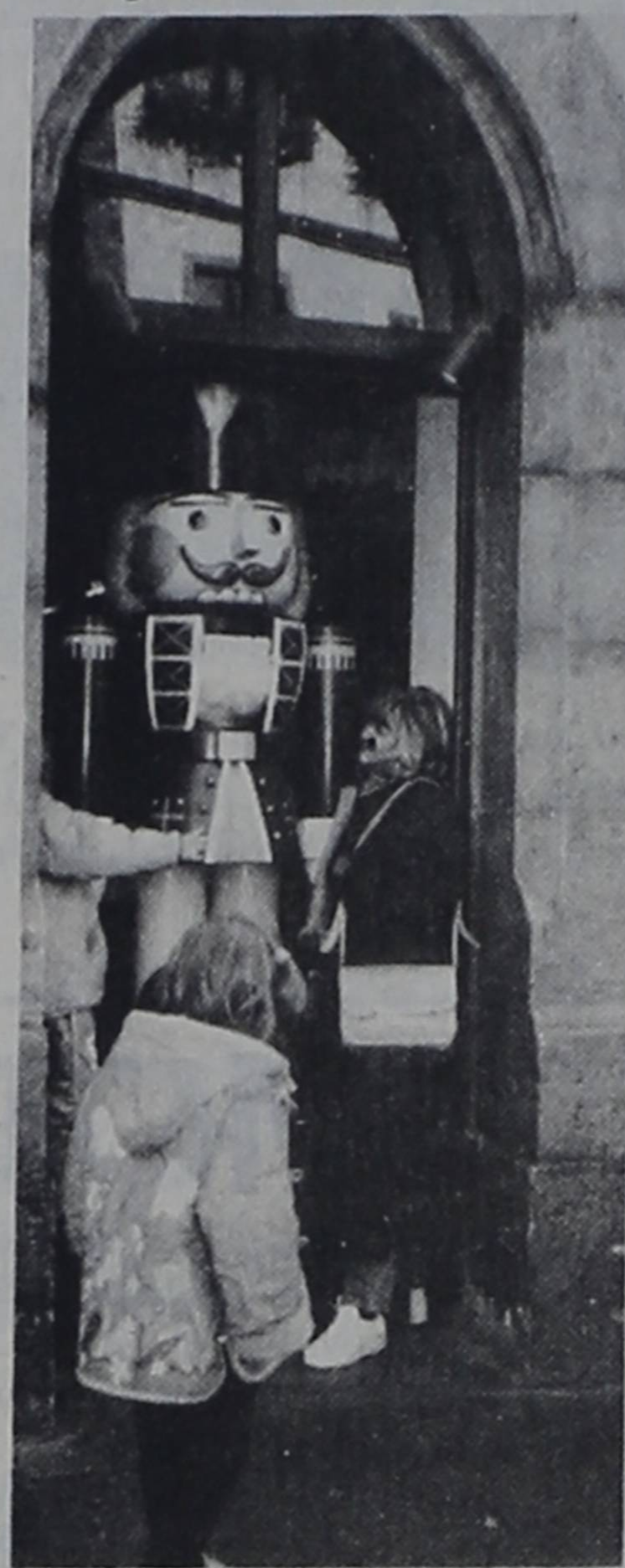


