## Four-Day Celebration

## Kicks Off Thursday

| The Bovina community will roll out a giant red carpet this week for an estimated crowd of at least 2500 during the 13th Annual Bull Town Days Celebration scheduled Thursday through Sunday. <br> Highlight of the four-day event is expected to be the barbecue Friday at 5 p.m. on Bovina's Main Street block when some 2,000 hungry Bull Towners will feast on barbecued beef, pinto beans and locally grown cantaloupe and onion slices. $++++$ <br> Kicking off the annual celebration will be the Bull Town Days Queen riding competition at 4 p.m. tomorrow (Thursday) at the Roping Club Arena on the eastern edge of the city limits, easily within walking distance of the downtown block. <br> Four contestants will vie for the 1976 Bull Town Days Queen title this year. The girls will be judged on horsemanship, personality and appearance. <br> The Bovina Jaycees-sponsored slow-pitch softball tournament will begin at 6 p.m. tomorrow at the ball park here with some 19 teams expected to vie for first, second and third place trophies, according to Don Lawrence, tournament director. <br> Entered in the tournament, as of press time Tuesday, were five teams from Clovis, two from Hereford, two from Earth, one from Plainview, one from Tucumcari, Hub Aerial Spraying, Bovina Jaycees, Sherley Grain, Agri-Sprayers, Charles Oil and the Farwell Jaycees. <br> Brackets for the tournament were being drawn up Tuesday afternoon and will be posted at the concession stand tomorrow afternoon. <br> The double elimination tournament will continue at $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Catfish Draw Dam Now Official Lake

By LOUNUTTAL A number of 17 -year skeptics in Parmer County had to "eat their words" words" recently following an over-five-inch rainfall in the area. A full lake of water is impounded behind the Catfish Draw Dam, Site northwest of Bovina. And, that's not all. The 36-Inch diameter drain pipe was running hall full the day following the soll-soaking downpour. The Catfish Dill project, is one Draw Dam, a $\$ 156,000$ three flood oontrol dams, in in the Running Water Draw Watershed Running Water Draw Watershe Project which began in 1959.

The project covers 227,782 acres in
five countles - Curry County in New Mexico and Parmer, $\begin{aligned} & \text { Pastro, } \\ & \text { Pwisher and Hale countle }\end{aligned}$ County in New Swisher and Hale counties in Texas.
Two of the six dam sites are in Parmer County. Following the August $2-3$ rainfall, the No. 1 dam site, in Curry
County, had also impounded several County, had also impounded several
feet of water which covered a
number of number of acres. Groundbreaking ceremonies for

held in November 1973 with actural hork completed in Aprill 1974. covers some 18,714 acres, the Drainage area for the dam here
covers some 18,714 arces, the
emergency spillway is 400 feet wide,
the dam is 23 feet high and 3,900 feet
long, the surface area at top of the long, the surface area at top of the
principal spillway is 130 acres and
the the water storage is 793 acre feet.
"Since this is the first time the dam has collected any water since it was completed, this will be our first opportunity to collect data on the
dam," Herb Evans, Parmer County Soil Conservation Service director, said thls week.

## Sprinkler Systems

## Pose Serious Problem

A potentlally dangerous situation,
involving irrigation
sprinkler linvoiving irrigation sprinkler
systems, has been brought to the
sttention Commissioners Court, according to County Judge Paul Fortenberry. "It has been brought to our
attention that sprinkler systems are creating a very real, dangerous hazard when they discharge water on county roads, causing the road to
become extremely muddy and slick become extremely muddy and slick,
resulting in the loss of control of a vehicle when a person enters the
watered part of watered part of the road unaware
that it is wet," said Judge Fortenberry. "This is especially
dangerous at night, dangerous at night, as the we
portion cannot be seen and the
driver can not slow his speed before road," County Attorney Johnny Atckinson has informed the Comowning and Court that any perso owning and operating the sprinkle
system would be llable for damage system would be llable for damages
or injuries resulting from accident caused by that particula situation.
"Those operating sprinkler sprinkler
systems that discharge water upon county roads should be aware of this possible liability and take steps
necessary to insure the system does not discharge upon county roads,"
Judge Fortenberry stated.
