He makes tre me percentage reduction in his 1934 cotton crop as his neighbor who still plants nearly the whole farm to cotton, but be will receive only balf as much in the way of a government cotton benefis check.

In many such instances it works out the diversifield farm. er may sign a correhog contract to reduce corn acreage or bog production or both, and receive Government benefit checks that will total just as much or even more than these received by the ail cotton farmer. In addition the diversifield farmer is in a much better position than the a 1-cotton farmer to use the extra feed which the farm can grow under the terms of the cotton and corn-hog contracts.

The corn-box contract is open to every farmer in the county who produces a surplus of either corn or hogs and who can other wise quality, the county agent points out. The rush of cotton campaign makes a farm-to-farm canvass of farmers in the interest of the corn-hog program an impossibility, but men who may te eligible to sign these contracts should investigate the plan, he SDKRESIS.

The County Committee will be in the county agents office Saturday and would like to interyiew those producers who might be interested in signing up in the Corn- Hog reduction pro-

The plan well be explained and individual problems will be taken up with the producers. Should you not be able to come up Saturday, it is suggested that you get in touch with the county agent as soon as possible.

Pecan Church Dedicated

The new building of the Pecan Baptist Church was dedicated Sunday, February 18, in an all day service.


