The revolver was picked up Sunday morning by Johnny Rel-ley, a small boy living on Hunt street. He found it between two small houses just back of the Southern Cafe, and brought it to his father, who works as a cook in the cafe, saying:

"Look, daddy, I've found a play pistol." Police headquarters were notified and Deputy Sheriff John-son came over and took posses-sien of the firearm.

A shotgun was also found near the scene of the shooting. It was taken to the office of Judge Ingram, where it is being held as evidence.
