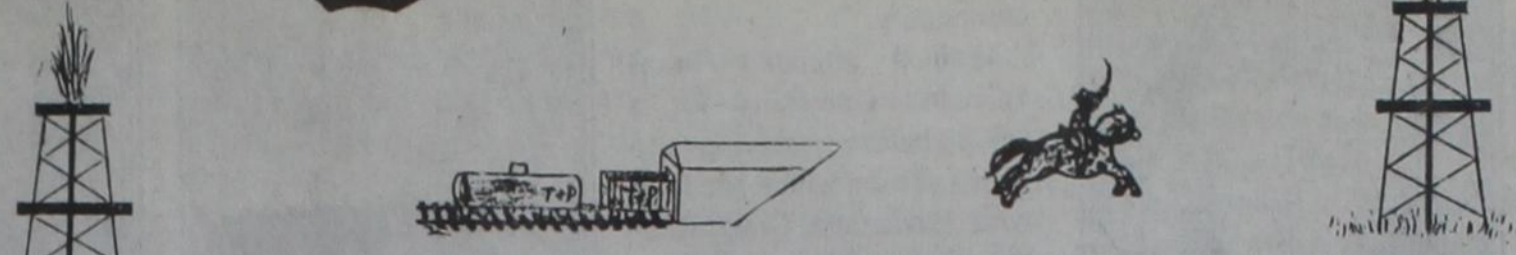

**"BIG FIGHT"** is predicted in Senate by Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock on the effort to Opt the state out of the federally-passed interstate banking system. The state House has okayed the opt-out; deadline is May 31. Main argument in favor of the federal system is a requirement that each branch lend at least 50% of its local deposits back to the community. The state currently has no such requirement.

Emergency services and disaster relief plans that are coordinated and work quickly when a crisis occurs. 7. Workplaces that are healthful and promote safety. 8. A steady supply of decent and rewarding jobs, with opportunities for increased personal skills, fulfillment or wages. 9. People who agree among themselves to obey and uphold the laws, combined with laws that are fair and criminal justice that is both prompt and fair. 10. A community strategy with positive public safety goals to make people stakeholders and give them something to work for, rather than against.

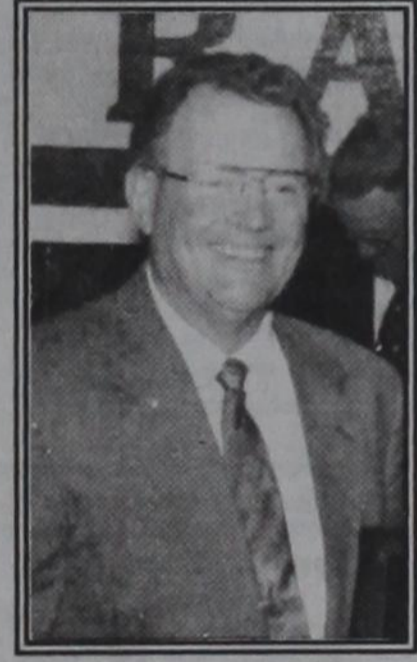

Since moving to Ranger he has been a member of the Ranger Rotary Club, serving as president three of the

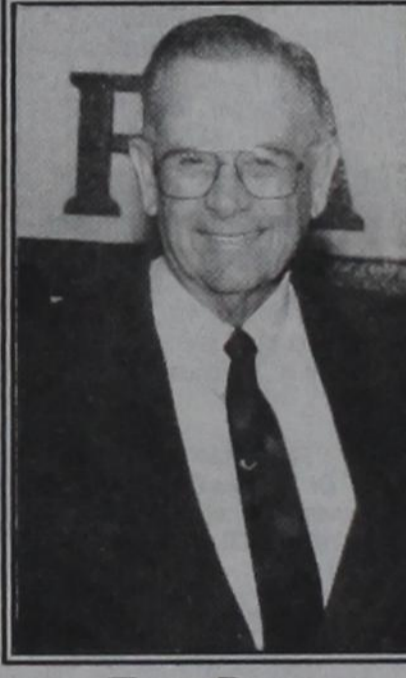

### To Boost Tourism Historic Place Designation To Get Deserved Recognition

This area in general, and Cisco in particular, is sitting on a potentially unlimited world-wide tourist magnet that's going unexploited.

A major portion of the City of Cisco has the rare distinction of being listed in the National Register of Historic Places with the United States Department of the Interior National Park Service.

At least half of the public and private buildings are eligible for plaque markings which blaze the trails for visitors.

There are almost 250 separate listings of properties, the capstone of which is the Mobley/Original Hilton Hotel, and so

much more. The Mobley was designated in 1981 and the Historic District in 1984.

The Historic District is made up of an irregular block from a great part of both sides of Conrad Hillton Ave., west from Third to Ninth Sts., as far in some instances as Ave. K. A goodly portion of Eighth St. is designated.

The rare designation was recently re-confirmed by staff members of the local newspapers continuing work in developing materials and projects to help the area attract visitors, and specifically to help infuse new enthusiasm for the forthcoming

### 'E' Zone Abatement Approved By Court

Eastland County Commissioners in a called meeting Friday passed a Resolution to adopt a policy on tax abatement for any new business coming into Eastland County, or expansion of any existing business in the County. Each business will be considered individually.

The vote on this Resolution was unanimous, with all Commissioners present and County Judge Scott Bailey presiding.

In a related matter, the Court also approved a Resolution concerning the manner of abatement on a proposed \$10-million dollar business expansion. This resolution calls for a 5-year graduated tax abatement, with 100 percent the first year, 80 percent the next, then 60 percent, 40 and 20 percent. After that the ex-

panded industry will go on the tax rolls at 100 percent.

Jim Moylan, Chairman of the Eastland Economic Board of Directors, brought the tax abatement proposal to the Court.

Joe Wheatley, Mayor of Cisco, spoke to the Court in favor of tax abatement for industry in the County.

In effect, the Commissioners' approval sets up an Enterprise Zone for the County.

Moylan said he would carry the Tax Abatement Resolution with a package proposal to the EBAA Iron Corp, which is planning a \$10-million dollar expansion in Eastland County or adjoining ones. Other counties have reportedly offered similar incentives to EBAA.

shares her important message across the United States to over 250,000 teens each year. The teenagers will also be involved in a workshop conducted by

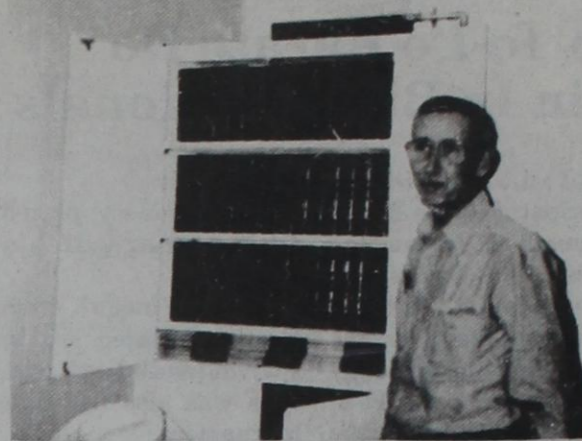

Their suffering may go unchecked for years, often permanently impairing their health and development and sometimes costing their lives. Such children may be too young, too terrified, or simply too confused to tell anyone.



If you suspect a child has been abused or neglected, the law requires that you report it to the Texas Department of Human Services and a law enforcement agency. Child abuse and neglect are against the law in Texas, and so is failure to report cases of child mistreatment. Persons making reports in good faith are protected by laws from liability, and their identities are kept confidential.

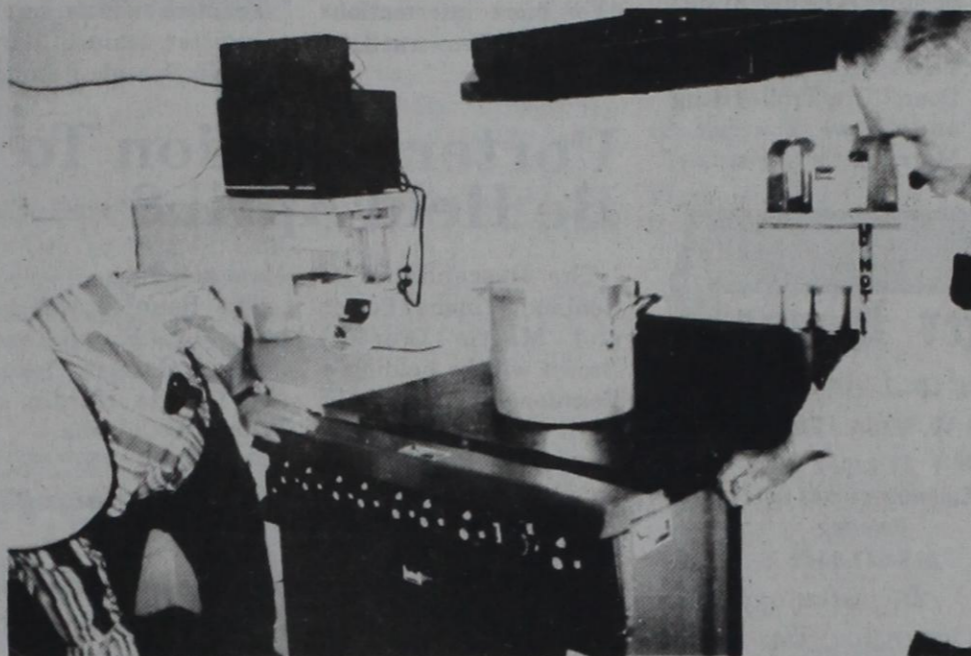

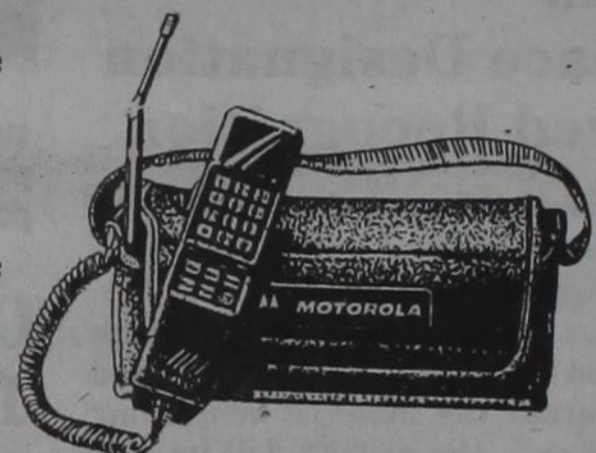

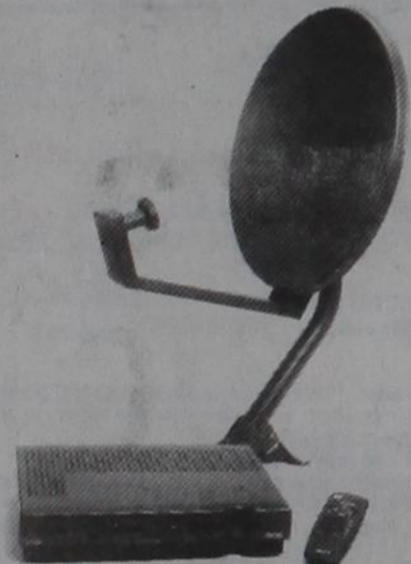

\$5.00 to persons over 21. The movie is rated PG.

Director/writer Steven Brill, who previously wrote the screenplay for "The Mighty Ducks," got the idea for "Heavyweights" from the "fat camp" ads in the back of the Sunday New York Times magazine.

As a youngster, he actually attended a camp in the same vicinity where "Heavyweights" was filmed, and knew how it felt to be an outcast among the hip, athletic "elite."

"Heavyweights" has a rebellious spirit to it,"

Brill says, "a real raucous quality, but not crass for the sake of being crass. It's not about losing or gaining weight. It's about societal misfits and how what you see isn't necessarily all there is."

When casting began, Brill and screenwriter, Judd Apatow including some acting talent familiar to them. Three of the eight actors hired to play the rebellious campers (Aaron Schwartz, Kenan Thompson and Shaun Weiss) previously portrayed Brill's characters in one or both of the "Mighty Ducks" films.

Although Brill envi-

sioned Camp Hope being in New York state, an off-season shooting schedule dictated they film in south climate. Location scouts found the ideal spot at Camp Pinnacle, a picturesque 150-acre summer camp that surrounds a 30-acre private lake nestled in the Blue Ridge mountains near Hendersonville, North Carolina.

Even though outdoor shots are always challenging, the reality of going to camp every day provided the cast with a spirit of adventure. On the set, Camp Hope truly became the place it was meant to be - a place for fun.

The audience will have some fun with this movie too.

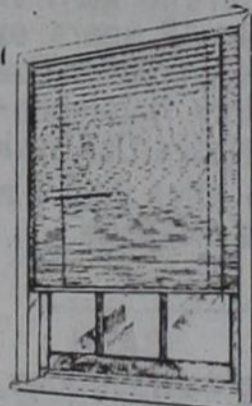

**PARENTING HINTS**

Here are some essential choking prevention tips. When children are eating, they should be sitting upright, not lying down or running around. Always supervise at snack and meal times, because a child who is choking cannot make noise to attract your attention. Foods that are hard or tough to chew, small and round or sticky are most often choked on. The most common food that children between the ages of 1 and 5 years old choke on is frankfurters! Other foods include: candy, nuts, grapes, popcorn, raisins, raw apples, corn, peas, chunks of meat, peanut butter served in chunks (unspread).

When serving children frankfurters, simply cut the wiener into fourths

lengthwise and then into pieces, cook and mash carrots, corn and peas; cut grapes into fourths; and serve peanut butter with jelly, not by the spoonful.
