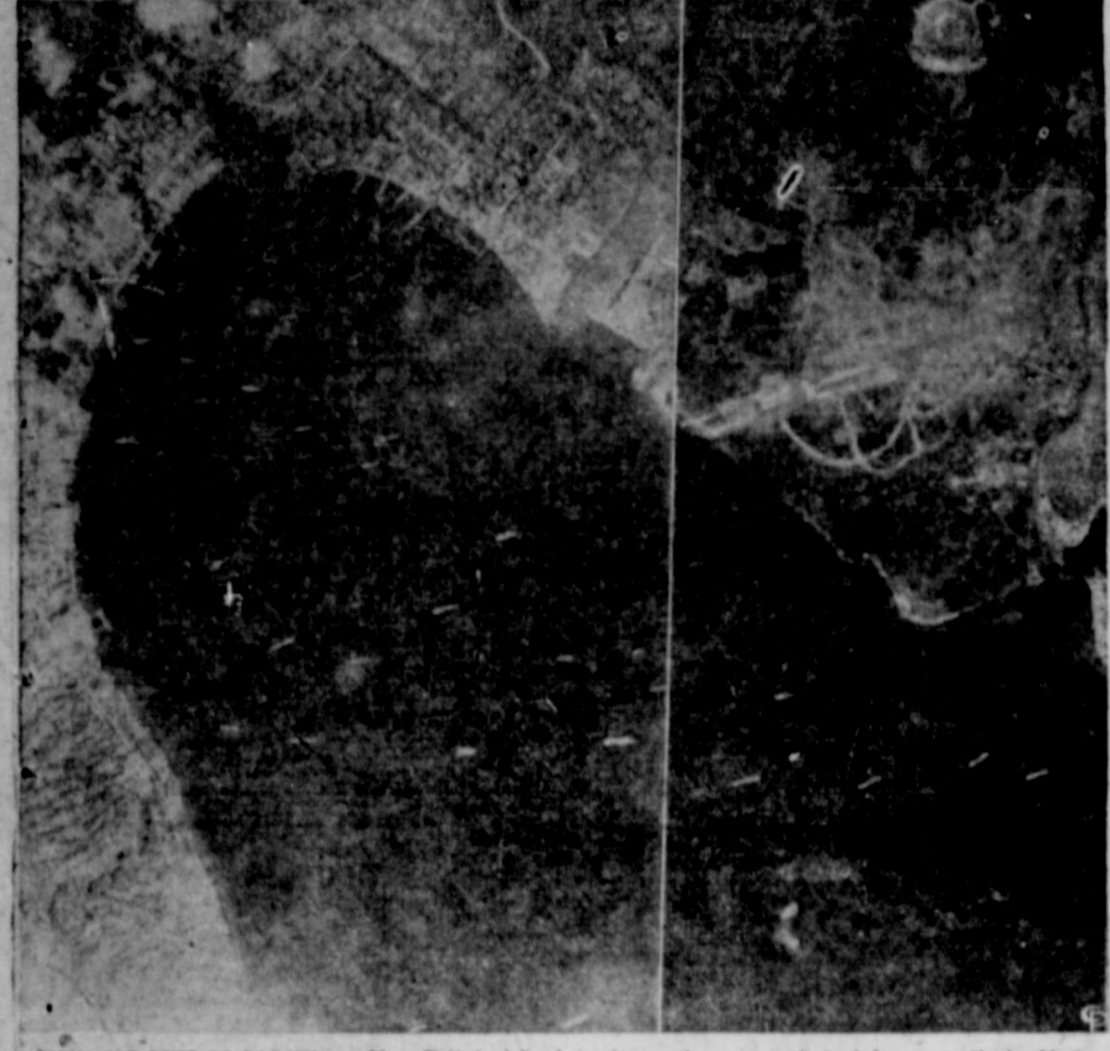

Here's How To Can Fruit Cake, Plum Pudding

If you care to mail fruit cake, or keep it for a while on your pantry shelf, here is an idea for preparing it.

Use your favorite recipe for making fruit cake. Mix the batter well and pack into greased cans. Leave 3-5 to 1 inch headspace at the top of the can. Seal the first roll on the can, and steam in the pressure cooker, leaving the potcock open. Steam No. 2 cans 74 minutes and No. 1 cans 60 minutes. Complete the seal and process immediately at 10 lbs. pressure for 30 minutes.

For canning plum pudding, prepare as for fruit cake, but process 20 minutes.
