To the Sheriff or any Constable of Coke County — GREETING, Affidavit having been made as required by law, you are hereby commanded that by making Publication of this Citation in some newspaper published in the County of Coke, if there be a newspaper published in said County, (but if not, then in the nearest County where a newspaper is published,) for eight weeks previous to the return day hereof, you Summon Alfred Dorsey and the unknown heirs of Alfred Dorsey whose residence is unknown, to be and appear before the Hon. District Court at the next regular term thereof to be held in the County of Coke at the Court House thereof in town of Robert Lee on the third Monday in Feb. 1904, same being the 15th day of said month file number being 358 then and there to answer the petition of W. C. McDonald, filed in said Court on the 7th day of December A.D. 1903 against the said Alfred Dorsey and the unknown heirs of Alfred Dorsey and alleging in substance as follows to-wit.

That heretofore on the first day of November 1903 plaintiff was lawfully seized and possessed of the tract of land heretofore described situated in the County of Coke and State of Tex., holding the same in fee simple, that on the day and year last aforesaid defendants entered upon said premises and ejected plaintiff therefrom, and unlawfully withheld from plaintiff the possession thereof, to his damage one thousand dollars; that the premises so entered upon and unlawfully withheld by defendant from plaintiff were bounded as follows;

being seven hundred and thirty eight acres, the West half of survey No. 474, known as the Alfred Dorsey survey, abstract No. 85 certificate No. 271, situated in Coke County, State of Texas. Plaintiff says that he claiming said and under a deed dated Oct. 31 1898, executed to him by Jonathan Miles, said deed duly registered in Coke Co. Tex. where said land is situated, has had peaceable and adverse possession of said west half of said Alfred Dorsey survey No. 474 abstract No. 85, certificate No. 271 said West half containing 738 acres cultivating and using and enjoying the same and paying all taxes due thereon, for a period of more than five years next before the first day of November 1903 and before the filing of this suit, and is now claiming said land by reason thereof asserting title thereto under and by virtue of the five years Statute of Limitation.

that on final hearing he have judgment for the restitution of the above described premises, for his damages and costs of suit and for a decree quieting plaintiff in his title and possessing and for such other relief as he may entitled to.
