

Papen's Appointment Indicates Hitler's Game

How Turkey feels about the advent of Franz von Papen as special envoy from Hitler's Reich, we wouldn't know. If we were Turkey, we wouldn't be much pleased.

Von Papen has a long record in public life, and such of it as has been laid bare is not very reassuring to any country to which he is sent. The United States knows from personal experience.

Von Papen was German military attache here when the World War broke. He was, and is, a handsome, cultured, urbane citizen of the world, and his glittering Prussian captain's uniform and gleaming monocle cut quite a swath in Washington society.

Unfortunately it soon became clear that the handsome Franz was not confining himself strictly to his business ast To Ranger, Alameda military attache-at least not as such business had been undertood up to that time. In those innocent days it was assumed that the privileges and immunities granted to diplomatic representatives implied that they would not monkey with the domestic affairs of the country to which they had been sent.

The United States invited Von Papen to return home. His private letters had revealed his real opinion of the people among whom he had cut such a social dash. He referred to them as "these idiotic Yankees."

The information was from the department of commerce, bureau of the census, at Washington, and stated: "A 'notification of birth registration' is not acceptable in filing an application with the U S. Civil Service Commission. It is necessary to transmit with the application form a certified copy of the birth certificate or other

proof of age." Justice of Peace Wood explained that the "notification of birth" portion of the statement means a statement from the vital statistics division of he state department of health that a birth certificate has been filed at Austin.

"Other preof of age" he stated meant a certified copy of a birth certificate or a photostatic copy of a birth certificate.


