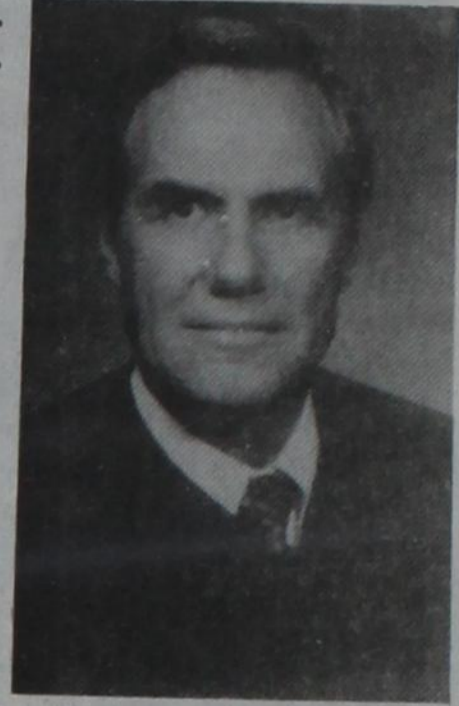

## April 15 Is Annual Cisco Cleanup Day

At their meeting on Tuesday, February 28th, the City Council designated Saturday, April 15th as Spring Clean-up Day for the City of Cisco. All during this day the City's solid waste contractor, BFI, Inc., will be making special trash runs throughout the city collecting these special deposits of trash set out by city residents.

BFI requests that everyone who has the extra "clean-up day" trash and brush to have it piled by the curb absolutely no later than Saturday morning April 15th. BFI will be running extra trucks that day to pick up the extra trash and garbage. However, BFI reminds everyone that because of federal landfill and sanitation regulations, BFI cannot pick up tires, batteries, appliances with freon (refrigerators, air conditioners) paint cans or anything else that is labeled hazardous or

toxic. BFI will also be able to pick up items that cannot be lifted normally by two men. BFI will, of course, run their regular garbage routes.

Along with BFI's trucks, the City will be running special trucks picking up brush piles and limbs. As with the trash, all limbs and brush should be piled at the curb for pick up no later than Saturday April 15th.

"The City Council wanted to take this opportunity to thank all of Cisco's citizens in advance for their participation and cooperation in this special clean-up effort," said City Manager Michael Moore.

Moore went on to remind the residents of Cisco that the "growing season" is fast coming upon us and because we have been blessed with a very mild winter, everyone will need to be especially mindful to keep their yards mowed and their property maintained this spring and summer. Moore stated, "When it comes to caring for our

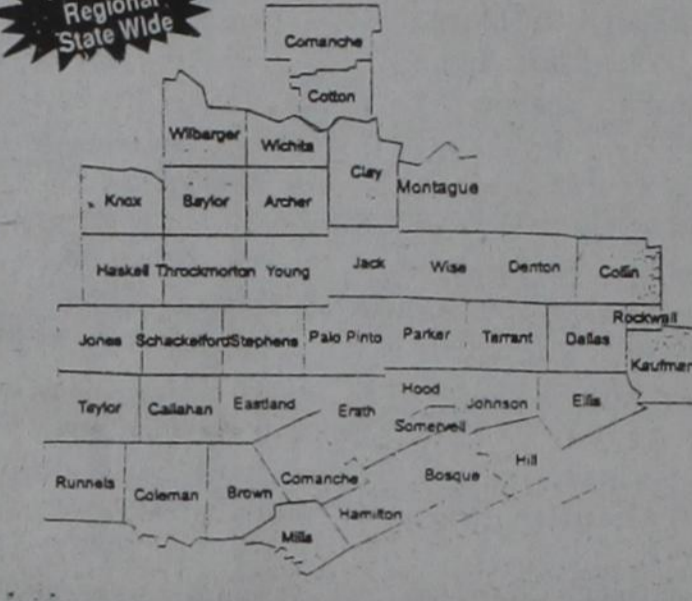

## From Page One County 'E' Zone, Abatement Decisions

Pct. 3 Comm. L. T. Owen presided over Monday's meeting, due to the absence of County Judge Scott Bailey. (The Judge was in Dallas as a delegate to a Regional Conference on Senior Citizens.)

Moylan told the court that an Enterprise Zone and tax abatement are needed to attract industry to the County. He said the adjoining counties of Callahan and Shackelford were competing with us for industry, and had already offered incentives to a local firm which is planning a 10-million dollar expansion. That expansion could add about 40 jobs to the local economy, he said.

Moylan said he will carry a proposal from the County to the firm within a few days, if this area is to be considered.

He suggested two different plans, with one including a tax abatement of 50-percent for 10 years - and this would amount to approx. \$99,000.

But during the same time, the firm would expand so much that the County would eventually collect an additional \$318,000 in taxes from them.

"If we don't act," Moylan declared, "we will lose this tax base and the Tax Board will 'punish' every survivor in the County." (To make up for lost revenue.)

Pct. 1 Comm. Ken Lyerla said: "It's (the proposal) is talking about the expansion of EBAA Iron, isn't it?"

The Commissioner said that his response from the public had not been favorable on tax abatement for an industry.

Moylan asked: "What other kind of industry pays this kind of taxes - \$38,000 per year on \$10-million improvements?"

Pct. 2 Comm. Calvin

Ainsworth asked what an E-Zone and tax abatement would do for other businesses as well.

Moylan said there would be the same benefits to any business "willing to make a commitment to Eastland County of this magnitude."

"I don't think there's anything wrong with it (the proposal)," Ainsworth commented.

After other discussion, the Commissioners decided to study the matter further and decide on it Friday.

In another matter, Gayland Miller of the Steven Company asked to see a copy of a contract with the Xerox Corp. for a new copier for the probation department.

Miller said a 48-month contract with the Steven Co. was canceled without notification, and the Minolta copier they were furnishing to the Probation Department was replaced by the Xerox. County Auditor Ken Parker purchased the Xerox.

Miller stated: "I'm concerned about the biased opinion - about replacing the copier without our being called."

Ken Parker replied that Probation officer Randall Logan had contacted the Steven Co. sales representative on two occasions, and the service representative had an opportunity at least one each month to hear complaints.

He said the Commissioners had asked him to save money where he could, and the "Good 'ol boy" way of doing business was no longer in operation.

He stated that the Xerox copier would save the county about 9 percent over three years, and turn out quality work.

Miller replied that Parker was not taking care of business in a professional manner,

and had not asked for quotes before buying the Xerox copier.

"You contacted companies by mental telepathy," Miller said.

Parker stated he had received telephone quotes before buying the Xerox copier.

County Treasurer Ruth Hart brought an agenda item from Bill Miears, District Clerk. Miears was at Texas A&M University Monday, so unable to be present.

Miears requested authority to apply for a Bulk Rate Mail for Courthouse mailings, stating that this would save quite a bit of money.

The Commissioners asked Ruth Hart to contact Eastland Postmaster Venita Roach with a number of questions on Bulk Mail.

When Hart returned with more information, it appeared that Bulk Mail would not be a good system for Courthouse offices to use. There would be lack of forwarding, and could be delivery delays. All mail addressed to places outside of Eastland would have to go to Fort Worth

before being delivered.

Conrad Buchanan of Jedco Designs was in the Courtroom, as well as Richard Robinson, Head of the County Dispatch. Robinson also assists Buchanan on matters involved with the 9-1-1 system in the County.

Buchanan gave the County Commissioners copies of a large book containing 9-1-1 addresses, saying that the system had come a long way in this County. But he said about 900 County residents still had no 9-1-1 address.

In discussing ways to locate these individuals, Buchanan said he would prepare an advertisement for the County newspapers urging people to respond to a set of questions and send them in. The Commissioners will study this advertisement before approving it.

In the afternoon the Commissioners and news media toured the County jail, observing progress made on compliance with Jail Standards requirements. The ventilating fans appeared to be working well, and other matters were being taken care of.

Most of the compliance problems - as usual - were due to overcrowding. On Monday there were forty prisoners in the jail, including two women.

After returning to the Courtroom the Commissioners discussed ways to get inmates through the Court system faster.

On Wednesday the Commissioners, Sheriff Ronnie White and Architect James

The movie is directed by Steven Brill from a screenplay written by Judd Apatow and Steven Brill. As a youngster, Brill actually attended a camp in the same North Carolina vicinity where "Heavyweights" was filmed, and knew how it felt to be considered an outcast among the hip, athletic "elite."

"I went to Camp Greenville, about an hour away from here," muses Brill. "Coming up to these Blue Ridge mountains was one of my formative experiences, but it was an athletic camp and I really didn't have a good time. I was a Jewish kid from Miami, and my parents sent me to a YMCA Camp in South Carolina. I never figured out why they did that."

"The movie is about underdogs - kids who, because they don't act or look the same as everybody else, are treated like they aren't cool," Apatow explains.

"At the same time, with the Tony Perks character, we are mak-

ing fun of the whole health craze movement - also people who become excessive with self-help programs so they can be accepted by everyone."

Most people will find this Disney picture entertaining and fun. It has a scenic setting, some original music, and of course the mischievous kids, who decide to run their own weight-loss program.

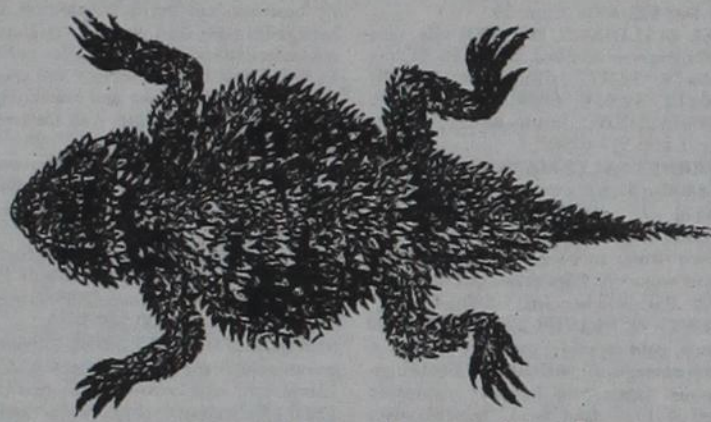

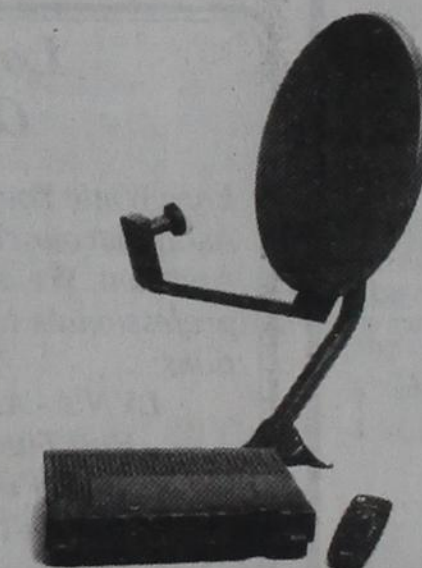

# Tax Filing Season Has Busy Start

Ten weeks into the tax filing season, the Internal Revenue Service has received over 46 million returns, about the same as this time last year, filled 3 million orders for forms or publications, and provided telephone or walk-in assistance to more than 34 million taxpayers, an increase of 14 million over last year at this point. Tele-Tax, a phone service offering automated tax and refund information, accounted for about 12.5 million of the 14 million increase.

As part of its ongoing effort to ensure that only taxpayers entitled to refunds receive them, the IRS is checking names and Social Security numbers (SSNs) for taxpayers and their dependents. The IRS rejects an electronic return with missing or mismatched numbers, so the return never enters the system unless corrected. On a paper return, an SSN problem delays any refund while the IRS contacts the taxpayer.

With an electronic return, the taxpayer has the

advantage of learning about a problem within a day or two and the ability to correct the error immediately. With a paper return, the taxpayer may not be aware of any problem until a notice from the IRS arrives weeks later.

Electronic filing continues to offer such benefits as greater accuracy, upfront verification and acknowledgement of receipt, and a shorter processing time than paper returns.

Over 1,000 sites operating under the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) or Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) program offer free electronic filing, generally for low-income taxpayers.

The IRS is also reviewing all returns to ensure that refunds go only to those taxpayers entitled to receive them. While this review stops erroneous refunds from going out, the process may delay all or part of the refund for some qualifying taxpayers. About 4 million of the 32 million returns processed so far will have some delay.

The IRS will send notices explaining the delay to those affected. Although the IRS may ask for additional information to support some refund claims, most taxpayers will not have to do anything for the IRS to complete its reviews.

Taxpayers who face a significant hardship because of a refund delay may contact the IRS Problem Resolution Office by calling 1-800-829-1040. Significant hardships include imminent loss of housing or utilities and inability to obtain food, essential medical treatment or transportation to work. IRS representatives will consider the circumstances in each case and verify the hardship. When appropriate, the IRS will try to expedite issuance of the refund.

Taxpayers concerned about possible refund delays in the future can act now to put more money in their pockets throughout the year. A person getting last year's average refund of \$1,066 could have had another \$20.50 a week throughout the year instead.

## CJC To Offer Painting Class

Registration deadline is April 7 and is limited to 10 students.

Students will learn to use the basic tools of painting - brushes, canvas, and the use of color. Students may work at their own speed on subjects that interest them most.

Workers can reduce the amount withheld from their paychecks to more closely match their actual tax. They should use Form W-4 to figure their correct number of withholding allowances and give the form to their employers. The free Publication 919, "Is My Withholding Correct for 1995?" is also available from the IRS.

Taxpayers who have a child and will have less than \$24,396 of income in 1995 may apply for advance payments of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). Employers will add these payments - up to \$105 a month - to qualifying workers' paychecks. The advance payments equal 60 percent of the taxpayer's total EITC. The rest is added to the refund when the taxpayer files the tax return for the year. Form W-5 has the details on eligibility for advance EITC payments as well as the certificate that must be filed with the employer.

Instead he made it a personal selection of texts, some taken from the Requiem Mass and others derived from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer.

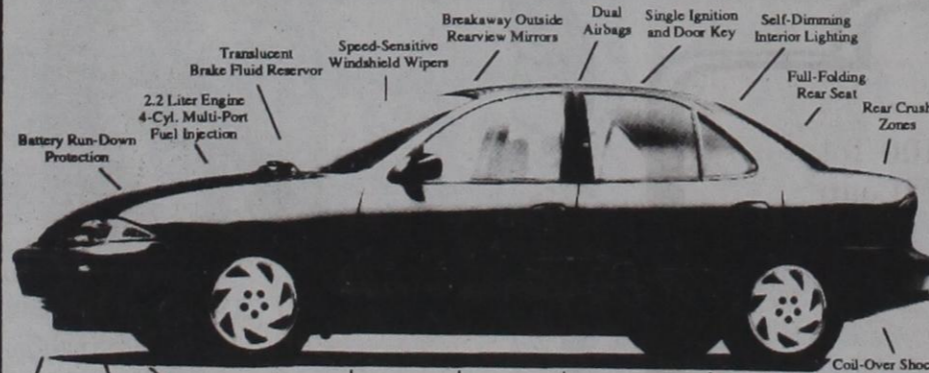

## Granny's Beverly Hillbillies Cookbook Is Full Of Great Country Cooking

America still loves "The Beverly Hillbillies," the sitcom that first hit television airwaves back in 1962. Jed, Granny, Jethro and Elly May traveled from the hills of the Ozarks straight into the living rooms of television viewers everywhere. Their antics made the show one of TV's highest-rated in the 60's, and even thirty years after the show's premiere, it continues to be shown in reruns daily. The Hillbillies even made the big screen with a major motion picture in 1993. Apparently, America just can't get enough of the Clampetts and their special brand of hillbilly humor.

Granny's Beverly Hillbillies Cookbook by Jim Clark and Ken Beck (Rutledge Hill Press \$12.95 combound paperback) shows the Clampetts' culinary side. Even though they became overnight millionaires with the discovery of "black gold", Texas Tea" on their property back in the Ozarks, the Clampetts still loved down-home country cookin'.

Inspired by the unusual foods and cooking methods used on "The Beverly Hillbillies," co-authors and fans Jim Clark and Ken Beck have sought out traditional recipes from the Ozarks, from Tennessee (where Granny grew up), as well as favorite foods from cast members and guest stars such as Pat Boone and Lester Flatt and Earl Scruggs. Of course, Granny's Beverly Hillbillies Cookbook contains more Possum, Squirrel, and groundhog recipes than most.

Wild Boar Tounge, Possum Dip, and Mrs. Drysdale's Goat are just a few of Granny's favorites. But the bulk of the recipes are for tamer fare, such as Rodeo Drive Rolls, Bubblin' Crude (Sauce, that is), and Cee-ment Pond Punch. Among the recipes contributed from the cast are Buddy Ebsen's Clampett Tater Casserole, Max (Jethro) Baer's Million-Dollar Chili, and Donna (Elly May) Douglas' Palace Theater Pecan Pie. There are also quite a few recipes reprinted from Granny's Hillbilly Cookbook, published in 1966 and written by Irene Ryan, who portrayed Granny.

In the tradition of the bestselling Aunt Bee's Mayberry Cookbook, which Clark and Beck also co-authored, there are dozens of great photos, charter profiles, trivia, and dialogue from the show. There's even a foreword by Max Baer. As much fun to read as it is to cook

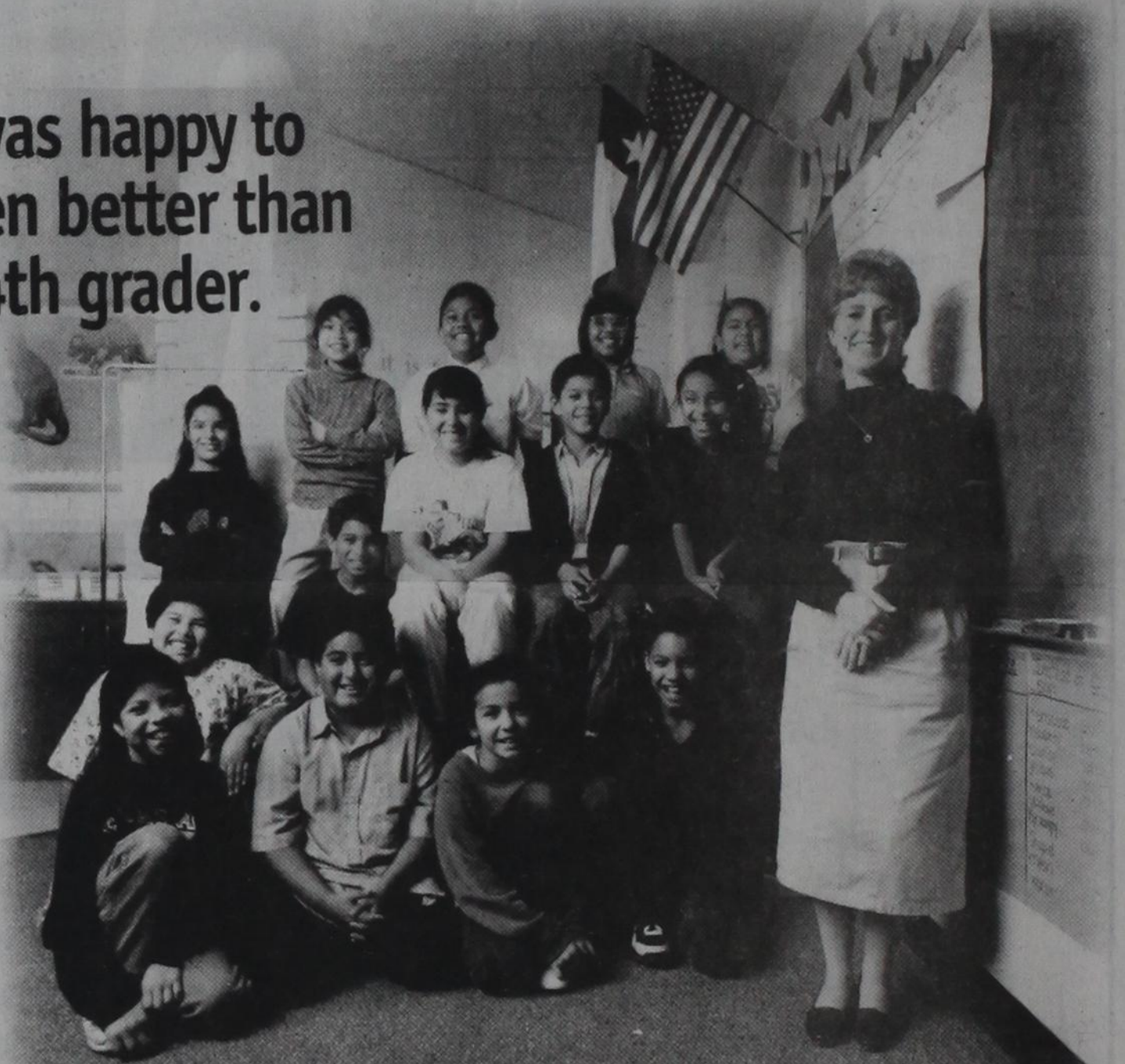

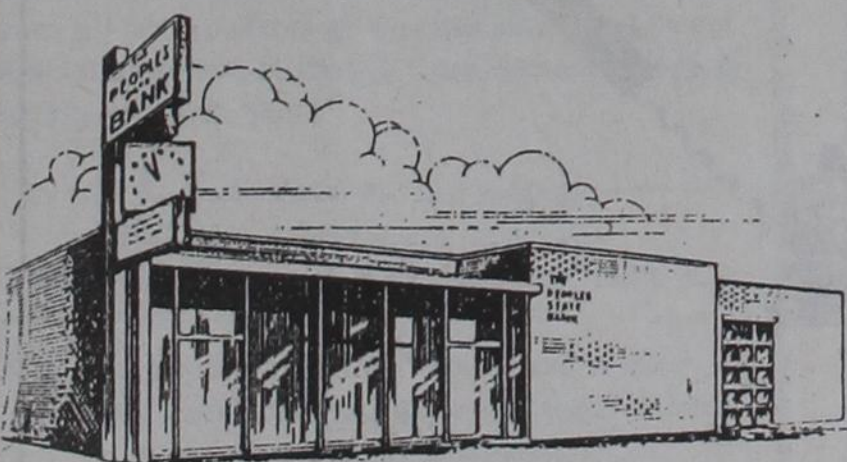
