**HERE 'N THERE . . .**

The Colorado City Council has listed a number of fine aims for their city during 1947, as well as calling a city election for April 1, according to last week's issue of the Colorado Record. Among projects endorsed are the following: Employment of a full-time traffic officer, extension of sewer lines, completion of Mitchell County portion of Robert Lee road; garage pickup, repairing of pavement, a clean-up program, increase in water supply, opening of more streets and alleys, more extensive sanitary and health conditions, more adequate fire protection equipment, further development of water supply, and a municipal airport.

The Mitchell County News, edited by J. W. King, Sr., carries a column by himself every week, entitled "On the Beam." In his issue last week, Mr. King had the following to say, and we quote —

While reading this paper, and it is a splendid paper, well edited and well printed, we got to wondering about the whys and wherefores. It seems to us that a town that will permit a paper to carry its name would be ashamed of the

fact that it has to depend upon other towns for its support."

"We will have to hand it to our merchants. We are sure they would not want The News to depend upon advertising from other towns for its support. There are some merchants in Loraine who do not support the paper very well, some occasionally, and some not at all, but we suppose every town has that class of merchant in it. We are proud of the support our merchants give us. But suppose all the business establishments in Loraine really supported the paper through advertising. We could expand our services and publish a much better paper than is possible now."

"Perhaps you don't know it but it costs a lot of money to run a paper and maintain it in good order. How a town can expect to keep a paper and not support it is more than we can reason out."

"You can take our word for it, the town we are speaking of, unless a radical change is made, will never amount to much as a trading center. The local merchants are letting merchants in neighboring towns solicit the business of their own neighbors and friends, and if we were a betting man we'd wager this town does not have nearly as many people shopping in it as does Loraine or any other town where the merchants advertise in their home town paper."
