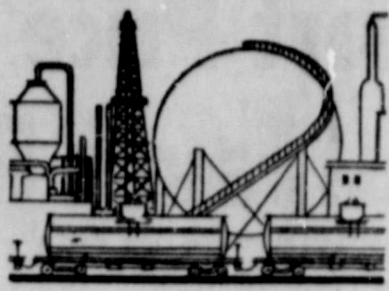

## Vietnam Veteran To Speak To Ranger Lions Thursday

Captain Jack E. Mooney, who wears four military awards for valor who was twice wounded while serving in the Vietnam jungle last year, will speak at 12:05 p.m. Thursday, July 3 to the Ranger Lions at Bryans Steak House.

## 'Just to Hold the Line', Trustees Cut Tax Rate, Increase Valuations

Ranger Independent School District trustees Tuesday night voted to lower the school tax rate from \$1.50 to \$1.20 and raise the values from 90% to 95%.

This is in effect a 23 1/3% tax increase. An example given by one taxpayer is on a house that cost \$10,000. Last year the house was assessed at 90% of value or \$9,000 and the \$1.50 rate meant a school tax of \$45.

Under the new value the \$10,000 house will be assessed at \$5,000 and based at a rate of \$1.20 with the school tax being \$60, or an increase of \$15. This is a 25 1/3% increase in the public school tax.

The total tax roll last year was \$5,817,330 but only \$5,802,610 was left after people who had assessed moved from Ranger or were unknown at tax paying time.

Using the smaller tax figure and assuming it remained the same for the 1969 tax roll and assuming 94% is collected as usual, it will bring in \$95,357 for Local Maintenance Funds of an increase of \$13,939.

Of this \$13,939, \$5,570 must be used to pay for the salary raise recently given to the teachers in Texas leaving only \$8,369.

As the tax picture is now, the tax assessment is lower than last year due to taxpayers cutting their assessments and some taxable property no longer being in the district.

Clark told the Ranger Times he wanted it understood that all the increase in tax revenue was just to hold the line and that no increased maintenance or purchases could be expected.

The trustees in other action agreed to participate again in the County Coop program whereby Ranger gets the services of a Supervisor one-half day all year. The State pays 100% of the salary of the Supervisor and the trustees are requesting that O. C. Worden be assigned to Ranger again as in the past.

They voted to join the Regional Education Service Center at Abilene again at a fee of \$587.

The resignation of Jimmy Ratliff as a bus driver next year was accepted. Ratliff told the board in a letter that he would attend school in Abilene; next year and could not drive next term. He drove the route on Highway 80 and through the college area.

The request of the J. T. Casey family to transfer six of their children to the Ranger District from the Breckenridge District was approved.

A substantial increase in the basic support price for Spanish peanuts and excellent moisture conditions at planting time have provided this major peanut growing area with one of its finest crop prospects.

The basic support price for 1969 peanuts in the Southwestern area, in which Eastland, Comanche and Brown counties are located, has been announced as \$245.12 per ton, based on the national rate of \$247.50 announced last May. This figure compares with a basic support price of \$236.07 per ton on the bumper 1968 crop.

This is an increase of almost \$9 per ton. Projected on the basis of last year's production of approximately 24,000 tons in Eastland County, this increase would mean an additional income of a quarter of a million dollars to the peanut growers of the county.

The projection contemplates, of course, that the production would be the same and that the grade would compare with the remarkable high quality of the 1968 crop.

There is strong probability that the support price will be adjusted to a higher level at market time, county agricultural leaders said. It will not be any lower.

In the Rising Star and Gorman areas much of the peanuts processed come from acreage with out the county and adjacent to those communities. The May community in northern Brown county, is another major peanut processing and marketing center, while Cross Plains, just over

the line in Callahan county west, is a strong marketing point.

The present good crop prospects are clouded to some degree by the delay in planting caused by so much violent weather and periodic heavy rains. In the Rising Star, May and northern Comanche county areas, soil and conservation district workers estimated that the crop was about 50 per cent in the ground.

Elsewhere, and generally, however, planting is only about 25 per cent completed, field workers with the County ASC office estimated. Farmers were very hopeful of getting their peanut seed in the bed before further delays caused by bad weather might result in a loss of good moisture growing conditions and a diminution of yield prospects due to July and August dry heat.

In the past three seasons late August and September rains have been very beneficial in producing bumper and clean yields, but the usual incidence of summer weather in this section does not promise that this timely and crop-making moisture will usually occur.

A small section of the peanut acreage in the north of Gorman will have to be replanted because of hail damage to acres planted early enough for the young plants to have broken ground.

Total acreage planted in 1968 in Eastland county was 32,505 acres, of which about 8,000 was in irrigated peanuts. There is expected to be some increase in the irrigated crop, but the overall acreage will remain about the same.

Total yield of the 1968 crop in Eastland county was tabulated at the County ASC

office as 47,913,440 pounds, or an average of 49 bushels per acre, a record yield.

The national rate of \$247.50 per ton was announced on April 30. The latest rate scale listed average prices for particular kinds of peanuts.

Officials said the new schedule showed a support price range of from \$238 a ton for runner types to nearly \$258 for Virginia and valencias suitable for roasting.

The department said some of the prices were modified for the first time since 1962 to reflect changes in marketing and production patterns.

Virginia-type peanuts, for example, formerly were grown mainly in Virginia and North Carolina, but these have increased recently in Georgia, Florida and Alabama.

The 1969-crop basic price support rates — subject to adjustment later in the crop year — included:

Virginia \$257.41 a ton for 1969 crop compared with \$253.73 last year; runner \$238 and \$227.37 southeast Spanish \$249.37 and \$245.69.
