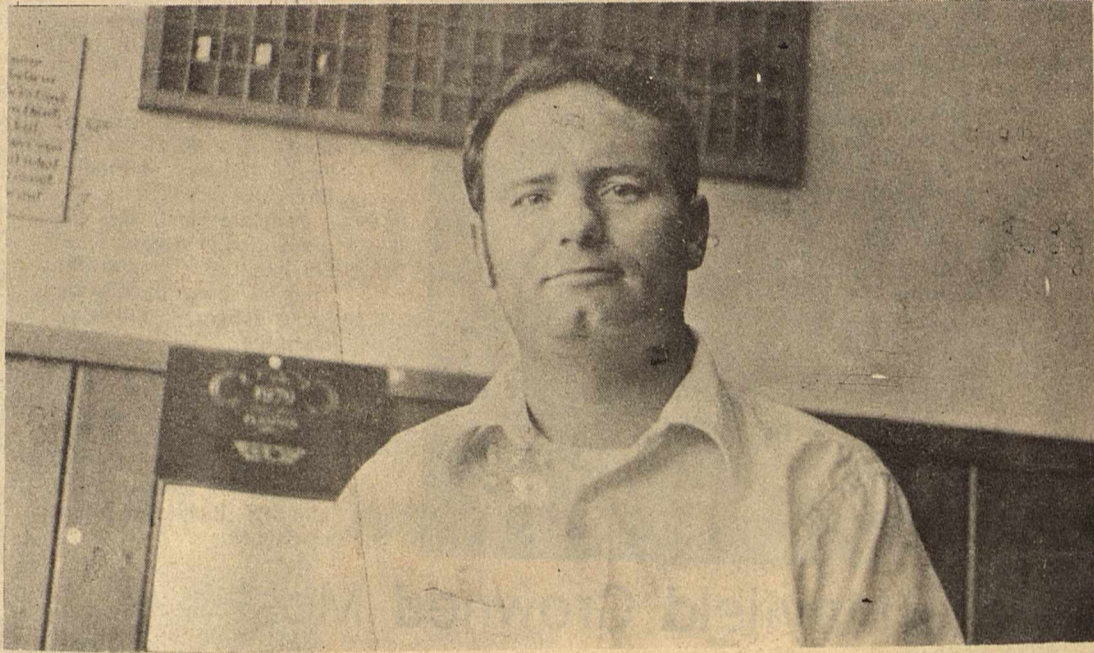

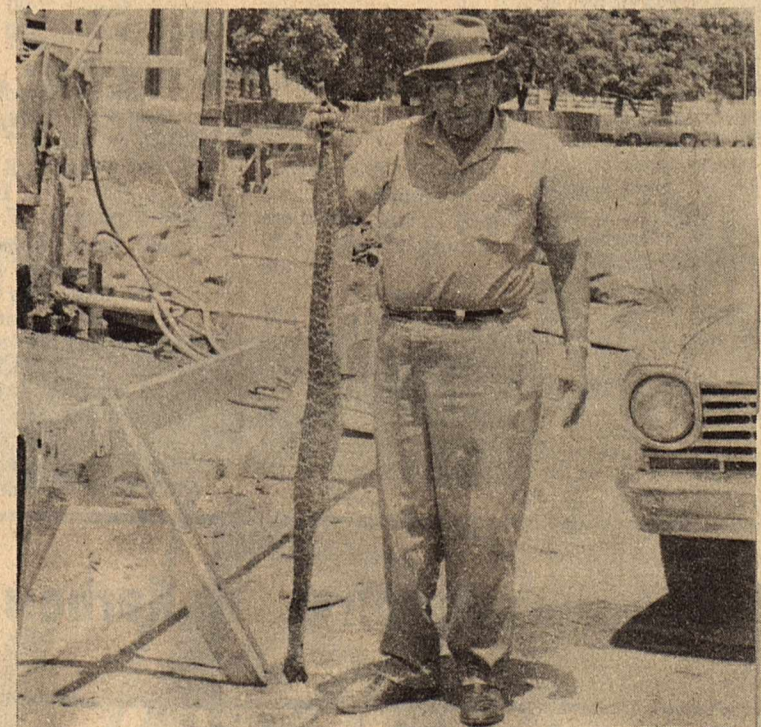
The activities for the
