2 Found Shot In Cisco Residence

An estranged Cisco couple, George Lee Scott, 37, and Sheila Ilene Scott, 31, were found deceased in the front bedroom of the house on West 19th Street where he was living. A relative found the bodies and called Cisco Police around 2 p.m. Sunday.
 A .22 caliber rifle and a note were seized as evidence by officers, and an autopsy was ordered on both bodies. Justice of the Peace Jack Graham pronounced them dead at 2:30 p.m., and they were transported to the Tarrant County Medical Examiner in Fort Worth.

According to Police Detective Kenneth Preston, the evidence indicates that Mr. Scott murdered his wife and shot himself. The note reportedly contained a confession, and the rifle was believed to be the instrument of death. But officers are awaiting an official cause of death and other information before completing the investigation.
 There were three children by a previous marriage in the home of Mrs. Scott, who was separated from Mr. Scott.

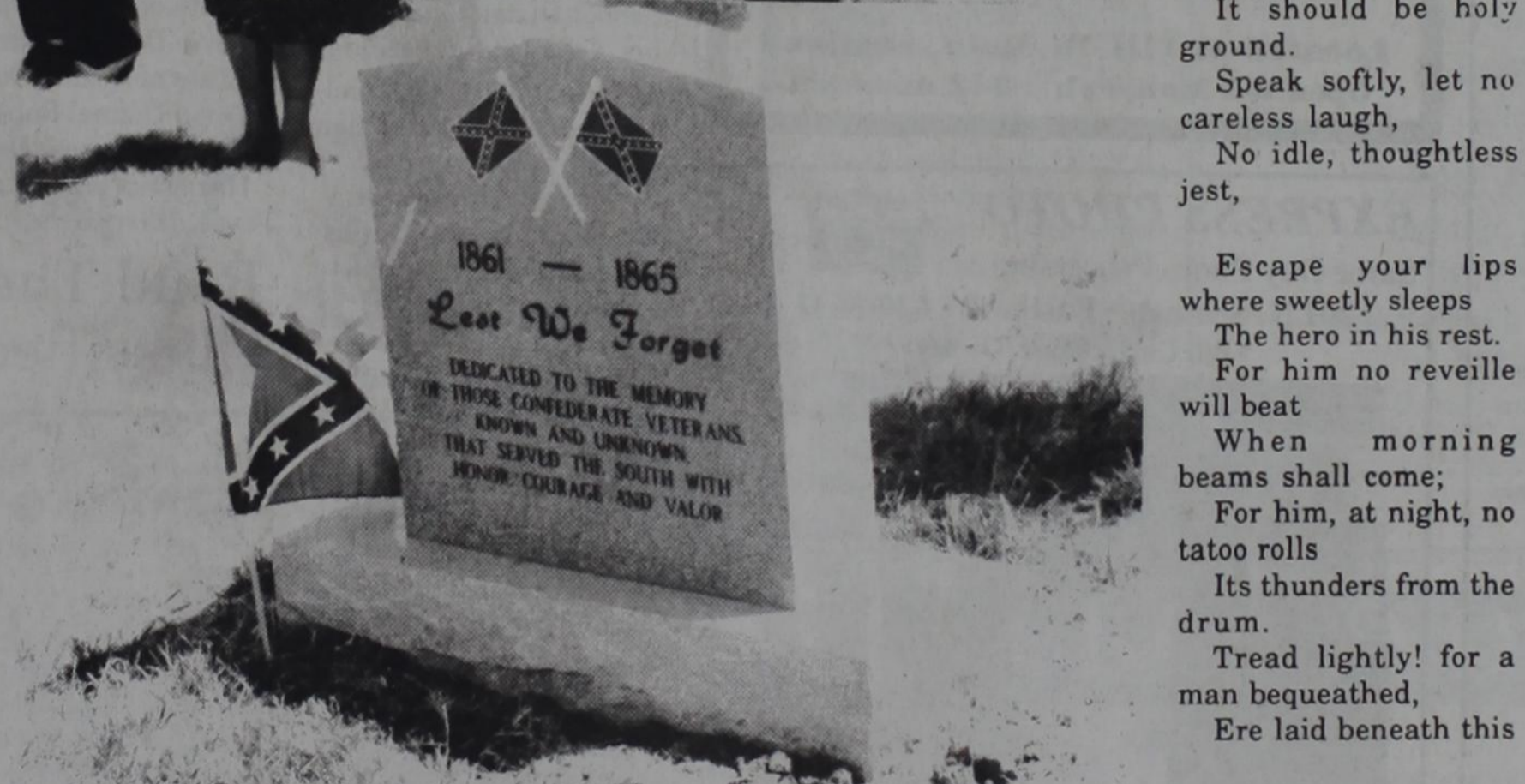

 "The fence became a political issue," he declared.
 He added that McPhail was never given any notice of meetings at the Commissioners Court where his fence was being discussed.
 "Two Commissioners didn't see any problem," he said.
 He also said that Mike Siebert, District Attorney, told the Sheriff "There's nothing to be done."
 He said the County Commissioners meeting in September was a "Racous affair, with demands being made on the Commissioners."

She's also smart, funny, and plays the violin. But she's not tall and blonde, so routinely gets overlooked when it comes to romance.

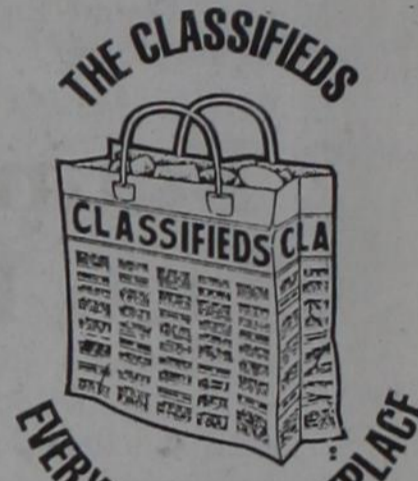
Noelle Slusarsky (Uma Thurman), on the other hand, is tall and blonde. She's also kind, generous, and a

June Sales Tax Payments 23% Increase Than Last Year

VA Benefits Due And Deserved

VA Benefits are an entitlement, prescribed by public law, to partially compensate Military Veterans with disabilities. Almost all benefits require Active Service during a wartime period, many require that the disability be service-connected, and others require that the disability be "total and permanent." Some special category veterans, such as ex POWs, World War I Veterans, those exposed to Radiation or Agent Orange, and those who served in Southwest Asia during the Gulf War are entitled to special consideration and benefits. Several recent cases in the Eastland County Veterans Service Office have revealed that veterans, widows, are not receiving deserved benefits because: 1) They never applied, or 2) they never knew they were eligible, or 3) they didn't really consider that they needed the benefits. In some cases, there are time limits for applying for benefits. If you wait too long, you cannot apply regardless of the condition or need. This is particularly important in establishing service connection for many diseases and conditions. Veterans with any degree of disability that may be linked to Active Duty and veterans with total and permanent disability that is not service-connected should check on their entitlement to VA benefits. Surviving dependents of veterans who were receiving compensation or pension benefits at the time of their death should check on their dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC) benefits. The Eastland County Veterans Service Office is open Monday and Wednesday afternoons from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is located in Room 200 in the Court House and the phone number is 629-6008. 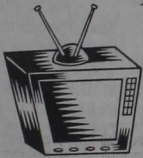

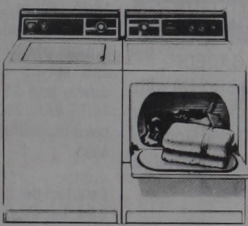

Q. Can you give me any tips on how I can give my dog his medicine without him biting me? I tried putting it in his food, but he ate all around it, leaving the pill in the bottom of the bowl. He really needs the medicine, but I just can't seem to get it down his throat.

A. If your dog won't eat it in his dog food, try putting some dog food on a spoon, sticking the pill in the middle. Chances are, he'll lick the food, pill and all, off the spoon and won't even know he's had his medicine.

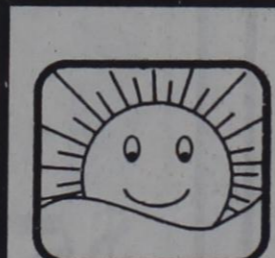
Some dogs, however, are wise to this trick as well, so you have to take other action. Put some butter on the pill, put the pill far enough down his throat, then tip his head back, stroking his throat until he swallows the pill. The taste of the butter masks the medicine taste and the butter itself makes it easy to slide down the dog's throat. Incidentally, this works well for cats, too.

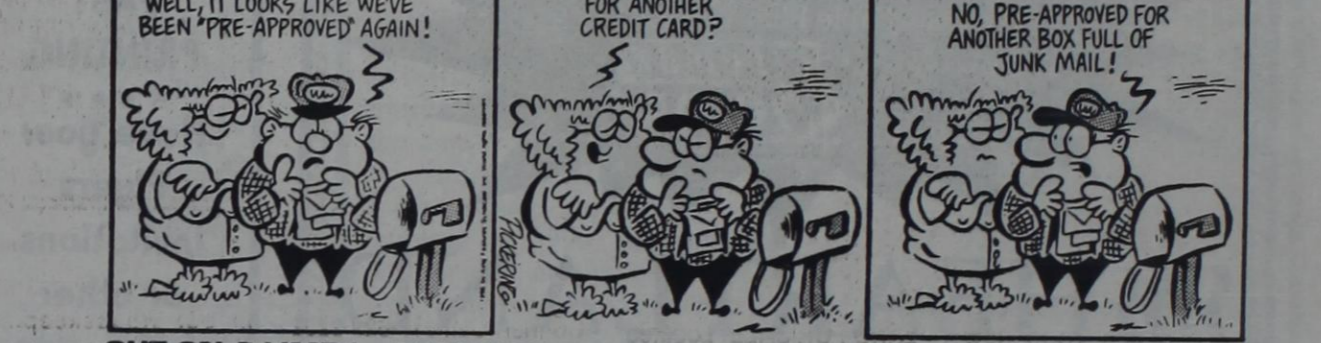

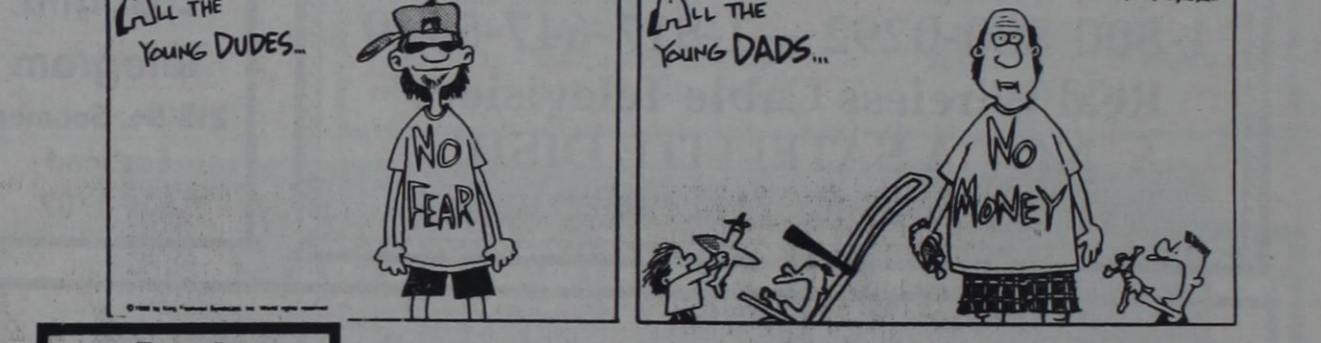

House Defeats Amendments to Cut Peanut, Animal Damage Control Programs

During consideration of legislation providing agriculture appropriations for fiscal year (FY) 1997, the House of Representatives this week defeated amendments which would have been devastating to the peanut and animal damage control programs.

By a vote of 189-234, the House rejected an amendment which would have created a ceiling of \$640 per ton of peanuts which a producer could receive for FY 1997.

This effort is the most extreme form of price-fixing you can find, and it is clear to me the proponents of this amendment did not understand the peanut program or that passage of such an amendment would have denied producers the opportunity to get the best price from the market for their product.

Our recent experience with cereal manufacturers lowering their prices in the face of record grain prices has apparently

failed to convince some folks that the price the producer is receiving does not play a major role in determining the price of the final product.

The House also rejected an amendment which would have reduced funding for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal Damage Control (ADC) Programs by 50%, from \$26.8 million to \$13.4 million.

The ADC functions to control animals manifesting economic damage as well as the control of animals for human safety or the safety of other animals, and protects livestock, aquaculture, and certain ag crops. Under the proposed ADC amendment, the funding reduction would have come from western livestock predator control, affecting predators such as coy-

otes, foxes and bears.

Anyone who questions the need for this program should talk to a rancher who has lost several hundred head of livestock to coyotes, or to public health officials who are worried about the spread of rabies. The ADC Program is a responsible way of dealing with problems that are not just confined to states in the far west.

Businesses May Apply for Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA

Businesses depending on farmers and ranchers in some Texas counties can now apply for low interest Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). These loans are made available to help businesses meet normal operating expenses that cannot be met due to the effects of a disaster.

As the result of drought, hail and high winds which occurred during the period of June 1, 1994

through February 20, 1996 and continuing businesses that are dependent upon these producers may have experienced a significant loss of income which would, not otherwise have occurred. These SBA disaster loans are designed to help meet such a need.

In order to qualify, small businesses must meet SBA's size standard. Businesses which can meet their financial needs through other sources are not eligible. AUSTIN — Tobacco industry lawyers last week formally denied charges in Texas' \$4 billion lawsuit seeking reimbursement for Medicaid money spent on the treatment of tobacco-related illnesses.

Lawyers for Philip Morris, R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., the Tobacco Institute and other firms also filed motions that the lawsuit be either dismissed or moved from federal court in Texarkana to Austin, where they say many of the witnesses and documents are located, the *Dallas Morning News* reported.

But Ron Dusek, a spokesman for Attorney General Dan Morales, said the request for a change of venue was only a delay tactic.

"We are in a court right now where we can put this case on a fast track and get the issue resolved," Dusek said.

Tobacco lawyers also challenged Morales' hiring outside law firms to help prosecute the state's case and receive a share of any damages awarded in the case, and claimed that the state is seeking more money than it spent on tobacco-related illnesses.

Handgun Incidents Are Few

Col. James Wilson, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, says he is "impressed" with the responsible behavior of concealed handgun permit holders.

At a Senate Criminal Justice

Committee hearing on concealed handguns in Houston last week, Wilson, who heads the agency in charge of background checks for permit applicants, said, "So far, it has impressed me how remarkably responsible the permit holders have been."

Since the concealed handgun law went into effect Jan. 1, two permit holders have fatally shot other people, and there have been two suicides by permit holders.

A total of 51 shots have been fired from lawfully carried handguns, 40 of them fired by an individual at a tree in a public park.

As of last week, 83,000 applications for concealed handgun permits have been received by the DPS and some 67,000 permits have been issued.

Bush Wants Thorough Checks

Meanwhile, Gov. George W. Bush said he would like to see more thorough mental background checks on people applying for concealed handgun permits, the *Houston Chronicle* reported.

Wilson told the committee that mental health background checks have been run on less than 1 percent of the 83,158 Texans who have submitted applications, due to rules regarding confidentiality.

Bush said he would like to "be practical about it" but see if there is a way to conduct more thorough checks within legal limitations.

Bush said he believes the handgun law has made Texas safer and indicated there may be a correlation between the drop in violent crime and the new law.

Contractor Suing TDCJ

An Alabama company has filed a lawsuit in Lamesa claiming the Texas Department of Criminal Justice's construction program was so mismanaged the company lost millions of dollars building three prisons.

Harbert International seeks \$12.3 million for expenses allegedly incurred because of the state prison agency's "confusion, disorganiza-

tion, mismanagement and ... uncooperative approach," the *Houston Chronicle* reported.

The firm signed contracts in 1991 to build 1,000-bed units in Hondo, Lamesa and Pampa.

Carl Reynolds, general counsel for the Texas Board of Criminal Justice, called Harbert's lawsuit "frivolous litigation" and said the TDCJ pays its debts and settles claims "where money is owed."

Under Texas sovereign immunity law, any party who wants to sue the state must get the state's permission to do so.

Other Capital Highlights

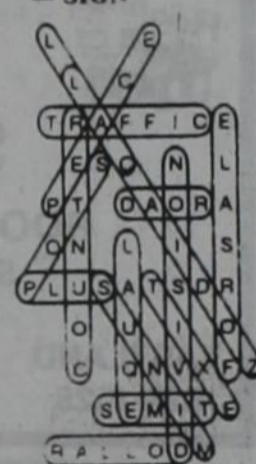
■ A federal judge ruled all Texas polling places and voting booths must be accessible to voters who are blind or physically disabled before elections in the year 2000. After hearing a 1994 class action suit brought by six El Paso voters, U.S. District Judge David Briones ordered Secretary of State Tony Garza's office to ensure voting places are accessible.

■ Gov. Bush was presented a lifetime membership in the Girl Scouts after speaking at an awards program in the Capitol's House Chamber. At the event, more than 200 young women received the Girl Scout Gold Award, the group's highest honor.

■ Democratic U.S. Senate nominee Victor Morales and his wife, Dani, agreed last week to repay her \$22,285 scholarship from the U.S. Indian Health Service. The scholarship helped pay Mrs. Morales' way through Texas Woman's University, Denton, from 1978 to 1982. The amount owed had been in dispute for more than a decade.

■ Attorney General Dan Morales released an opinion saying the Legislature's changes in the Texas Family Code allow law enforcement agencies to release names, addresses and complete records of juvenile offenders for crimes committed after Jan. 1. The new law retains a provision that juvenile records be kept separate from adult records and be maintained locally.

"Sheriff White was just trying to do his job, and by doing that he gets himself prosecuted by the Attorney General's office!" Lewellen declared.

"It is a crime in the State of Texas to obstruct the right-of-way of a public road.

"Everything that went right or wrong on this got dumped on

Ronnie White," Lewellen added.

"Are your Commissioners or the other officials on trial here?"

"No - White sits here, with his family embarrassed - his professional reputation ruined!"

At the conclusion of the opening statements various witnesses came forward to be sworn in.

At press time testimony was proceeding.
