The first one on the ballot has to do with "revising and consolidating provisions relating to state and local retirement systems and programs and providing for a maximum state contribution to state systems compensation paid to individuals."





The club will conduct the door to door Cancer Crusade and Mrs. Wayne Mashburn will serve as chairman again this year.


