American Warships Take Eolie Isles

BOBDUBI RIDGE COMMANDING ROAD TO SALAMAUA IS TAKEN IN RELENTLESS ALLIED DRIVE

Aug. 20 (Friday) (UP)-Allied ground forces, forging ahead against Japanese troops deprived of air assistance by the crushing raids on the enemy air base at Wewak, have gained control of Bobdubi Ridge at the southwestern approaches of Salamaua, their New Guinea objective, a communique disclosed Friday.

Böbdubi Ridge, a piece of ele rated land in the vicinity of Bob dubi Village, four miles south-west of Salamaua, had been heavily fortified by the Japanese but in recent weeks the entire area has been swept repeatedly by Allied bombers which dumped tons of explosives on the Japan ese trenches and pill boxes.

STRATEGIC ISLANDS CAPTURED AS RUSSIANS ANNOUNCE NEV GAINS NEAR UKRAINE CAPITAL

Capture of the Eolie Islands off the toe of Italy by American warships and new gains in the Kharkov area by the hard-hitting Russian army were revealed today, amid increasing signs that the Allies are planning soon to open a second front in Europe.

The Volcanic Islands lie in the Tyhrrhenian Sea, just north of Sicily, and would be a strategic value to the Allies in any invasion



SUGAR-Stamp No. 13 good for 5 lbs. through August 15. Stamp No. 14, good for 5 lbs., becomes valid August 16 and remains good through October, Stamps Nos. 15 and 16 are good through October 31 for 5 lbs., each for home canning purposes. Housewives may apply to their local ration boards for more if necessary

COFFEE-Ration stamps no longer required. MEAT, etc.—Red Stamps T and U, new valid, expire Acgust 31; V is valid August 8, expires August 31; W is valid August 15, expires August 31.

PROCESSED FOODS-Blue stamps N, P, Q, remain valid though August 7. Blue stamps R. S. T, became valid August and will be good through September 20.
