Agency paid aid to chapters in all the state a total of \$6,679,634.50. Of this sum, according to the March of Dimes chairman, Texas chapters have received \$1,918,580.00.

The allotments to Texas have been proportionately larger, he explained, because of the heavy polio incidence, now in its third year. Seventy-six Texas chapters have shared in the NFIP aid.

The latest allowance totaling \$18,775.00 was sent to six Texas local chapters as follows:

Anderson County, \$2,600.00; Bexar County, \$9,000.00; Daval County, \$1,800.00; Erath County, \$900.00 and Kaufman County, \$475.00.

So improved is the present day economy of the country that in 1951 Mexico announced it sought no further loans from the United States for the development of its economic potential. New industries, new factories, hydro-electric projects, irrigation systems and the development of new oil reserves are some of the things which have characterized this administration. New highways and bridges have been built to strengthen the internal communication and transportation system of the country, and this year's education budget amounted to twice the same budget for 1947.

University City—the sprawling site of the National University of Mexico, with its modern classrooms, dormitories, 125,000-capacity stadium and its campus, is another landmark to the Aleman administration. With its facilities for a resident student body of 25,000 it is destined to take its place among the leading universities of the Western Hemisphere.

The Aleman administration has been distinguished by such able cabinet figures as Ramon Beteta, Minister of the Interior; Manuel Tello, Minister of Foreign Relations, and others. It has been an administration which has sought to maintain the value of the peso and give the nation a sound financial economy.

Adolfo Ruiz Cortines assumes the presidency at inauguration ceremonies Dec. 1, pledged to carry on with the ideals of economic, social and international policies which will continue to improve Mexico's place among the nations of the world. In him Texas, and the United States, can well commend their have a good friend and neighbor.

Mexican Republic Is Now Making Progress; President Aleman Has Improved Living Conditions

Mexico's first civilian president in a quarter of a century—Miguel Aleman—steps down from office December 1 to turn the reins of government over to another civilian pledged to a continuing program of progress and inter-American solidarity, Adolfo Ruiz Cortines.

Historians will write the story of the Aleman administration over the last six years, but even a glance by contemporary chroniclers shows it has been one during which the Republic of Mexico made tremendous economic and social gains and improved its international relations among the nations of the world.

Luring the Aleman administration his government's dealings with the United States have been among the most friendly of any period during the long relationship between the two countries. During his term of office the governments of Mexico and the United States worked closely on many projects of mutual interest and benefit, such as the stamping out of the hoof and mouth disease in Mexico, and Mexican industry profited and developed with the help of United States loans.

The Chinese Communists of Hang Kong, China, have decreed that there shall be no more illegitimate babies in China, according to local press dispatches from the mainland.

From now on, the dispatches said, babies born out of wedlock or to mothers who have divorced or whose fathers shall be called "children of the revolution" which apparently will be without stigma.

Children of divorced parents may take either the mother's or the father's name, the dispatches said. If the child doesn't like either one, he may "adopt" the biggest name in the local village as his or her own.

Children of unmarried mothers, however, have no such choice. They are stuck with the mother's surname.

Teachers and Officers First Baptist To Meet

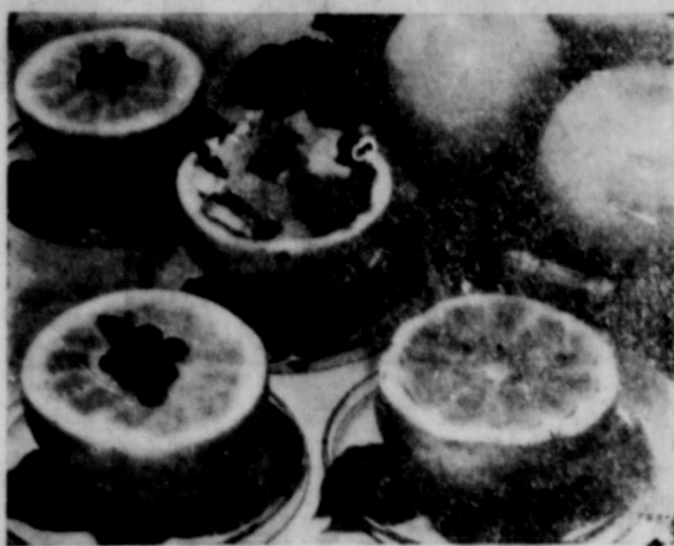
The officers and teachers of the Sunday school will meet at 6:30 tonight at the First Baptist Church for the covered dish supper and monthly planning meeting.

Grapefruit Gives You A Great Lift



Florida is a nice place to go when it starts getting cool, but even if you can't go south, you can enjoy Florida's big juicy grapefruit now being shipped to almost every section of the country.

Here are four ways to serve vitamin C-rich grapefruit halves—all of them a little different. Everyone will love grapefruit if you make it easy to get the succulent fruit out of the shell. To properly prepare it, cut the fruit in half; remove core. Cut around each section, loosening fruit from membrane. Do not cut around entire outer edge of fruit. Here's how to do the four variations shown:

Broiled Grapefruit: Sprinkle grapefruit half with 1 tablespoon sugar and a dash of cinnamon, mace or nutmeg, if desired; dot with 1 teaspoon butter. Place grapefruit on broiler rack 3 inches from heat. Broil slowly 15 to 20 minutes or until grapefruit is slightly brown and heated through. Grapefruit may also be baked in a moderately hot oven (400° F.) 15 to 20 minutes. Serve hot.

Grapefruit With Grape Garnish: Slice seedless grapes in half. Arrange 7 or 8 halves in center of grapefruit to represent bunch of grapes as shown above.

Grapefruit With Cranberry Garnish: Cut slice of cranberry jelly with small star shaped cookie cutter. Place cranberry star in center of grapefruit half.

Grapefruit Salad Bowl: Follow directions for preparing grapefruit halves. Remove sections from half; reserve. Cut out membrane remaining in shell to make "Salad Bowl." Combine grapefruit sections with diced celery and chicken, shrimp or tuna. Moisten with mayonnaise. Re-fill shells with salad and garnish with watercress.

Sweet Sugar Cane Flavor In Syrup

At this season of the year, the sugar cane begins to ripen. In the old days, this was a busy time in the bottom lands where the best sugar cane is grown. Everyone was busy hand-cutting and stripping the leaves from the ripened sugar cane; it was a familiar sight to see the old-fashioned mills, powered by mules, crushing the juice. Evaporating this juice to make the old-fashioned, highly prized ribbon cane syrup was indeed an art—many said it had become a lost art. And they had reason to think so—especially since the last war when production of cane on small farms decreased materially.

Loan Sharks In Texas Under Fire

To evade the constitutional limitations on interest, Texas loan sharks resort to devious methods, the most used scheme at present being "credit insurance," declares E. C. Fritz, Dallas attorney, who has made a study of the loan shark evil as a member of the anti-usury committee of the State Junior Bar Association.

Credit insurance is somewhat involved and intricate but the practical result is that the borrower pays approximately 140 per cent interest. Here is the way it works: A man has urgent need for \$25. He gives a note to be paid in three months in weekly installments. He is charged 24 cents as interest (10 per cent) plus a "service charge" of \$1. But before he gets the \$25, he is told:

"Something might happen to you in the next three months—an accident, serious illness, even death, so you must take out health, accident and life insurance to protect us against loss."

The premium on the insurance is \$7.96, which makes the total cost of the \$25 loan \$34.20. The insurance company receives 15 per cent of the premium; the loan company, as "agent" is allowed a commission of 85 per cent.

But the shark is not satisfied even with this: So far from working to help a borrower out of his financial problems, the company wants to keep him in debt. So if he misses a weekly installment, a day or two later he will receive a phone call, "Come down and renew."

Most of what he has already paid has been applied to the insurance premium, the service charge and the interest but suppose he has paid sufficient to reduce the \$34.20 face amount of the note to \$20. He signs a new note for the original amount (\$34.20) and receives \$5 in cash. As part of the \$34.20, he has to pay another \$7.96 credit insurance premium, even though the three months for which the first policy was written have not expired. Thus, in effect, he is paying "interest on interest." Then, when he again gets behind, he signs a new note, pays the \$7.96 premium again—and so the process goes until the borrower is so heavily involved that he is virtually working for the loan company.
