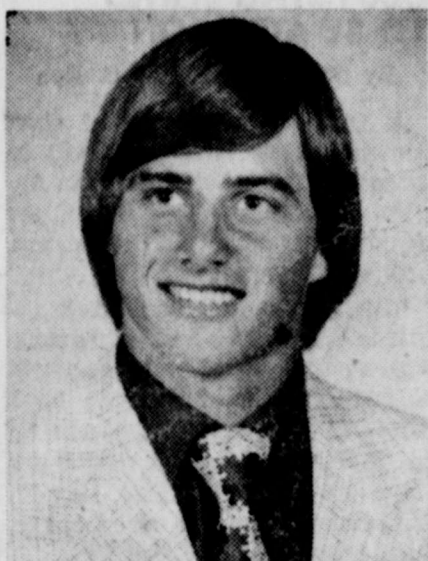

## Caperton, Coulter Top Students of Sr. Class

Kim Caperton has been named valedictorian of the 1976 graduating class of Bronte High School. She accumulated a four year average of 93.679 and is the daughter

of Mr. and Mrs. R. T. Caperton.

Nelson Coulter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Grady Coulter, is salutatorian for this year's senior class. His average of 93.590 was just .089 of a point less than that of Miss Caperton's.

Coulter and Miss Caperton will both be honored at the senior commencement program Friday, May 21.

### BRONTE STUDENTS PLACE IN HIGH SPOTS AT STATE UIL MEET

Students of Bronte High School took three of the top four spots in the Class B UIL Science Division at the State Meet held in Austin last Saturday. Local students also took third place in shorthand and fourth place in number sense.

In the science placing, Bobby Hamilton took first place at the state-wide meet; John Heaner took third place; and Billy Hamilton was placed in the fourth spot.

In the shorthand contest, Kim Caperton came through with a third place win.

Bobby Hamilton was rated as fourth place winner in the number sense contest.

The only other Bronte entrants at the state meet were Jamie Raughton and Sherrie Coalson. They were entered in tennis doubles and advanced to the semi-finals before losing.

The two downed Fort Davis 3-6, 7-6, 7-5 to set up their semi-finals with Nueces Canyon. They dropped 3-6, 7-5, 5-7 decision to the team that eventually captured the state title.

Coalson and Raughton are both seniors in Bronte High School.

### LITTLE LEAGUE TO SELL LIGHT BULBS

### DR. LEE NAMED AS CONSULTING DOCTOR FOR NURSING HOME

Dr. Yung Kee Lee, M. D., of Winters, has accepted the position as consulting physician during the absence of Dr. Robert Baldwin, who has been attending the patients at Bronte Nursing Home since the death of Dr. John R. Harris.

Dr. Baldwin is taking an indefinite leave of absence.

North Runnels Hospital at Winters and Bronte Nursing Home have entered into a transfer agreement to transfer patients from the Bronte Nursing Home to the hospital in Winters when acute health care becomes necessary. Lab work for the nursing home will be performed at the hospital also.

The temporary arrangements have been made until such time as a physician can be obtained either at Bronte or Robert Lee on a full time basis.

L. O. Clark, administrator, felt that this arrangement was necessary in order that patients be attended daily when admitted to the hospital and not on a part time basis. This arrangement was also necessary in order for Bronte Nursing Home to remain in compliance with the licensure agencies and with the State Department of Welfare.

These arrangements have not been made previously because of the probability of a physician being obtained in Bronte. They had to be made at this time due to Dr. Baldwin's leaving, Clark said.

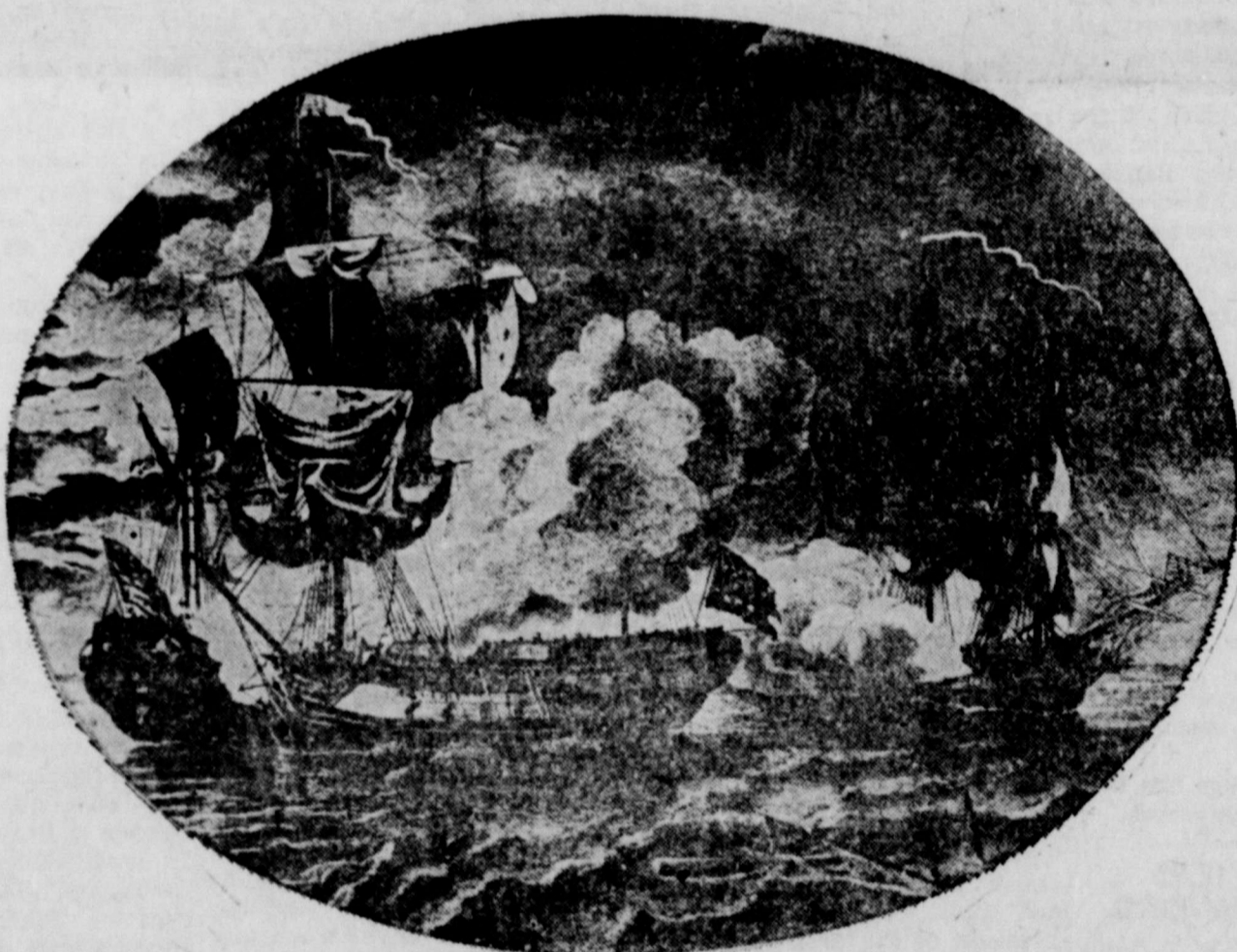

**COKE COUNTY HAS SREWWORM CASE**

Coke County is now on the list of Texas counties with confirmed screwworm cases. A case was found in a baby calf on the Nolan-Coke County line near Blackwell. The sample was collected on May 1. Hopefully, no additional cases have been found in the area.

The screwworm control officials are fearful of having another bad year in 1976. The mild winter in South and Central Texas in combination with timely rains and ear tick infestations have substantiated their fears to date.

All operators are encouraged to submit worm samples for positive identification. This is the major means of locating infestations and for determining sterile fly placements.

Also, spraying of livestock with system sprays, checking animals at regular intervals and delaying surgery where possible can be helpful to the overall program.

Whether or not inventory is included depends on the wording which was used on the Fire Policy. A Fire Policy covers one of three broad categories. These categories are: (1) stock, (2) furniture, fixtures and/or machinery, and (3) contents. Stock is defined as all stocks of merchandise, including packaging materials. Furniture, fixtures and/or machinery include all contents not included as the building or stock. Contents includes all property included in the definition of stock and furniture, fixtures and/or machinery. There, if the policy reads "stock" or "contents" the inventory would be covered in case of fire... "contents" being the most comprehensive coverage and the one most frequently used with Fire Policies.

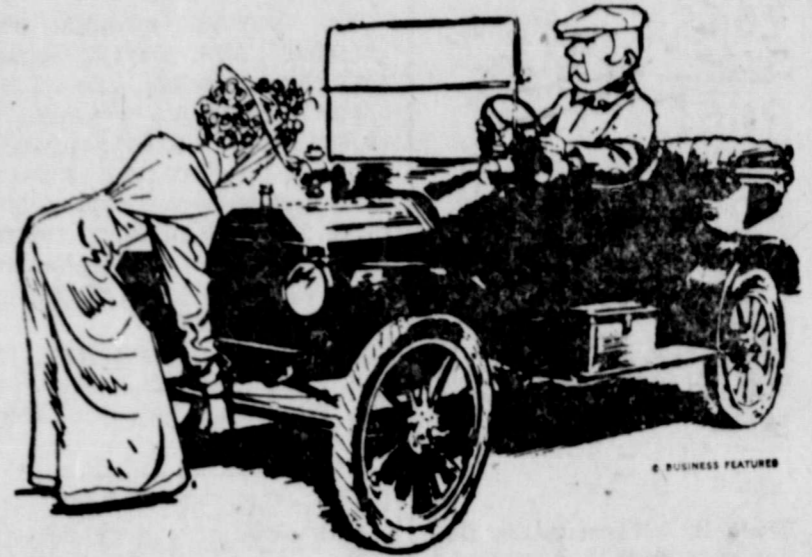
