

> Fall garden is a waste of time and effort unless soil is thoroughly prepared. In turning under a growth of weeds or dried vegetablesis where most of us go wrong. By cutting the weeds and throwing them over the fence before plowing is begun you have taken the first step toward a successful garden, The turned under meeds, heat, dry out and prevent cultivation. Soil for fall garden should be very finely pulverized, almost as fine as powder, before seeds are sown, Wet gunny sacks kept over seed beds until plants are up are a great help in very hot weather. By observing a few precautions, it is entirely possible to have a fall garden planted now. This will help make up for the deficiency in summer gardens.




