## HOUSE BILL NO. 157

SECTION 1 Any person who is the driver of any truck, utomblite or other vehicle containing any livestock or domestic fowl which is upon or being driven upon any land of which said driver is not owner, lessee, renter or tenant, or which is upon or baing driven upon any highway, public street or thoroughiare, who fails to have in his pos session and exhibit, to any person or peace officer $u$ on domand a writien permit authorizing said movement, signed by the ownor or carecaker of said livestock or domostic fowl or from the owner or any person in control of the land from which said driver began said move. ment shall be fined not less than $\$ 25.00$ nor more than $\$ 200.00$ for each head of live stock and each domestic fow in said movement, unless said said driver upon demand ny person or pence offic
nakes signs and deivers z aid person or peace officer written statement containing the information hersin required to be incuded in permits. said driver shall be nore than 200.00 for each head of livestock and ench domostic fowl in said move all the following information Name of place origin including name of ranch, or other place point of destination includin name of ranch, market center number of livestock or fow with description thereof in cluding king, breed, color and also marks and brands if ther fusal of such driver to exh bit aid permit or to make said statement, shall constitute probablecsuse for any peace officer to search said trucis or vehicle to ascertain if it contains any siolen livestock atolen domestic fow a reasonable length of time to livestock or stolen fowl are contained therein.
Any driver who has in hi possession any false or forged permit or who makes fals written statement shall b
fined not less than 200,00 no more than $\$ 500.00$ or he shal be imprisoned in the county jail not less sixty (60) days no more than six (6) months, or he shall be punished by bot. uch fine and imprisonmen It is further provided that a provisions of this act shall ap
