## **BUILDING PLANS**

OF EDUCATION ACCEPTS PLANS ARCHITECTS.

Largest Normal Building in State Erected for West Texas State Normal at Canyon City.

After several days delibera tion, the State Board of Education last Saturday selected plans for the main building for the West Texas State Normal which has been located at Canyon City. A number of plans had been submitted by various architects and, from reports coming from Austin, it appears that the Board had some very elegant designs to select from. Waller, Shaw & Fields of Fort Worth were finally awarded the contract for the plans and they have promised to have the plans ready at once so that the contract for the main building may be let by the 20th of this month.

While plans of the building selected have not as yet been sent to this city, reports state that the building is to be three stories in heighth with thirty recitation rooms, two large lecture rooms, an auditorium 100 by 100 feet with a seating capacity of fifteen hundred people. It will also include a gymasium, fifty by one hundred feet and a swimming pool of like dimensions.

The outside architecture of the building will conform to the old style of Texas architecture. namely, the Mission style and the perspective presented shows of January; but, whatever may the building to be one of the hand- happen, I am determined that somest public buildings in the state. The State Board decided upon this class of architecture because of the fact that the building of this institution is such that it is intended to make the entire plans for the buildig and grounds conform to Texas ideas and to Texas ideals.

As above stated it is the intention of the State Board to let the contract for the construction of the main building by the 20th of this month so that the actual work on the building may be begun early in January. The State Board also announces that it is the intention to have the building ready for occuyancy by September first of next year so that the school may open in the early days of that month.

Those who submitted plans for the building were George Burnett of Amarillo, Waller, Shaw & Fields of Ft. Worth, Henry T. Phelps of San Antonio, C. H. Page & Bro. of Austin, Scott & Pierce of Waco, Thompson & Harrison of Dallas, J. Ira Jones of Lawton, Okla., Barry H. Hill of Plainview, A. O. Watson of Austin and R. G. Kirsch of St.

A Letter From R. B. Cousins.

The following letter handed to the News by L. E. Cowling, one of the Normal school trustees, s self explanitory.

Austin, Tex., Dec. 6, 1909. Mr. L. E. Cowling,

Canyon City, Texas. Dear Sir:

with exasperating slowness. have pushed with all possible strength in this normal school matter since the law became effective last June. The Board has fnally selected architects and they are now at work on the details of our new building. It affords me very great pleasure to say that, in my judgment, the architects selected are men of the very highest training and experience in the kind of work which we have in hand. I am entirely confident that we shall have a school house which is thoroughly modern in every particular, and which shall exhibit in its construction the very best that has been developed and proved in school architecture. Within a week or ten days, I feel sure, we will be ready to invite the contractors to make their figures. I am hoping that the contractor will be ready and the work begun by the first day our school shall open the first week of next September. I shall insist that the contractors be put under bond to finish the house by the first day of September, 1910, and that the date for the opening of the school be fixed not later than the 15th day of next September. If the State Board of Education will co-operate with me in these matters, the school will open during the first part of the month of September without fail. If it should so happen that the building can not be made ready for occupancy by that time, with the consent and co-operation of the good people of Canyon City and Randall County, the school will open, if necessary, in the court house, the city churches, under a tent, or elsewhere on the date fixed. 

Every time a lawyer counsels controversy for the establishment of a or for the promulgation of new law sale no trouble resulted. beneficial to the majority of society he is exercising his true function, and the charge which he lays upon his individual client and through him upon industry and progress in the mass, if reasonable in amount, is well earned and should be cheerfully paid.

When however, a lawyer gives the other kind of advice the expense, perhaps cheerfully borne by the client who profits personally therefrom, must be finally laid upon society as a whole. which is thereby paying for its own injury and naturally resents the charge.-Donald R. Richberg in Atlantic.




