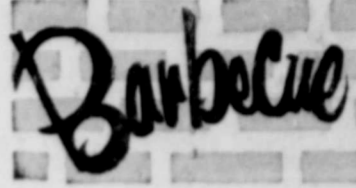

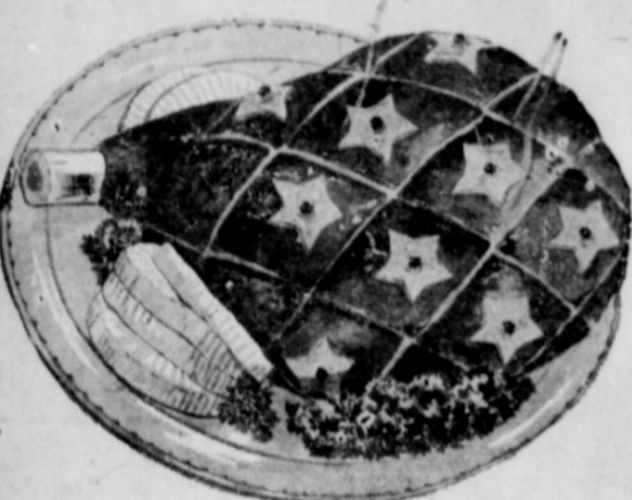

which has been directly caused by previous actions of the United States Government. The Federal Government has pegged and supported the prices of many of the commodities which the cattlemen must use in his operations. Even when there has been an over-supply of commodities badly needed by the cattlemen, he has been unable to purchase them without paying an extremely high premium.

"For example, it is not generally known by the public that the Federal Government today owns and has in storage practically all of the cottonseed meal in the United States, approximately 780,000 tons. The Government has bought up almost the entire domestic output of cottonseed meal and has it in storage. As you know, cottonseed meal, in the form of cottonseed cake, is the principal protein feed product which the cattlemen of this area use to feed their cattle during the winter and during drought periods. Feeds such as this are the life blood of the cattle industry.

"The Government is now offering to sell this cottonseed meal to foreign markets delivered at ships for export at \$52 a ton. I imagine for the most part the United States Government would, in one way or another, finance the purchase of this meal for the foreign buyers. This morning, I called and found the principal local feed manufacturers and distributors in Dallas and found that the current price for cottonseed cake here is \$70 per ton. Less than six months ago, cattlemen were having difficulty in buying cottonseed cake; I guess because the domestic production of the country had been bought up or contracted by the Federal Government. When the cattlemen last winter were able to buy cottonseed cake at all, they had to pay as high as \$105 per ton for it, which is about twice the price that the Federal Government is asking foreign buyers to pay for the surplus meal which the Government has in storage. Last winter, when the cattlemen were paying this high price for cottonseed cake, a great deal of that which they were able to buy was imported into this country from foreign countries such as Mexico. Therefore, the cattlemen

was put in the position of having to buy this feed from a foreign country and paying twice the price, while his own Government had in storage, or tied up under contract, hundreds of thousands of tons of our own domestic production of that same feed, which the Government is willing to sell to foreign countries at a much lower price than the cattlemen can buy it for even today.

"Cattlemen are going broke everyday here in Texas. The markets are flooded with ... because the cattlemen can't spend more money in his operations than he receives for his product. A great many of the cattlemen who are going broke and liquidating their herds would be able to stay in the business if they were not forced by the actions of the Government to pay a premium for
