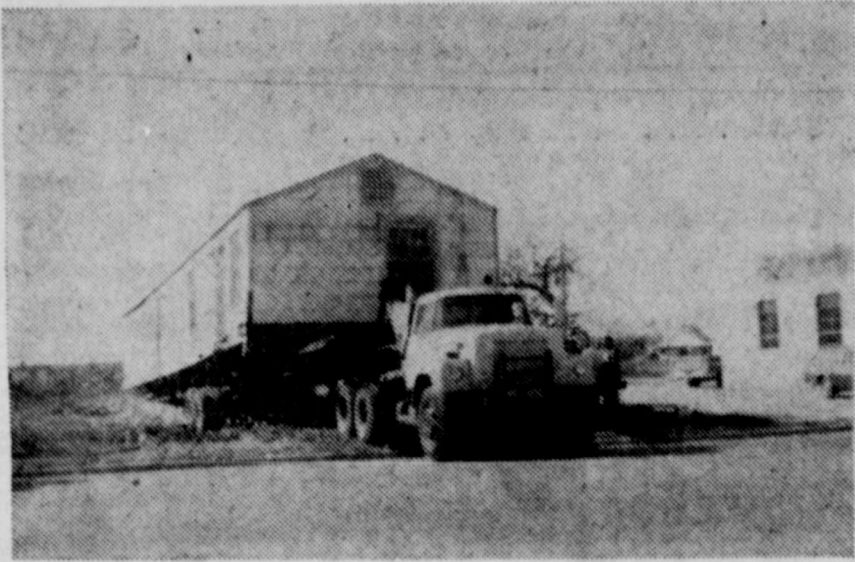

Jim Ned Takes Robert Lee Meet

The Jim Ned Indians won first place honors at the Robert Lee Relays last Saturday with 129½ points, while Wall came in second with 122. Bronte finished third with 90 and Robert Lee was fourth with 46½ points.

Robert Dierschke of Wall and Jim Dan Raughton of Bronte took top individual honors, with two wins each.

Dierschke led the 220 yard dash with a 24.1 and then threw the shot 52-8¼. Raughton swept the hurdles events, taking the 120 highs in 15.9 seconds and running the 330 intermediates in 45.2.

Thursday Services For Mrs. Payne

Mrs. W. A. (Mary Etta) Payne, 86, died Tuesday, March 18, at 8:15 p.m. at West Coke County Hospital following a long illness.

Funeral services will be held today (Thursday) at 3 p.m. in the First United Methodist Church of Robert Lee, with the Rev. A. A. Kendall, pastor, officiating. Burial will follow in the Robert Lee Cemetery under the direction of Newby Funeral Home.

Mary Etta Clawson, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Wilson Lee (Tennie McDonald) Clawson, was born Dec. 22, 1888, in Delta County. She came with her parents to Coke County in 1889 to the Edith area where they lived for awhile before moving to Robert Lee. Later her father bought a farm in the Friendship community five miles west of Robert Lee and she lived there until her marriage.

She was married to William A. Payne April 2, 1911, in Robert Lee by the Rev. W. K. Simpson, who was pastor of the Robert Lee Methodist Church where Mrs. Payne was a member. They made their home at Sanco until 1914 when they bought and moved to a farm between Robert Lee and Bronte. At the time of her death Mrs. Payne was a resident of Robert Lee. Mr. Payne died June 13, 1960, and a son, Morris Payne, also preceded her in death.

She is survived by three sons, Alonzo Payne and Loyd Payne, both of Robert Lee and Barney Payne of Fort Worth; two daughters, Mrs. Alta Mae Snyder of Van Horn and Mrs. Irene Reed of Robert Lee; three sisters, Mrs. Ruby Rabb of Robert Lee, Mrs. Betty Payne of Slaton and Mrs. Susie Hester of San Angelo; one brother, Dave Clawson of Lamesa; 11 grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

Donors aged 17 through 65 will be accepted. Everyone who donates blood will receive a six months blood protection for himself and his family.

PARKS, WILDLIFE HEARING SET FOR NEXT WEDNESDAY

Amendment Vote Scheduled April 22

A special election has been called for April 22 when citizens of Texas will vote on two amendments to the state's constitution.

Both amendments are concerned with pay raises for governmental officials of the state.

The first one on the ballot has to do with "revising and consolidating provisions relating to state and local retirement systems and programs and providing for a maximum state contribution to state systems of ten per cent of the aggregate compensation paid to individuals."

No. 2 on the ballot calls for raising salaries of legislators to \$600 per month and setting a per diem pay of \$30 per day during legislative sessions and a mileage allowance at the same rate as provided by law for state employees.

Elections on the amendments will be held in the four commissioner precincts of Coke County.

ELECTION ORDER AND NOTICE
THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF COKE

On this the 7th day of January, 1975, the Board of Trustees of Robert Lee Independent School District convened in regular session, open to the public, with the following members present, to-wit:

- D. J. Walker, Jr., President
- Joe Flowers
- Glen Womack
- Foy Askins
- Bobby Baker
- Wilbern Millican
- J. C. Wallace, Jr.

and the following absent: none, constituting a quorum and among other proceedings had by said Board of Trustees was the following:

WHEREAS, the term of office of D. J. Walker and Foy Askins, members of the Board of Trustees of this School District will expire on the first Saturday in April, 1975, said first Saturday being April 5, 1975, and on said date a trustee election will be held in said School District.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for this Board to pass an order establishing the procedure for filing for and conducting said trustee election:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ROBERT LEE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That an election be held in said School District on April 5, 1975, for the purpose of electing to the Board of Trustees of said School District Two Trustees.

2. That all requests by candidates to have their names placed upon the ballot for the above mentioned election shall be in writing and signed by the candidate and filed with the secretary of the Board of Trustees at the superintendent's office not later than 30 days prior to the date of said election.

All candidates shall file with said application the loyalty affidavit required by Art. 6.02 of the Election Code.

The Secretary of this Board of Trustees shall post on the bulletin board in the building where the Board of Trustees meets the names of all candidates that have filed their applications in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Order, and said Secretary shall otherwise comply with the terms and provisions of Art. 13.32 of the Election Code.

3. That said election shall be held at the following place, and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election:

(a) In election precinct at Robert Lee School Building, in Robert Lee, Texas, in said School District, with Jeffie Roberts as Presiding Judge and Mrs. Freeman Clark and Mrs. Teddy Pitcock, Clerks.

The polls at the above designated polling place shall on election day be open from 8 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

4. Juanita Trimble is hereby appointed Clerk, for absentee voting, and none are hereby appointed Deputy Clerks for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at School Tax Office within the boundaries of the above named School District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State Holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election

Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee Clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent.

6. The manner of holding said election shall be governed, as nearly as may be, by the Election Code of this state, and this Board of Trustees will furnish all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

7. Immediately after the votes have been counted, the officers holding said election shall make and deliver the returns of said election and perform all other duties as provided by the Election Code.

8. The Board of Trustees shall give notice of said election, and this combined Election Order and Notice shall serve as Notice for said election. The President of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and instructed to post or cause to have posted said combined Election Order and Notice at three public places where notices are customarily posted in this school district, and said posting shall be made at least 20 days before the date of said election.

The President shall also cause a copy of this combined Election Order and Notice to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where this school district is located. Said publication shall be not more than 30 days nor less than 10 days before the date of said election.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board located in the central administrative office of this school district, a place convenient to the public, and said notice, having been so posted, remained posted for at least 72 hours preceding the day of this meeting.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary furnished a notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting to the county clerk of Coke County, Texas, the county in which most, if not all, of this school district's pupils reside.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that the same do pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Board voted AYE: Joe Flowers, Glen Womack, Foy Askins, Bobby Baker, Wilbern Millican, J. C. Wallace, Jr.; and the following voted NO: None.

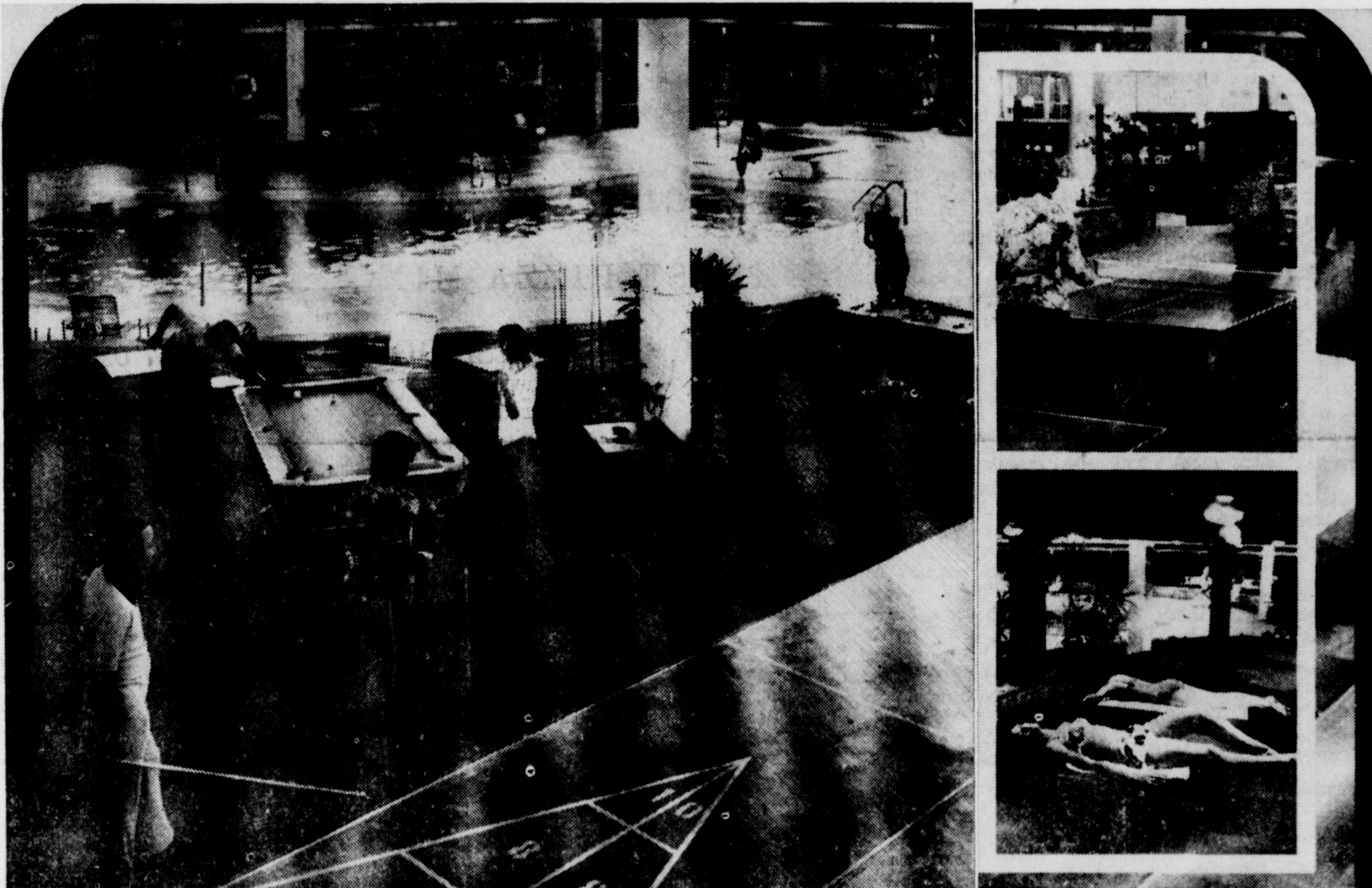
