

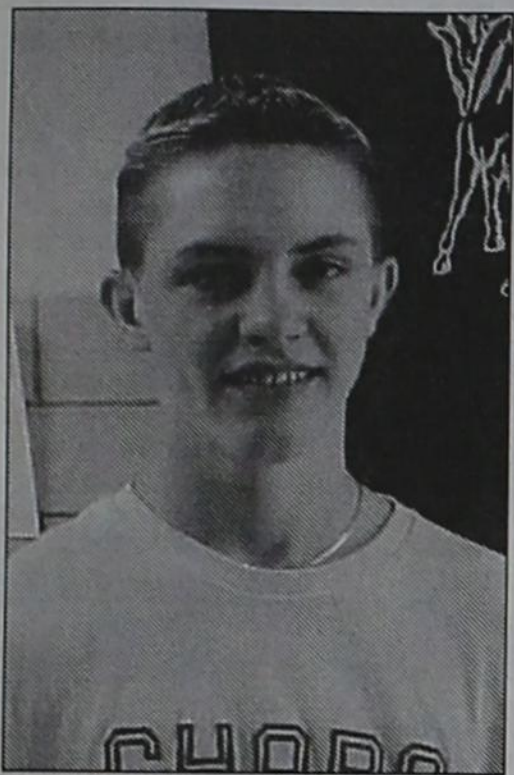

Hospital Continues To Build For The Future

At a time when medical facilities in the rural areas are being challenged by lack of doctors, personnel, equipment, etc., Parmer County Community Hospital has been "on a roll" to begin the new century and millennium.

The hospital recently became the first hospital in the State to receive the "Critical Access Designation." The designation was effective December 1, 1999.

This is a program designed to provide improved Medicare reimbursement and will assist rural hospitals in maintaining access to basic quality health care. "Congratulations to our employees and medical staff on this achievement," said hospital Administrator, Bill Neely this week.

PCCH has also received the "Cancer Registry Certificate of Excellence," an award for medical record documentation and reporting.

A Blanket/Fluid Warmer was recently acquired to improve patient comfort. The equipment purchase was made possible through proceeds raised from "Project Christmas Card."

"We want to say 'Good Luck' to Monia Ann Wilson and Susan Renner, Licensed Vocational Nurses, who are pursuing Registered Nurse Degrees, and also to Laura Rosales, Certified Nurse Aide, who is studying to become a Licensed Vocational Nurse," Neely said.

Neely also pointed out that new patient equipment in the hospital's Radiology Department performs bone mineral density studies used by the medical staff to detect/diagnose osteoporosis.

The hospital's Laboratory is also welcoming a new employee, Barbara Pitcock, Medical Laboratory Tech-

nologist (ASCP).

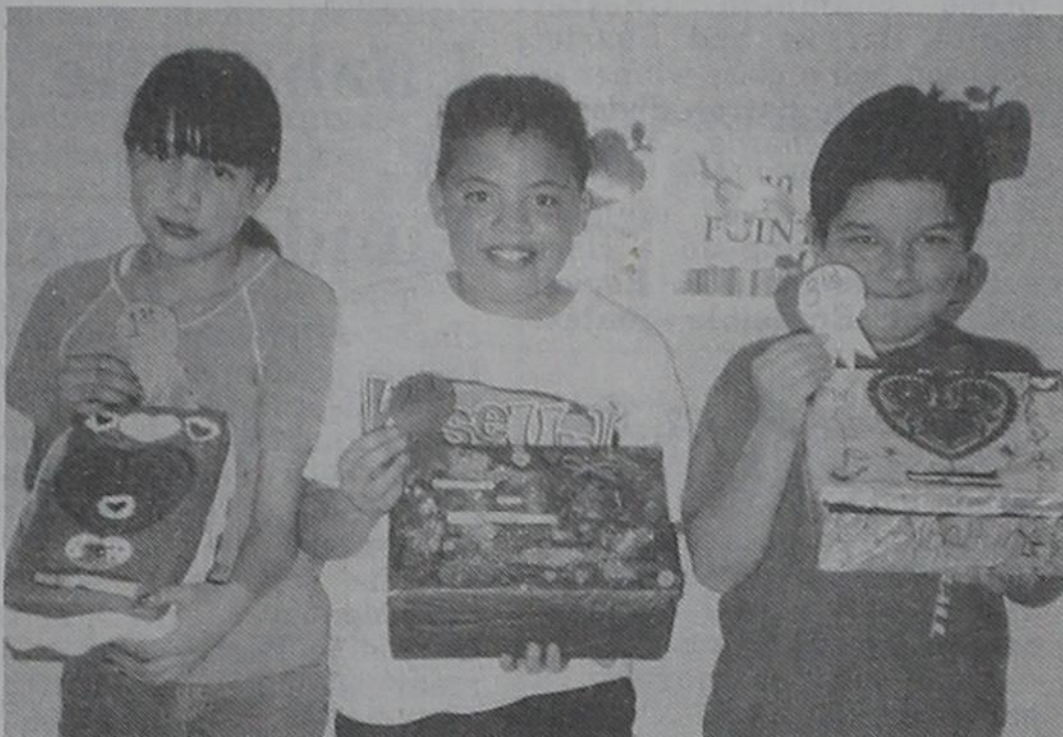
The laboratory has recently added a new chemistry analyzer capable of processing routine chemistries (i.e., glucose, bun, creatinine, electrolytes, and therapeutic drug monitoring).

Marka Dempsey, Registered Dietitian, has joined the staff of Parmer County Community Hospital. Ms. Dempsey will be providing consultation services for the dietary department and also

personalized dietary counseling for individuals referred by their physician.

Ms. Dempsey is available every other Wednesday. She started January 12, 2000.

Lazbuddie Woman Dies In House Fire

Florence Engelking, 92, a longtime resident of the Lazbuddie/Clay's Corner area in southern Parmer County, died early Thursday morning, February 24, when her house burned.

At about 8 a.m. Thursday, a call was received from the 911 network, about a house fire on County Road CC, a mile west of Highway 214. County Road CC is approximately a mile south of the Clay's Corner intersection.

As units from the Lazbuddie fire and ambulance group, as well as the Friona Fire Department and ambulance arrived, it was learned that an occupant of the house had been pulled from her burning bedroom by a passerby.

Units from the Muleshoe Fire Department also assisted. Mrs. Engelking, the sole occupant of the house, was pronounced dead at the scene by Farwell J.P. Pam Hasehoff, who also ordered an autopsy to determine the cause of death.

The home was totally destroyed by the fire and the State Fire Marshall is investigating.

Funeral arrangements were pending at our press time, with Ellis Funeral Home of Muleshoe.

Terms expiring on the city council are Mayor Galen Hromas, and members Kenneth Waters and Jessie Stone.

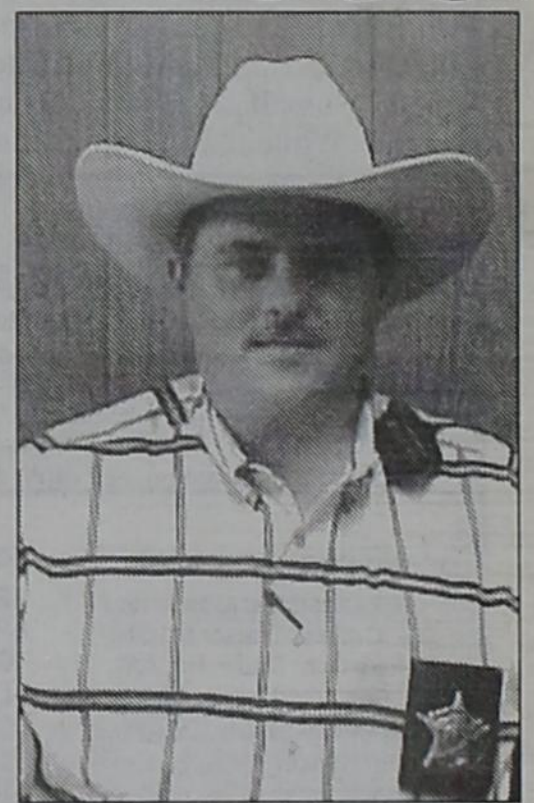
Citizens interested in being a candidate for council or mayor can pick up an application at city hall.

ONLY RIP VAN WINKLE, asleep for the past 50 years, could have missed being acquainted with the little moon-faced characters of Charlie Brown, Lucy, Linus, Schroder, Snoopy, Woodstock, Pig Pen, Peppermint Patty, and the others. They are gone now and we mourn them almost as much as we mourn their human creator, cartoonist Charles "Sparky" Schulz, who passed away in his sleep on Feb. 12 at age 77, just a day before his final Sunday colored cartoon "farewell" strip ran in all the papers.

It's hard to believe that this dedicated cartoonist, day in and day out, drew his little characters for 50 years, half a century, with no outside help from anyone. And he reserved the right to keep Charlie Brown's little fictional family as his very own by not passing the torch along to some other cartoonist to carry on after his demise.

They say he created the Peanuts cartoon in 1950, but I didn't discover it until the late 50s during my college years. I remember those long boring lines to sign up for classes on registration day at Texas Tech. I would always stop by the book store first to pick up the latest in the series of Peanuts cartoon books, to fluff away the time while standing in line. It wouldn't be long before I noticed three or four people in line had crowded around to read over my shoulder. I didn't mind, except that some folks read slower than others, and the slow pokes invariably made noises of distress whenever I turned a page before they were finished reading it.

Cartoonists and column writers have a little bit in common. Both are observers of human nature. Each publication of their work is a small essay on life as we know it. Linus once said "I love humanity; it's people I can't stand." But Schulz managed to touch something in the heart of each of us that inspires us to keep on keeping on, just as Charlie Brown did. He could never kick a football, he could never win a baseball game, he could never fly a kite without getting it tangled in tree branches, he could never gain the love of the little red haired girl. But he never gave up trying.

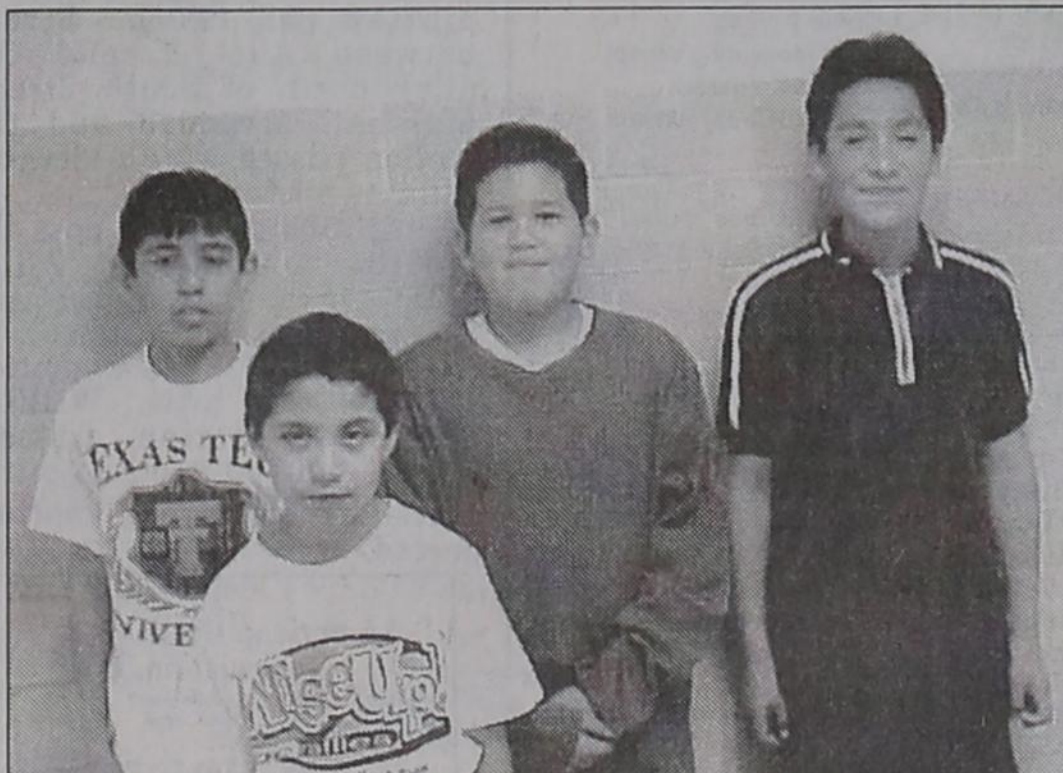
Of course, I identified most with the neurotic Lucy. Her little streak of meanness when she yanked the football away, preventing her friend Charlie Brown from kicking it ... her bossy, know-it-all attitude ... her sassy stubbornness, sticking her nose into everyone's business but her own ... she was so ME. I never met Charles Schulz. How could he produce such a cartoon persona with all of my own character flaws rolled into one feisty little fussybudget?

Don't tell my Good Old Boy, but I think he is a combination of Charlie Brown, Linus and Pig Pen.

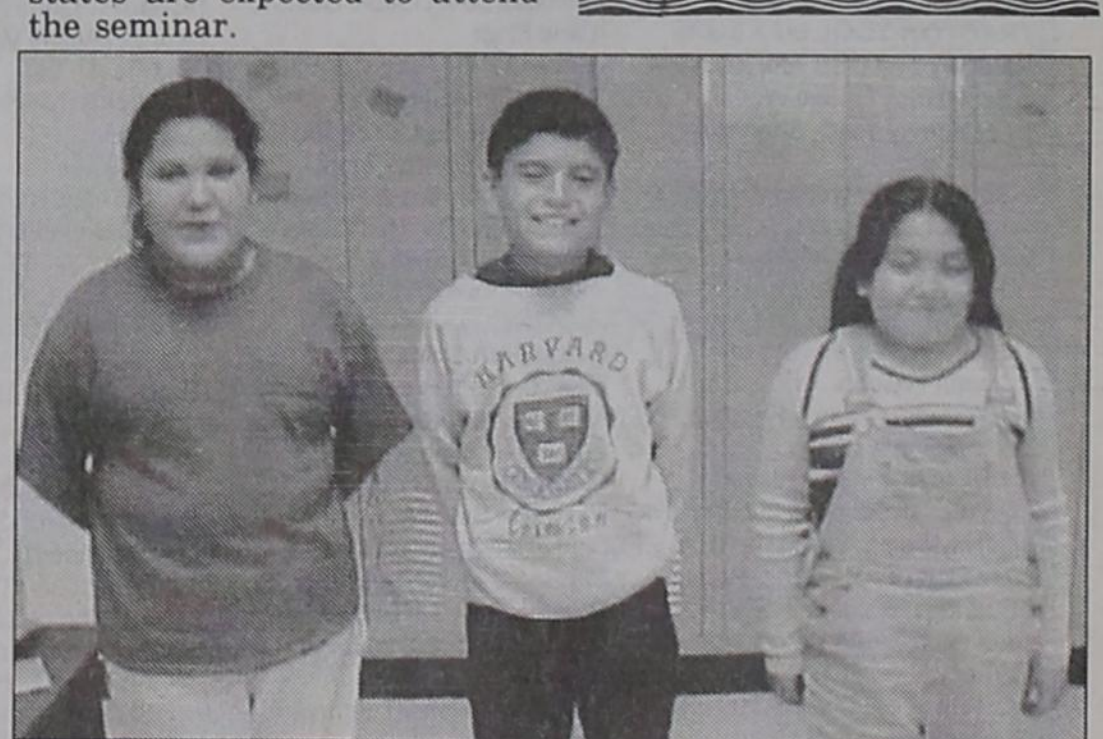
Probably each person who read the Peanuts comic strip could identify with one or more of the characters on any given day. And that's why the little round-faced kids and their beagle have been so beloved by people all over the world. The strip was translated into many languages, which indicates that the substance of the cartoon appealed to a general audience, no matter what their persuasion.

Charles Schulz's work had a positive impact on the lives of many, but he, himself, was very "Charlie Brown" about it all. He did not think of himself as an artist. He said cartoonists' work was seldom seen in art galleries, but when art galleries needed to raise money, they didn't seem to mind asking a cartoonist to donate an original panel to be auctioned off as a fund raiser. I think if you've had a Broadway musical production based on your very own cartoon characters, you could just thumb your nose at all the art galleries.

The beagle has landed and the funny papers don't seem quite as funny anymore.

Marshall made a motion to table the Pay Schedule, Stone seconded, motion passed.

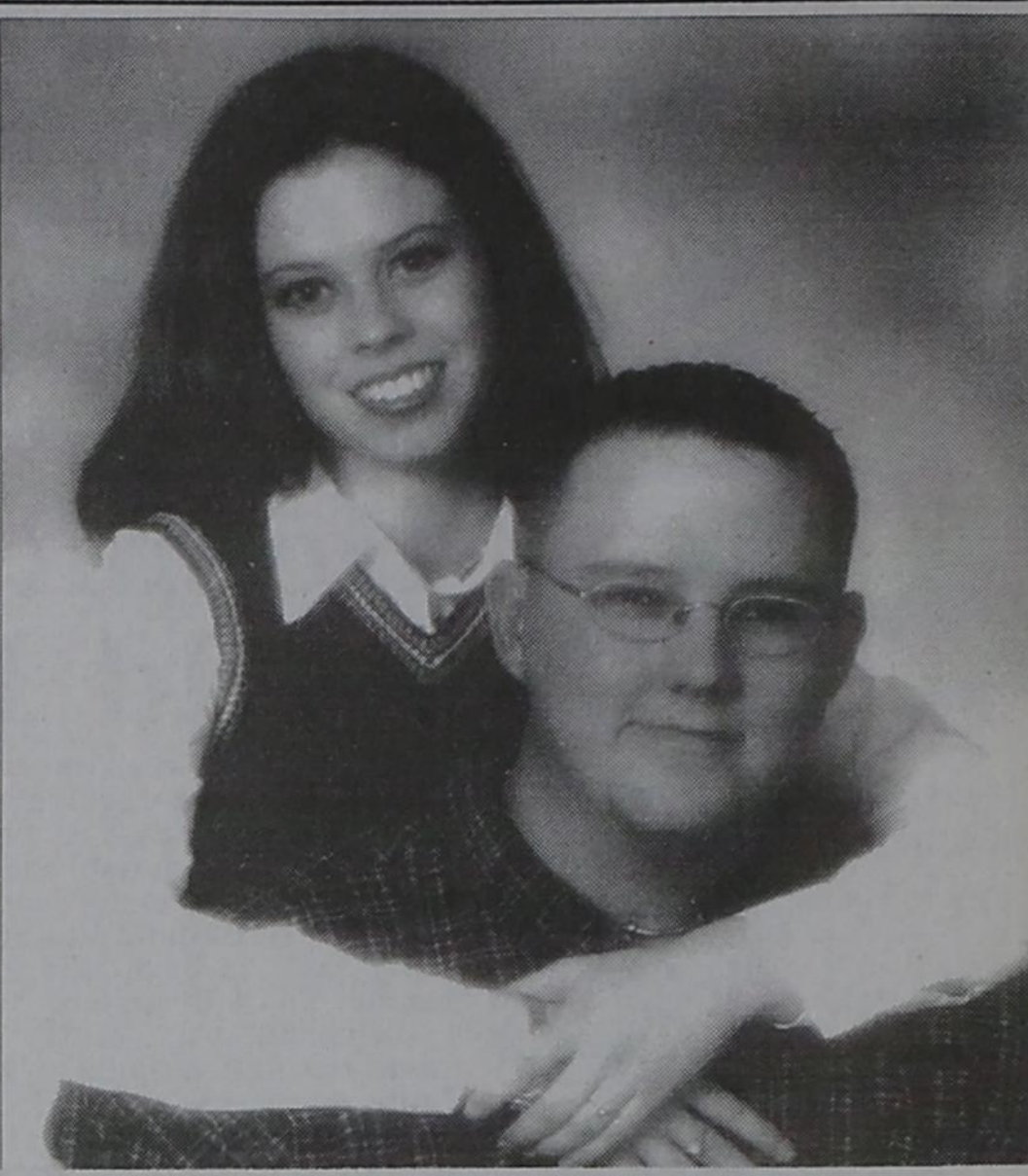

it and you think it's alright, so cut me some slack.

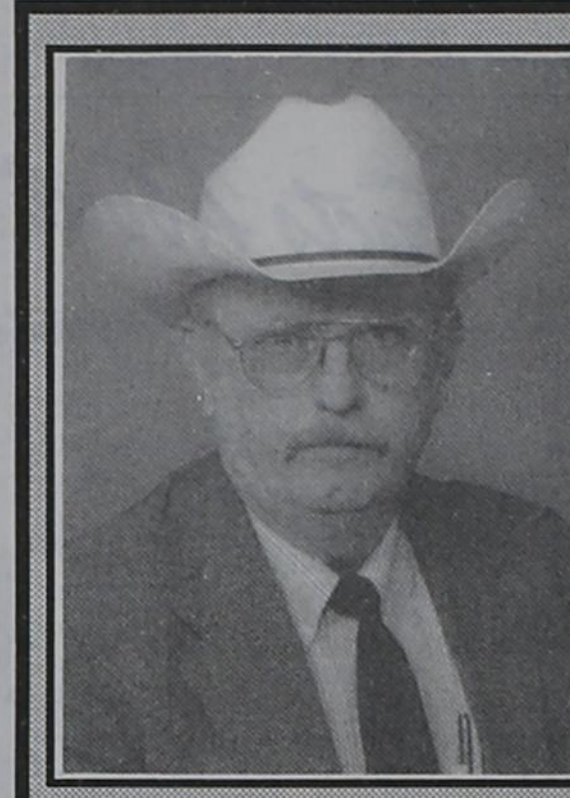
I don't even care who becomes president, as long as it isn't Algore.

Cotton News



With the U.S. cotton industry facing potentially damaging effects from building domestic supplies, the announcement that generic certificates would be available beginning February 22 came as welcome news to cotton producers across the Cotton Belt.

The alternative was shaping up to be some one million bales of cotton forfeited to the Commodity Credit Corporation. The reason for the potential forfeitures was producers no longer able to market the crop with the Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP) or marketing loan gains (MLG) to bridge the gap between the loan value of the cotton and significantly lower world market prices.

CDL Training Course Is Set At CCC

The Commercial Driver's License Training Program at CCC can put students on the road to success. With as little as ten weeks of training, students could be earning \$25,000 a year in a job they can be proud of.

This ten-week course is held Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The first two weeks of the course provide instruction in career development, job-seeking, work skills, and applications to the motor transportation industry. The second two weeks provide classroom instruction in commercial truck driving. The remainder of the class involves continuing classroom training and substantial supervised driving experience.

CDL training courses are scheduled to begin in March, May, June, July and September. Register early to ensure a slot in the class. For more information, please contact the Workforce Training Center at 763-3155.

The cotton marketing loan program provides the mechanism, primarily the LDP and MLG, that keeps U.S. cotton competitive on the world market. Current farm legislation, however, caps the amount of benefit a producer can receive through this mechanism and effectively limits the producer's ability to compete in the international market place. Cotton subsidies provided by other countries typically keep world market prices significantly lower than U.S. growers can stand.

The availability of generic certificates will make a significant number of bales accessible to the market immediately and solve two pressing problems.

The first thing it does is keep the CCC from having to take control of loan cotton and then try to market that cotton on its own. Secondly, by allowing the cotton to go ahead and move to market, certificates will prevent the government from having to market cotton at the same time producers are trying to sell their 2000 crops.

Generic certificates will help reduce burdensome stocks for accumulating and also help producers realize a minimum level of price support on all of their production without having to forfeit cotton to the government.

The Secretary of Agriculture's decision to allow CCC loan redemptions with certificates conforms with 14 years of precedent and brings to light the important role certificates play in keeping commodities in the private sector and out of government stockpiles.

Roland Bailey Dies In Calif.

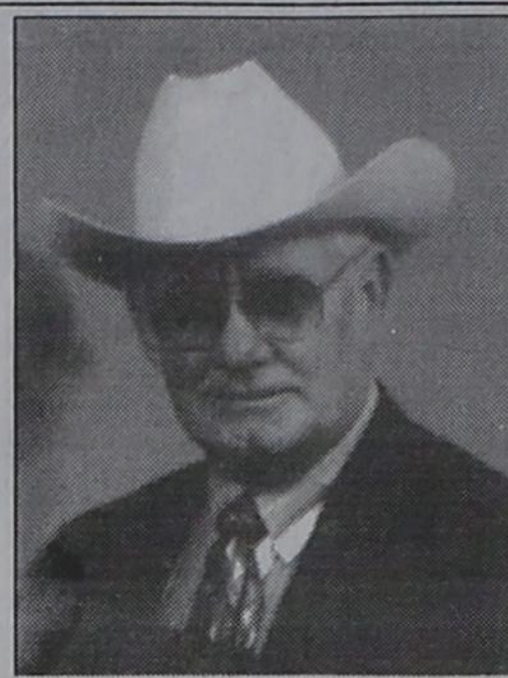
Funeral services were held for Roland Bailey of San Bernardino, California, on Tuesday, February 22 at 3 p.m. in California. He died at his home.
