The fourth annual fair under the auspices of the Brady Fair Association, opened this morning. The day had been set aside as Santa Fe day and a party of officials of that road, headed by Vice President and General Manager F. G. Pettibone, arrived on a special train at 9:30 to assist in making the day one long to be remembered in Brady. The special was met at the Santa Fe depot by a committee of citizens in automobiles accompanied by the Brady Concert band. The party was taken in charge and, headed by the band, proceeded to the Frisco depot to meet a party of Frisco officials, and thence went direct to the fair grounds, where the fair was formally opened and the exercises of the day were taken up. 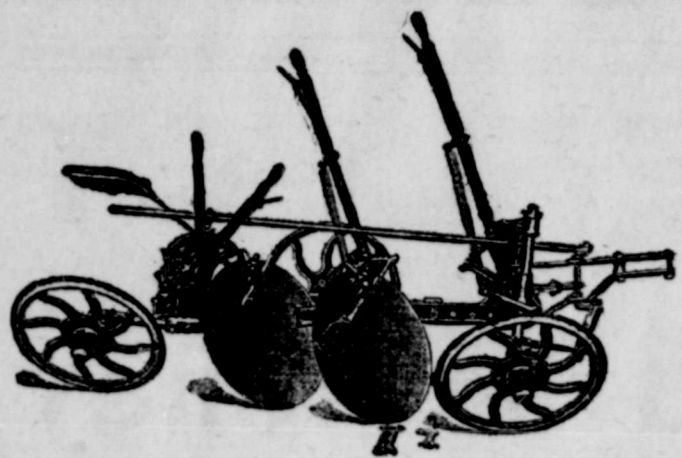

### EX-CONFEDERATE REUNION

BEN McCULLOCH CAMP IS GUEST OF FAIR ASSOCIATION.

The Old Soldiers Are Entertained for a Day With Music, Speeches and a Big Barbecue and Smoker.

The reunion of Ben McCulloch Camp No. 563, U. C. V., was held Monday, the day having been set aside by the Brady Fair Association as Old Soldiers and Old Settlers Day, and it proved a most enjoyable one to those in attendance.

The early morning was rather cool, with every indication of a rainy day, and this, to a great extent, was responsible for the small crowd in attendance, but those who braved the elements were well repaid in the pleasures which the occasion afforded.

At 9:30 the veterans formed in a parade at the hall in the Gibbons building, and, headed by the Brady Concert band, marched to the Dutton park, where the ceremonies of the day took place.
