"As we contemplate the dreadful evils of our time—hatred, fear, corruption, tyranny, war—we are inclined to feel that as a generation we have failed. We have disobeyed His Son's Commandment that we love one another. What then shall we do. Shall we yield to despair or worse, to apathy? Let the world continue its deadly drift toward collapse.

Such thoughts may possess us during the winter months; but with spring and Easter comes the precious gift without which man could hardly have survived during his stormy history—hope.
