



There are many things you can do to spot employee theft in your business. Have an inquiring mind, ask lots of questions, and never accept answers that don't make sense. Spend time each month monitoring your financial results. Look for inconsistencies, such as inventory declining in the slow sales month or excessive customer returns. Listen to customer complaints about late deliveries or missing items, and don't accept "computer problems" as an excuse. If you know your business, you don't have to be an accounting expert to sense when something is wrong.

You could also spot-check your accounting records by reviewing one category each month. For example, you might scan the check register to see just what payments are being made. Look for missing check numbers and ask to see any voided checks. Another month you might review the payroll log or look over the records of returned items. Look for multiple entries of similar items or suspicious customer names.

Finally, watch your employees for changes in behavior or spending that seems to be beyond their means. And beware of an employee who insists on doing all the detail work and never takes a vacation. It could be the sign of someone with something to hide.

In my next column, I'll discuss ways to prevent employee thefts.

# **USDA** Announces Dates For Sheep Promotion And Research Referendum

Eastland County The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced that a second nationwide sheep referendum on the Sheep and Wool Promotion, Research, Education, and Information Order will be conducted Oct. 1

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, a marketing and regulatory programs agency, has oversight responsibility for federal research and promotion programs. AMS administrator Lon

Hatamiya said all producers, feeders, and importers who certify they were engaged in the production, feeding or importation of sheep or sheep products (except importers of raw wool only) between Jan. 1 and Dec. 1994, are eligible to vote.

Hatamiya said that a second referendum is needed based on a review conducted by USDA, which revealed that the referendum rules were inconsistently applied during the Feb. 5, 1996, referendum.

# PUZZLING HEEL PAIN

Many people visit the podiatrist because of pain in a heel. Some relate the pain to a sudden injury, but others are clueless. By examining the foot and employing X-rays, the podiatrist diagnoses the problem. Sometimes it is an imperfect heel bone or a disorder such as arthritis. More often the problem lies in the fascia, a fibrous band of tissue which winds around the heel and extends to the forefoot. It helps to control the action of the arch.

Heel pain results when excessive stretching of the fascia leaves it irritated and inflamed at the heel bone. Factors inviting this condition include spending a lot of time on the feet, shoes with little cushioning and overweight. In typical cases the podiatrist subdues the inflammation and relieves pain with cortisone injections, oral medications and taping and padding the foot. Sometimes an orthotic shoe insert or physical therapy are employed to speed recovery.

# Roadside Mowing To Feed Livestock

Drought conditions in cans, and blown-out tires, Texas have caused many ranchers to be short of livestock feed this year. Because of a 1977 law, the Texas Department of Transportation is able to help the ranchers by allowing them to mow grass along some highways.

The 1977 law allows ranchers to mow the state's 77,000 miles of highways for livestock feed in emergencies. However, written permission from the department is required before any roadside mowing is done.

When the roadsides are mowed for animal feed, there are several things that ranchers need to be careful of. Don Dorsett, Extension specialist in soil and crop sciences, said that ranchers must be






