If you drive by the First Baptist Church, and look at the new playground area, you will be looking at Ken and Terri Sorley's love gift to their daughter Sydney.

Sydney is the youngest of the three Sorley daughters. She was diagnosed with leukemia at the age of two. Now at the age of four, and after many days and weeks of treatment, Sydney is in remission.

She has spent her share of time in the hospital and has made regular trips to the Hodges Cancer Center in Lubbock. Her last regular weekly visit is scheduled for November 15, her fifth birthday.

Terri Sorley was born in Clovis on December 17, 1959. She graduated from high school in Clovis in 1978. Her parents, Pat and Judy Hill, are now retired railroad workers.

Ken Sorley was born in Bovina on January 13, 1958. He attended Bovina schools and graduated from Bovina High School in 1976, where he was active in all sports.

Ken and Terri were married in Clovis on November 5, 1978. They have three daughters; Sara (13), Jill (10) and Sydney (4).

After a brief stint working for the railroad, and tired of being gone all the time, Ken began farming. Today, he farms 2400 acres with two full-time farm hands. They raise corn, cotton, wheat, and sugar beets.

His parents are Mr. and Mrs. Grady Sorley of Bovina. Grady Sorley retired from farming in 1992. He is the longtime music director at First Baptist Church.

Ken and Terri spent more than a year in the planning and construction of the playground. Ken Sorley and

Al Kerby, Jr. did most of the work themselves, including fencing the playground and assembling the equipment.

The concrete curbing was donated and poured by Galen Hromas. Ken also mentioned the assistance from Wes Cockerham and other families at First Baptist.

They searched the country for the various parts of the playground equipment, ordering from as far away as Minneapolis, and assembling the parts themselves. Ken said they could have ordered a complete set of the equipment from one place that would have cost over \$25,000 to purchase and assemble.

As it was, with the raw material and "free" labor, the cost was about one-fourth of the assembled price.

Ken and Terri are already planning to add swing sets and a sprinkler system to the playground area. And then new grass will be planted over the area.

One concern now is that area neighborhood children are "tearing up" some of the equipment. Children are welcome to play, according to Ken. If you are a parent whose children use the playground during the week, make sure that they are instructed in how to care for other's property.

When we asked if they had any hobbies, both Ken and Terri laughed and said they just didn't seem to have time. Terri likes to work in the yard and doesn't want anyone to help. It is her version of therapy and stress reduction.

The house down at the end of Ninth Street is a happy house. And the Sorley's love gift to Sydney at First Baptist will furnish love and happiness for many people for a long time.

And, he is attempting to get the state to clean and/or repair the historical marker, but of course that may take a while.

The property where the memorial is located, the long narrow strip next to the Sands Motel, is actually platted as a city street, even though it has never been, and never will be, used for one. Chief Saddler suspects that sometime in the past, the city may have given the strip of land to the state for location of the marker.

This kick-off meeting will include a discussion of the Booster Club concession at

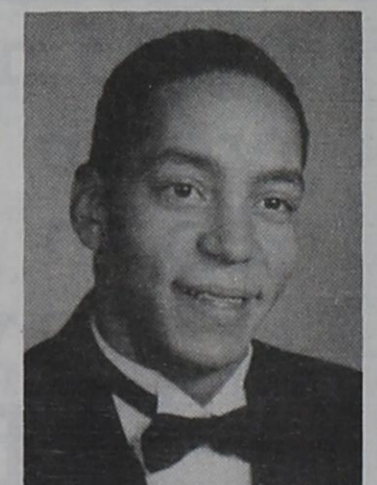
Bull Town Days (a fund-raising event), introduce new coaches and staff, and encourage a membership drive.

Police Activity Report

On Thursday, July 20, Chief Leon Saddler was called to assist State Troopers in an arrest approximately 2 miles west of Bovina. The car, containing one white male, two white females, and 2 children about 3 to 4 years old, was stopped for speeding.

A "consent to search" of the vehicle turned up an estimated two ounces of cocaine, found in a boot in the trunk. The male and one female were detained, arrested, and jailed in Farwell.

In a July 21 traffic stop, Officer Manuel Torres arrested a 31-year-old white male from Dumas for felony possession of a firearm. The suspect was arrested for weaving back and forth in traffic at more than 60-miles-per-hour. Convicted felons are not allowed to carry firearms.

On July 23, Officer Torres arrested a 32-year-old white male, also from Dumas, in a traffic stop for driving with a suspended license. He was jailed.

O.M. Hammonds, a Bovina businessman for the past 25 years, will move soon from the city that has been his home for the past 38 years. Ill health of a son was the reason for the move.

F.W. Ayres, 77, died Saturday morning at 5 a.m. in Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona. He was a victim of a heart attack. Mr. Ayres moved to the Bovina area in 1916 and had lived here since that time.

30 YRS AGO--AUG 4, 1965

Six steers, weighing almost 1000 pounds each, have been slaughtered for Bovina's Bull Town Days barbecue.

A Neighborhood Watch sign was taken from a pole at Ridgelea.

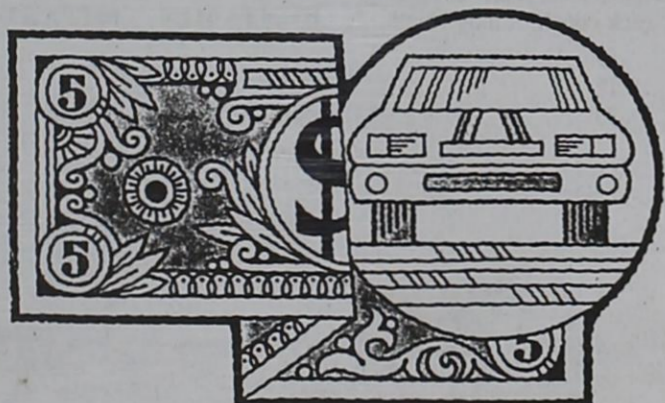
5 YRS AGO--AUG 4, 1990

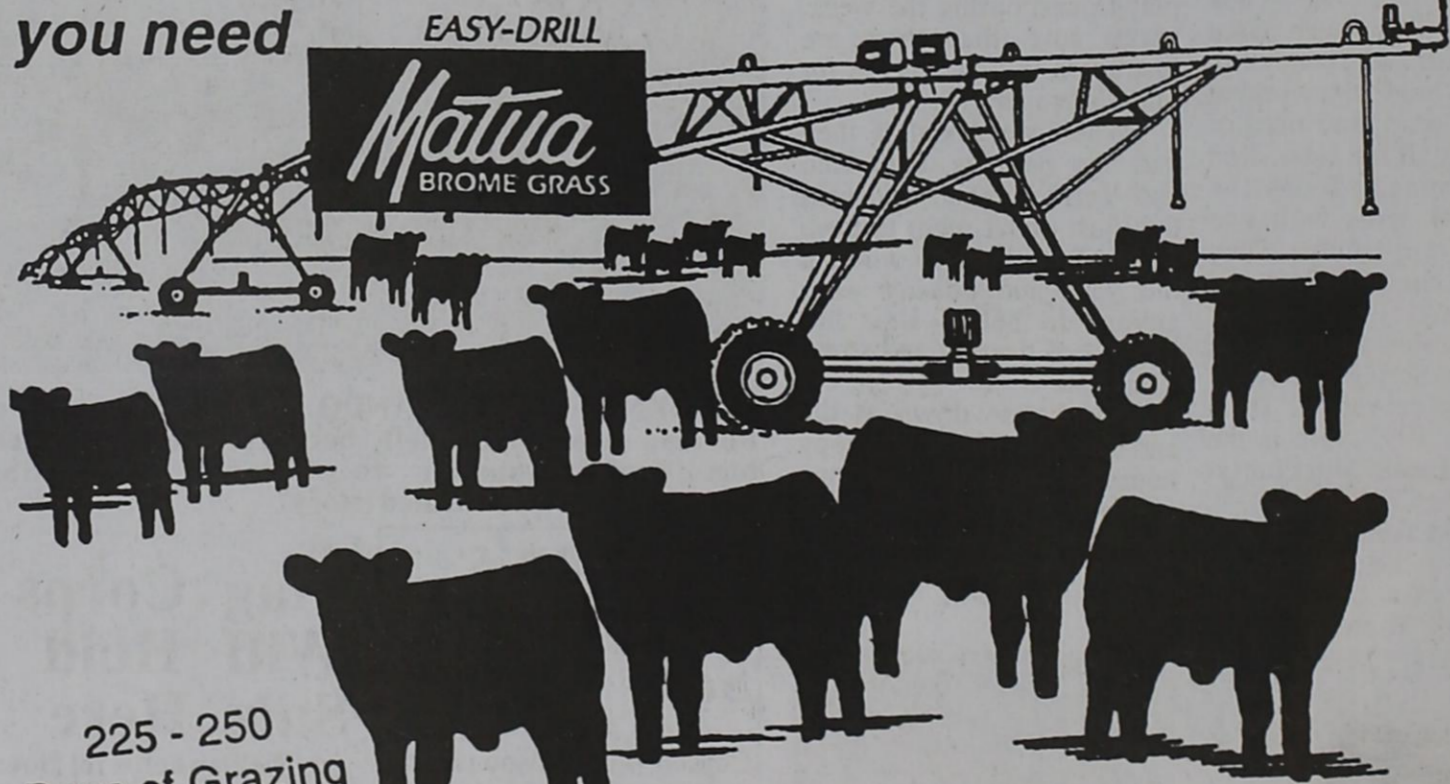

Commission staff will also be inspecting for symptoms of Veicular Stomatitis in all livestock.

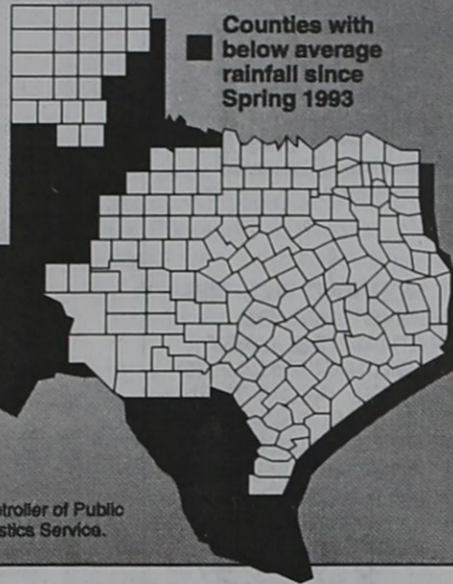

Here is a brief conversation between my wife and I the other day:

"Did you say something, Honey?"

"No, I was just killing another fly".

"Do you talk to flies when you kill them?"

"Sure. Doesn't everybody?"

Well, she had me again because I do talk to flies. After I thought about it, I realized that actually I say some pretty mean things to flies while I am stalking them for the kill.

Then, if I am lucky enough to kill one, I even talk to it afterwards. "Gotcha you little.....!"

Some of the things we say to flies can't be printed in a family newspaper. Come on, admit it. I know you talk to flies.

The flies out here are either

stupid, or very aggressive.

City flies are sissies compared to the flies out here. City flies hide behind the curtains, or land on top of the refrigerator where you can't see them. And they don't buzz much.

Back in the city, it has taken as long as a whole day, just to track down a single city fly. And, of course, I walked around the house calling the fly, like you would call a pet.

"Where are you? Come on out where I can see you. Just light right here on the cabinet you little.....!"

These Friona flies don't hide. They buzz around like stunt pilots and land mostly on a nice flat surface, often two or three at a time. Sometimes they will land right on your face. Must be a fly's version of having fun.

"Hey, let's all land on this guy's face for a second before we head back out to the cattle pens".

Another thing I don't understand about these Parmer County flies. How can they get inside your car or truck when you are driving 55 mph on an FM road? Ever been driving along and all of a sudden there is a fly buzzing around

your windshield?

I think if you ever attended a Parmer County Fly Convention, they would have names like Spike, Buck, Roy Gene, or Big Bubba.

And finally, if you want to kill a fly, get a flyswatter. Wet towels and newspapers don't work as well.

Enough about flies. When I moved out here, my brother, Rick, said it never rains and nothing much ever happens.

We have only lived here two months and there has been a major tornado, Excel blew up, and there has been several inches of rain already.

And rain means MUD. Out here there is dirt and dust, which, when mixed with water, turns to MUD.

MUD is good. When we have MUD, it means that we have had rain. And rain is good for all the farmers and ranchers. Not good for the farmers that need to get into the fields to harvest, but even GOD can't make everybody happy.

My wife Cindy has accepted the dust/MUD. The Pine-Sol Queen of the Panhandle, she recently confided to me that now when someone comes over to visit and the furniture and shelves are dusty, she doesn't worry because they don't seem to notice.

My friend, A J (Easy) Ryder, the best convenience store clerk in America, said he figured that when it rained, his customers drove down muddy roads on purpose so they could drop mud on the store parking lot.

When you are driving on a Farm to Market road after a rain, be careful. Seems the side roads are dirt, which means you can come up on a slick area of mud real quick.

My kids got their shoes muddy and my wife and I didn't even care. In fact, they look cute in muddy shoes and big grins. We pitched them under the car port until they dry. The shoes, not the kids. No big deal. MUD is good.

My big city briefcases? Sold them in a garage sale. I don't know who bought them but I am sure they will use them for storing old family pictures, or packing to go back to Old Mexico for a visit.

When I arrived in Parmer County, without a job or a place to live, I brought my big-city briefcase. I had carried a briefcase, in Dallas and all over the world, for the last 30 years, so I figured to need it out here. WRONG!

I went on interviews with it and people glanced at it kind of funny-like. After I went to work for the paper I thought I would really need it now. Working for a newspaper, you have to have a briefcase. Right? WRONG!

For several days, I kept waiting for Bill Ellis, YE ED here at the paper, to show up with a briefcase. He never did. Somehow the paper was printed anyway.

Oh well, life is simpler out here. We put our kids in the First Baptist Church Bible School this week even though we are Methodists. Thanks to all the wonderful adults that are working hard to make the Bible School a meaningful experience for all our kids.

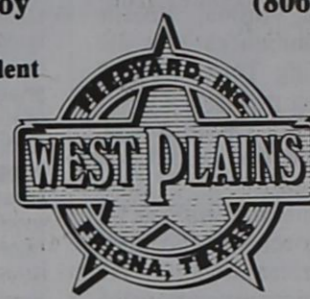
