dustrialists Speeding Plans for Reconversion Foresee Jap Evacuation Of Big Base at Rabaul

Special to Central Press

• WASHINGTON-The possibility that the German army may surrender some time in 1944 is causing leading industrialists to stress the necessity for speeding up plans for reconversion of industry to

Authoritative estimates are that from 40 to 75 per cent of outstanding war contracts will be canceled after the collapse of Ger-

The Automotive Council for War Production and other industrial groups are warning government offi-cials that plans should be under way now to meet the unemployment crisis that will follow such a colossal cancellation of contracts.

Industrialists feel that they have made some headway in convinc-ing officials of the urgency of the situation, but they still complain properly, and that responsible officials lack an adequate appreciation of the problem.

As a result of their prodding, prospects are that more and more attention will be given to problems related to contract cancellation and a host of other reconversion tasks.

This is a field that is expected to engage the increasing attention of congress, since reconversion will necessitate a great deal of legis-

lation.

Incidentally, big-wigs in the War Production Board fear that, unless more rapid headway is made in preparing reconversion plana, the Army and Navy will assume direction of reconversion by default. They want to avoid such an eventuality if possible,

• HIGH-RANKING MILITARY AND NAVY EXPERTS expect the Japa to evacuate their biggest Southwest Pacific base at Rabaul, New Britain, under pressure from American forces, which now have air and naval supremacy in that area.

But the Japs will cling to their positions as long as possible, these experts believe, in order to provide time for fortifying more strongly their bases in the mandated islands and the Netherlands East Indies. 


