Members of the Armed Forces also pay Federal Income Taxes. They give their name, service serial number and permanent home address on their returns.

Many tax problems can be solved by using the comprehensive instructions that accompany tax re-

turn forms. The IRS office has a special Taxpayers Assistance Day every Monday from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Telephone information is available by calling Abilene, OR 4-9146-7-8.

"Taxpayers whose income was under \$10,000, singly or jointly, may generally use the budget size tax form 1040A," say Pogle.

"Those who itemize deductions

and those with income of \$10,000 or more must use the longer Form 1040. And be sure, if eligible to use the 1040A, that you use the pre-punched card that you receive by mail.

"Most farmers and ranchers in this area owe Uncle Sam self-employment tax for 1960," Pogle said.
