The ill-fated seventeen were then furnished paper pen and fnk, and allowed one hour in which to write fare well letters to their loved ones at home. They were then marched out and cruelly shot. Their exccution occurred on March 25 1843, near sundown.

In 1848 the bones of these nurdered heroes were returned te LaGrange and buried on Monument Hill, a beautiful site overooking the Colorado River. A beautiful monument has been crected over their remains. Their ames are carved on this monument, and Captain William Mosby Eastland's heads the list. Un-


