### Bronte Gins First 1945 Bale of Cotton, August 28

Elmer Hudman was the "prize winner" on the first bale of cotton to be ginned in Bronte for the season of 1945.

The bale was ginned Tuesday, August 28, by the Farmers Marketing gin. The bale weighed 500 pounds and was ginned from 1800 pounds of seed cotton. The Farmers gin bought the bale paying 21 cents a pound for it, making the lint to bring Mr. Hudman \$105. The gin also bought the seed for \$18.62. The business men of the town gave Mr. Hudman \$14.25 as a first bale premium. Hence, Mr. Hudman got the neat sum of \$137.87 for his first bale of cotton for 1945.

The "first bale" was eleven days later this year than for 1944, which was ginned August 16 last year.

Mrs. Westbrook died at the home of a daughter in Sonora, Tuesday, August 21, from a heart attack, following an illness of some two or three weeks during which time she was in a San Angelo hospital. She had improved sufficient to be carried to her daughter's home. Funeral services were delayed, pending the arrival of a son, J. C., in the Navy and stationed in Florida.
