CELERY HAS VERSATILITY



Celery, which housewives usually | moderate oven for about 10 min fix in one or two ways, is to pro-dessional chefs one of the more versatile vegetables. Not only Cler that, but all of the stalk (leaves, trimmings, and outer stems) can be utilized in tasty dishes. Head chef Carl Buckel of St.

Augustine's venerable Ponce de Leon Hotel shows off his culinary art in a galaxy of celery dishes. Appropriately, The Ponce is but a short distance from the Sanford celery area, one of Florida's two hig celery regions. In Chef Buckel's words here are nine of his celery recipes:

Take the trimmings from a stalk of celery and chop finely together with a small onion. Braise with a little water and a table spoon or so of butter. When celery and onion are transparent, sprinkle with a handful of flour and mix well. Cook slowly and cover for 10 minutes. Pour in a pint of white stock and bring to a boil. Cook 15 minutes more. Strain, removing bits of celery and onion. Pour into an equal quantity of milk. Return to heat but do not boil. Season with salt and pepper and a dash of Worcestershire sauce. Add a few of the small stem pieces of celery. Makes about a quart. Cream of Celery Soup




