

FRIDAY NIGHT, 8 to 11 p.m., will be a big night for the Ultra Club Scholarship Dance at the Tarleton Student Development Center Ballroom, featuring the Ultra Club **BIG BAND**, under the direction of one of our favorite musicians, Phil Hewett of Olden.

For those of us who thrive on the Big Band Sound, this is it. Since the formation of the band in 1985, its members have discovered the appeal of this music is timeless. They present swing and jazz with authenticity and respect for the style and class of the period. It's a group of volunteer musicians from many professions who are dedicated to the preservation and performance of the great American music of the golden age of jazz and swing. The band performs in support of activities of the Fine Arts and Speech Dept. at Tarleton State, Stephenville.

Retired Kansas State Band Director Hewett is known for drums.

Under Phil's leadership, the band provides the wild jazz improvisations and rich precision ensemble sounds that made the music of Glen Miller, Tommy Dorsey, Benny Goodman, Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Harry James and others popular with all generations in the 1930s, 40s and 50s. Only a truly big band can perform this music, so the instrumentation includes five trumpets, five trombones, five saxophones, piano, string bass, guitar, drums and a complement of vocalists. All volunteers, the musicians' actual professions include an optometrist, a funeral director, an insurance agent, a professional photographer, a speech professor, an art instructor, a minister, a journalist, an entrepreneur, several school band directors and music teachers and more. The men and women of The Big Band dress to the teeth in tux and formal to bring back the class and ritz of ballrooms of long ago.

New Life For An Old Building

When Eastland County was first settled many young couples moved here to establish homes. They dreamed of the future and worked hard.

If you think that spirit is dead, you need to stop by 112 N. Lamar in Eastland and watch Mike and Anne Zoellick restore a building which holds their future home and business - The Eastland Bed and Breakfast Hotel.

This vintage brick three story structure has been a part of Eastland history since its construction in 1918. Now it will have a brand new history -- that of a Bed and Breakfast place excluding a homey charm.

Known over the years as The Princess Theatre, The Stanley Hotel, The Maverick, the Johnson and the Rawson Building, the building was purchased in 1990 by the Eastland Fine Arts Association, whose members saw a potential in the location.

The hope was to turn the building into a community center and use it with the Majestic Theatre, which shares a common wall.

Some improvements were made, but the project went into kind of a holding pattern. Perhaps the old Hotel needed someone with the vision, and energy to resurrect it.

The Zoellicks feel

that their recent purchase of the building was more than just a coincidence.

"The Lord brought it all together," they say, blithely discounting the mountains of carpentry and interior decorating they are wading through.

Young as they are, the Zoellicks have many accomplishments and experiences to draw from. Mike grew up in Chicago, while Anne's home was in Upstate New York. After college each went into the Navy, where they were commissioned as officers and trained as tactical jet aviators.

They met and married while stationed at Key West, Florida, in a Squadron that deployed to all parts of the world. Their next assignment took them to Kingsville, Texas, where they trained Navy pilots for the Gulf War.

During their tour of duty in Kingsville, the Zoellicks became friends with Dr. and Mrs. Brian Clute. Later Brian and Becky Clute moved to Eastland, where the Doctor opened his own dental practice.

After the Gulf War, the Zoellicks decided to leave the military for a totally different lifestyle.

"We have high regard for the Navy," Mike Zoellick explains. "But we resigned because we de-

cidied our military careers made it hard to have a stable family life."

"I could be transferred anyplace, any time, and so could Mike," says Anne. "We didn't want to be separated that way."

The couple realized they wanted to run their own business, work together, and hopefully live where they worked.

Anne's parents, Tom and Linda Krueger, have an Inn in Chautauqua, New York. So the Zoellicks moved there and worked with them for about a year, learning every aspect of the business. After that they began searching for a place of their own -- preferably an old house they could restore. They wanted the special atmosphere of an old building.

"We started out with a jeep and our dog 'Windsock' traveling across country," Mike says.

In the fall of 1994, on their way west, they stopped in Eastland and visited with the Clutes. They also met Austin and Mary Anne McCloud and other local people.

"We were very impressed with Eastland," Mike says. "The people were friendly, and we could see a lot of possibilities here. The interstate brought a lot of traffic through, and there were a number of historic places in the area."

They looked at the vacant Rawson building and liked it immediately, but decided to look around some more while they thought about whether to buy it.

So they continued into New Mexico, Colorado, and looped back to Upstate, New York for Christmas. By that time the show was deep there -- and they realized they had seen nothing that impressed them as much as the Rawson building and Eastland.

So they came back to Eastland on a sunny January day, and things happened fast after that. While a lawyer worked on tech-

Jury Deals 99 Years In Drug Conviction

In a jury trial in 91st District Court last week Richard Gaeta, formerly of Eastland, was sentenced to 99 years in the Texas Department of Corrections on a drug delivery charge. In addition, he was assessed a \$10,000 fine.

Visiting Judge Pete Perez of Fort Worth presided over the trial. Eastland County District Attorney Mike Siebert prosecuted the case, assisted by Attorney Bill Dowell.

Also assisting the prosecution at the trial was West Central Texas Drug Task Force officers Frank Cleveland and Adrian Huddleston, DPS Narcotics Division, Sgt. Jim Greenlee, Texas Ranger Gene Kea, and Eastland Police Dept. officer Don Walls.

The Court appointed Attorney for the Defense was Jim Parker of Comanche.

The guilt-innocence phase of the trial began on Thursday, March 30 and continued until 5:30 that day. The jury found the defendant guilty of delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine), with the incident allegedly taking place in Cisco on Feb. 16, 1993.

Friday morning the Court proceeded with the sentencing phase. The 99-year sentence was the maximum for the case.

Kidnapping Charges To Go To Grand Jury

A Carrollton woman was released from the Eastland County jail Monday, pending a Grand Jury consideration of kidnapping charges against her.

Julia Ann Moore, 34, allegedly removed her grandmother, age 72, from the Eastland Health Care Center Sunday afternoon.

Staff members at the nursing home notified officers about 7:10 p.m. that a patient had been taken without permission.

A Palo Pinto County Deputy Sheriff stopped Moore's car, which was eastbound on I-20. Eastland Police Chief Cecil Funderburgh returned her to Eastland County, where she was placed in jail under a kidnapping charge. Bond was set at \$50,000.

Her grandmother was taken to Eastland Memorial Hospital, then later returned to the nursing home.

On behalf of the Eastland Police Department, Chief Funderburgh asked Justice of the Peace Jack Graham Monday to drop bond charges on Moore. The charges were lowered to a personal recognizance bond of \$10,000, which she will forfeit if she doesn't come back to a Court hearing. She then left the jail.

"This is such a complex situation that we thought it would be best to present it a Grand Jury," states Chief Funderburgh.

"Hopefully it will be resolved with the least amount of inconvenience to everyone."

nicalities of the purchase, the Zoellicks began to put their knowledge of construction, woodworking and decorating to practical use.

They have done most of the work themselves -- climbing ladders, lifting, scraping, tearing things loose and nailing things down. While the basic framework of the building is sound, much of the interior is being refurbished -- with the thought of restoring it into as near an original condition as possible.

When completed, there will be one bedroom and bathroom on the ground floor (for the handicapped) and ten rooms with private baths for guests on the second floor. These bedrooms should be open by the fall of 1995,

Part of the third floor is being redone for the Zoellick's own apartment, and they hope to move in there after Easter. Eventually part of this floor will also have rooms for overnight guests.

The sunny northeast side of the ground floor will be the Lobby, and the area south of the staircase will be used as a dining room. Coffee and desserts will be served there on weekends, after the show at the Majestic Theatre. This dining area is expected to be open to the public by late spring.

Plans are to leave the original antique tile flooring in the dining room, while the Lobby will have a leafy floral carpet in green, rose and turquoise. Vintage pressed-tin ceilings are part of the special features being unearthed during the restoration. They had been covered by a long time by dropped ceil-

ways. Special appreciation goes to Dr. Brian and Becky Clute, Dr. Ferhman and Helen Lund, Kirk and Denise Davis, Judge Austin and Mary Anne McCloud, and all of the members of the Eastland Fine Arts Association. Also, the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Cisco has welcomed Mike and Anne as new members.

"We hope the people of Eastland County will feel they can use this place too -- that it won't be only for tourists," the Zoellicks say. "The Bed and Breakfast rooms might be handy to use for extra family visitors during the Holiday season next fall."

As Anne speaks of these things she seems to look past all the debris of remodeling -- right into the time when the old building will glow with new life and color.

This resurrection will mean a lot to the town and area, as well as to the tourists who drive into Eastland to stay there.

Important Social Security Deadline Is Approaching

The months of March and April are the time of year when several important reporting deadlines take place for Social Security beneficiaries and workers, according to Ken Hargis, Social Security district manager in Abilene.

In 1994 if you received Social Security benefits while working and earned above the annual limit, you need to report your earnings to Social Security no later than April 17, 1995. The 1994 limits were \$8,040 for people under 65 and \$11,160 for people 65-69. If you were age 70 for the entire year, the earnings limits do not apply to you.

If you are self-employed, it's time for you to report your earnings and pay Social Security tax with

your income tax return. If you operate a trade, business, or profession, either by yourself or as a partner, and have actual net earnings of \$400 or more this year, you must report your earnings on Schedule SE. The deadline for filing your income tax return is April 17, 1995.

If you were eligible for Part B of Medicare, you had until March 31, 1995, to sign up for Part B during the annual enrollment period. Part B, also called "medical insurance," helps pay for doctor's services, outpatient hospital care, and other medical services. If you did not enroll when you first were eligible, your Medicare Part B premium will be 10 percent higher than the basic monthly premium for each twelve-month period you were eligible but not enrolled. The next open enrollment period will begin in January 1996.

You can get more information 24 hours a day by calling Social Security's toll-free number, 1-800-772-1213. You can speak to a service representative between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on business days. Our lines are busiest early in the week and early in the month, so if your business can wait, it's best to call at other

times. Whenever you call, have your Social Security number handy.

If you have a touch-tone phone, recorded information and services are available after 7 p.m. weekdays and all day on weekends and holidays.

People who are deaf or hard of hearing may call our toll-free "TTY" number, 1-800-325-0778, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on business days.

CJC Offers Continuing Ed. Class In Keyboarding

Cisco Jr. College will offer a Continuing Education Course in "Keyboarding" on April 12, 12, 19, 20, 26, and 27, 1995 at the Cisco campus. The class will meet from 6-9 p.m. in Room 31 of the Vocational-Technical I Building. Instructor for the course will be Tianay Rabb.

Keyboarding will be taught using WordPerfect. Emphasis will be on learning correct techniques of typing and building accuracy and speed. First time users of computers will benefit because the basics of

WordPerfect will be covered, and they will have the opportunity to become familiar with the keyboard before taking other computer courses. CEU's (Continuing Education Units) will be awarded upon completion.

Cost for the 18-hour course is \$43 and is limited to 15 students. Registration deadline is April 10.







1995 Exemption And Special Valuation Applications Are Available Through May 1

Eastland County property owners wishing to sign up for 1995 property tax exemptions and/or special use valuations may obtain the necessary applications at the office of the Eastland County Appraisal District. The office is located on the second floor of the Eastland County Courthouse, Eastland, Texas. The necessary applications may be requested by telephone. The number to call is 629-8597.

The completed application must be filed with the Eastland County Appraisal District by May 1, 1995 if it is to be considered timely filed for the 1995 tax year.

There are numerous property tax exemptions and/or special valuations through the Texas Property Tax Code. A partial list of those available is given at the end of this article. If a property owner has a question as to his or her eligibility, they should contact the Eastland County Appraisal District for assistance.

Homeowners can take

advantage of the partial homestead exemptions available. The exemption application must be filed by May 1, 1995. It does not have to be re-applied for each year. If the residential homestead owner resides in the same house for 1995 that he or she lived in for 1994; and they received a homestead exemption for 1994; they do not need to re-apply for 1995. An exemption to this would be a person who received the exemption last year (1994); but has turned sixty-five (65) years of age during the 1994 year. This person would need to re-apply as he or she would now be eligible for an additional or increased exemption in an amount available to those over sixty-five (65) years of age.

If you have a question as to whether you are receiving a homestead exemption or as to your eligibility for one of the available exemptions or special valuations; please contact the Eastland County Appraisal District for information and assistance.

Each Texas springtime brings flowers to fields and roadsides and a question to the minds of nature lovers - is it really illegal to pick bluebonnets?

The answer is no - there is no law against picking our State Flower. However, there are laws against criminal trespass - so make sure you're not on private property when you stop to take your annual kids-in-the-bluebonnets photo.

There are laws against damaging or destroying rights-of-ways and gov-

ernment property - so pick a few flowers, but don't dig up clumps of them and don't drive your vehicle into the midst of them. Remember, Mother Nature and in many cases, your fellow Texans, scattered wildflower seeds along medians and roadways so that everyone could enjoy spring flowers.

For the safety of yourself and others, as well as to limit your ticketability: There are laws against impeding traffic - so be careful about slowing down to enjoy the view. Pick areas with light traffic conditions for stopping. Signal before leaving or

entering the roadway. Park off the roadway (off of improved shoulders), parallel to the road in the direction of traffic, on the same side of the roadway that the flowers are on. Don't talk or run across lanes of traffic to get to the flowers.

Obey signs that prohibit parking on a particular stretch of roadway. And remember that in addition to a ticket, snakes and fire ants could also put more blue in your day than you bargained for.




