A Kaffir Corn Diet for Calves.

Twenty head of grade Hereford, Shorthorn and Angus calves were purchased by the Kansas experiment station during April and May a year ago. The feed of these calves was gradually changed to skim milk with as much grain as they would eat, composed of a mixcorn. It was found that the calves would eat the ground kaffir corn when from ten days to two weeks of age and would begin to eat the whole kaffir carn when from three to four weeks old. On June 19 these calves were divided into two lots as nearly equal as possible, the lot to receive ground kaffir 157 pounds to each calf and the one to receive whole kaffir corn weighed 1,577 pounds or 157.7 pounds a head.

Each lot was fed all the skim milk, grain and hay they would eat without scouring. The roughness for both lots consisted of prairie hay only until the calves were twelve weeks old. Alfalfa was then added gradually and for a time constituted one-half of the roughness and later supplanted the prairie hay altogether. Fresh water and salt were available at all times. For the 112 days under experiment, these ten calves consumed 14,788 pounds of skim milk, 1894 pounds of ground kattir corn, 2381 pounds of prarie hay, Brown, Service and tothers 125 pounds of alfalfa hay. The total gain of the lot during the experiment was 1,580 pounds or 1.41 pounds daily for each calf. With skim milk at fifteen cents per cwt, grain at tifty cents per cwt-plus three cents a bushel or six cents per cwt for grinding-and bay at \$4 a ton, the feed-cost of raising these calves amounted to \$47.37 or \$4.78 a head. The cost percwt of grain is as follows: Skim milk 1.40, family of Mr. H. E. Hume the first of grain \$0.49, roughness \$1.10; total \$2.99.

The second lot of calves consumed 14,620 pounds of skim milk, 1,941 pounds of whole SCANDALOUS CHAS., Artistic house grass hay and 5,982 pounds of and sign painter, paints anything alfalfa hay. The total gain was 1,406 pounds or 1.26 pounds daily for each calf. The feed cost amounted to \$47.09 or \$4.70 a head. The cost per cwt of grain was as follows. Skim \$1.56, grain \$0.58, roughness \$1.20, total \$3.34. Comparing the two lots it will be noticed that the whole kaffir corn lot consumed 267 pounds more falfa hay and made 74 pounds CANYON CITY

less gain. There were a large number of grains in the case of the whole kaffir corn lot that passed through the calves undigested.

This experiment indicates that better and more economical gains are made from ground kaffir corn than from the whole grain. Nevertheless, if a man is so situated that he cannot grind kaffir corn, very fair gains can be made with the whole seed. Again, it is possible to feed the ground kaffir corn the first two or three months and then gradually change to the whole. The weekly weights and gains show that the calves receiving whole kaffir corn gained nearly as well the last five weeks of the experiment as those receiving the ground kaffir corn. It is best to feed ground kaffir corn until the calf is three or four months old, then if it is more convenient or economical the whole kaffir corn may be substituted.

Austin, Texas, June 14.—The following important opinion on the effect of the Supreme Court's decision in the Ketner case was rendered today by the Attorney General's department;

Dear Sir. We are in receipt of yours of the 10th. inst, which is as follows:

"I am receiving numerous inquiries with regard to the effect of the decision of the Supreme Court in the Ketner case, which holds that the Commissioner could not consolidate into one lease where one party had seve eral leases. I will thank you for your opinion on the follow-

"If A leased from the state ten sections of land in July. 1896, for a period of five years, and if he leased ten sections from the state in 1837 for a period of ten years, and if he .eased ten sections in 1898 for a period of six years, and if such leases were subsequently consolidated and put into one lease for a period of, say, six years, and if A has continued to pay annual rental on all this land to the present time, what would be the status of A s lease holdings under the decision of the Ketner case? Is A without any lease at all, or will the former leases which were canceled continue in force until they would have expired had they not been canceled and consolidated into one lease?

Under the case stated, one of A's leases would have expired in July, 1900, but the other two leases, had they not been consolidated, would have been in force today. Will the leases made in 1897 and 1898 be in force, the lease money on the lands having been paid under the consolidated lease?"

Under the decision of the Supreme court in the case of Ketner vs. Land Commissioner. lately decided, as we understand it, in the case stated by you, the original leases made to A are in force until they are terminated by the expiration of the terms of the leases, respecti ely, unless sooner cancelled by non-payment of rent.

The principle established by this decision, we think, is that the Commissioner had no authority to cancel the original lease except for legal cause, before the expiration of the term.

The leases made by A in 1897 and 1898, we think, will be in force until the expiration of their terms respectively, the lease money on the land having of lectures, and doubss at this been paid under the consolidated lease, provided, of course, there is no default in the payment of rent as due under such original leases in the future.
