This will give you notice that the act anthorizing the forfeiture 1881 ath crs which may bave to be forfeitd from time to time, will not take effect until ninety days after the adjournment of the legislature. This will give sll parties who de sire to put their schoot land ac-
counts in good standing ample necessity requiring the suspenI way up their interest.

Besides it will help many me Below I publish the law in full ANDREW J. BAKER, Commissioner
Be it enacted by the legislature of the State of Texas.
Section 1. That if npon the 1 e portion of the interest due by any person to the state of Texas for lands heretofore sold by the state of Texas, whether said lands be a part of the public domain be shall have beeu heretofore set part for the poblic schools, univer ity or any of the other various stitntions, has not been paid, it hall be the duty of the land comaissioner to endorse on the obli
gation of said lands. 'L gation of said lands. 'Land for hat effect to be canse an entry ount kept with such purchase and thereupon said lands shall chereby be forfeited to the state without the necessity of re-entry or judielal ascertainment and shall whiek it originally belouged and be sold uuter the provisions tha existing laws, or of ay future law: provided, the purcha er said land shall have the ri, ht any time within six months after such eudorsement of "lands for feited" to iustitute a suit in the district conrt of Travis county of the general land office for the purpose of contesting such forfu: purpose of contesting such forfe:t ore and setting aside the same ay on the ground :hat the facts did ares; but if no sach suit has bee instituted as above provided such forfeitures of the commis sioner of the general land offle shalltion become final and concusive; provided that if any pur chaser shall die or shall have died his heirs or legal representatives
shall have one year in which to shall have one year in which to ove payment after the :st day of his act is cumniative is net ended to deay the state the righ o institute any legad proceedings that may be teemed necessary secure the purchase money possession of the land so soid. picable to all putended hereto ore made under any or all of the rations acts of the legislature under which ian I may have been sold by the state.
Section. 2 The fact that anthor ity of the land commssioner to thake forfeiture of land without judicial ascertainment has been
questioned, and the fact there are now more than $\mathbf{1 0 , 0 0 0}$ purchases which ca: De forfeited under the law of nonpayment of the interest due thereon, and the further fact that it is aimost impossible and certainly impracticable to ineti-
tute so many differant suits a. mainat so many differant purchas. ers, creates an imperitive pablie
sion of the constitutional rule pro viding that bills be fead on three hereby suspended.
