Show at Robert Lee This Year—Everything In Readiness.. Largest Number of Exhibits in Show's History. Large Number of Boys Will Go to Fort Worth to the Exposition and Fat Stock Show

The stage is set! And with favorable weather, and no other hindering causes intervening, the Sixth Annual Coke County FFA and 4-H Club Livestock Show bids fair to be one of the best—if not the best—shows of all former years.

The Coke County Livestock Show is what its name implies. It is a county-wide show. Its exhibitors are the FFA boys of the Bronte and Robert Lee schools and the 4-H club boys of Coke county. It meets alternately in its annual exhibits at Bronte and Robert Lee. Last year the show was held in Bronte—that gives Robert Lee the show this year. It is one county institution that has the solid backing of the people of Robert Lee and Bronte and of all the sections of the county. Bronte is as much interested in the show this year, though it is to be staged at Robert Lee, as if the event was to be held in Bronte.

The Coke County Livestock Association, a county-wide association of the stockmen and

farmers of the county, sponsors the show and aids in financing and in its management.

The superintendents of the Bronte and Robert Lee schools have general oversight of the show as to its generalities. The superintendents of the schools at this time are B. F. Kirk, Bronte and George Taylor, Robert Lee.

The supervising of the show in its details is under the direction of the FFA teachers of the Bronte and Robert Lee schools and the County Agriculture Agent of Coke County, who directs the 4-H club boys' part in the show. These gentlemen at this time are H. B. Edmondson, FFA teacher of the Bronte schools, and D. B. Collinsworth, FFA teacher of the Robert Lee schools. Travis B. Hicks is the County Agriculture Agent and directs as to the 4-H club boys of the county.

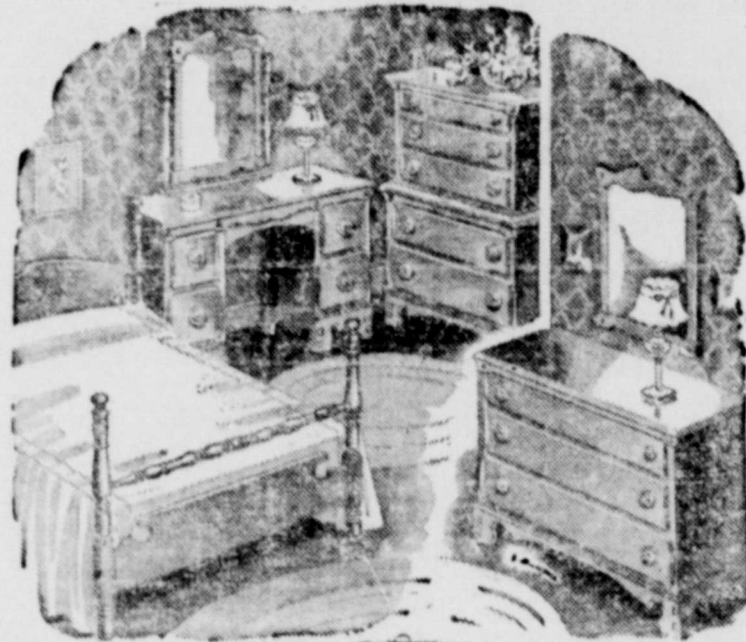
NOTICE

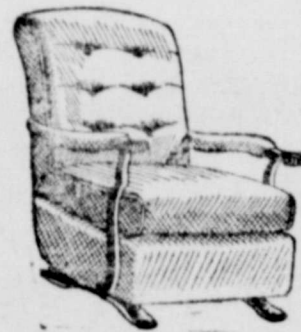

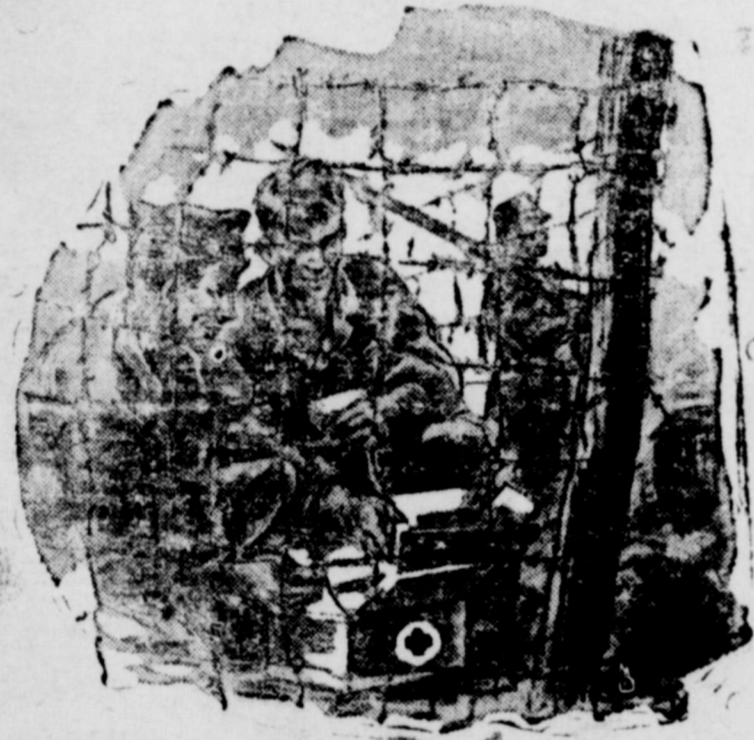

S. SGT. RALPH J. SCOTT AWARDED MEDAL FOR HEROIC RESCUE AT CHINA AIR FIELD

S. Sgt. Ralph J. Scott of Kilgore has been awarded the Soldier's Medal for service with the U. S. 14th Air Force in China, the War Department announced today.

While the announcement from Washington gave no details of the action for which S. Sgt. Scott was decorated, it was assumed that the Soldier's Medal, which is awarded for heroism not in combat with the enemy, was given for his part in saving his captain from a burning plane in a crash landing at the field where he is stationed.

A dispatch sent from the 14th Air Force headquarters last October described how Scott, with two other enlisted men, saw Capt. John M. Morrison's fighter plane come in for a landing at a field of the forward echelon of the 14th Air Force and crash

in flames. The three enlisted men raced for the plane and dragged the captain out of the cockpit to safety.

Asked later why he went out Scott said with a laugh, "I was after the knife in the jungle kit."

Son of Mrs. Leon Whaley of 707 Crim, Scott attended Kilgore High School and the College of Marshall before enlisting in the Air Force. He was trained as a mechanic at Boston, Mass., and at March Field, Calif. He has been overseas more than two years, serving in Australia, India, and China.

He has two sisters, Miss Maurine Scott, who teaches in Kilgore High School, and Miss Billie Ruth Scott. A brother, James L. Scott, is also in service.—Kilgore News Herald.
