

Better Broiler Care Is Urged

Factors that influence t h wholesomeness of broilers were discussed recently by East Texas poultry industrymen and county

Ben Wormeli, extension poultry husbandman, reports that four of the many factors discussed were singled out for special emphasis

One of the factors to be pushed is the use of a disposal pit. Such a pit is an important part of any sanitation program, and is also part of a good neighbor policy. The chances of free-flying birds becoming infected by a disease outbreak and carrying it to neigh boring flocks are cut considerably by the use of disposal pits.

Another factor in the select four

proper housing, continues the ecialist. The broiler house should be constructed so that it can pro vide protection against winter wes ther or opened to provide ample ventilation during the warmer

Adequate heat and floor space in the brooder house are also ed. Brooding equipment adequate to supply sufficient heat in the coldest weather, and at least ter the hover for each chick shoul be available. Some means of fur ishing supplemental heat to rais the brooder house temperature without creating a fire hazard

The final factor to receive spec of dry litter. Because of its importance, Wormeli says, poultry-men should always make sure the litter is dry. Wormeli concludes by emphasizng that broilers continuously prond drafts, wet litter and stale air will have the proper environment for developing into healthy and wholesome birds by market time.




