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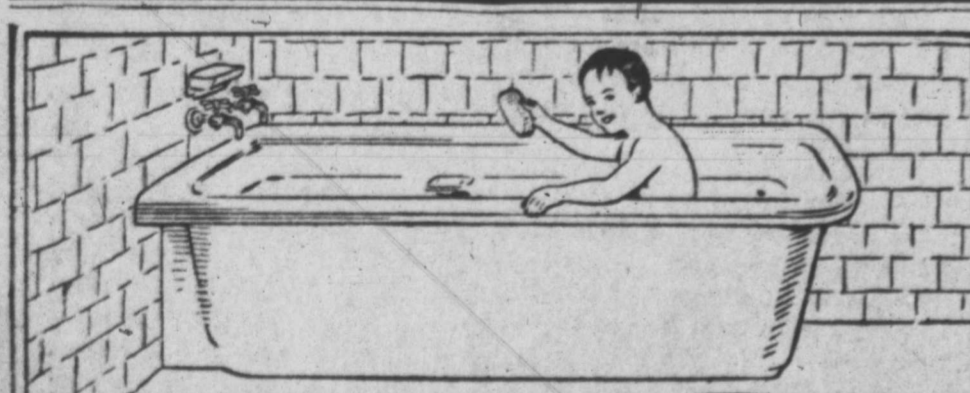

AMERICAN TROOPS CROSS THE BORDER

ONE AMERICAN OF 82D ARTILLERY KILLED AND ANOTHER SERIOUSLY WOUNDED.

VILLA COMMANDS REBELS

Fighting Seems to Be Confined Wholly to That Section Surrounding the Famous Race Track.

El Paso, Texas.—Shrapnel shells were bursting over and around the race track grand stand at the rate of three a minute at Juarez Sunday morning and Sunday night. After Colonel Merrill's eighty-second artillery battalion obtained the range with the first shot fired, every shot was a hit and the race track, infield and paddock, where the Villa troops were known to be, were showered with shrapnel.

The purpose of the enveloping movement was stated at headquarters to be to prevent the Villa forces from escaping southeast to the mountains or in crossing to the American side of the border, where they might harm individual Americans.

Following the killing of one artilleryman of the eighty-second artillery and the serious wounding of another by Mexican snipers General Erwin ordered 25 expert riflemen to that point to return the sniper's fire. The shot which killed the artilleryman were fired before the American artillery began the bombardment of the race track.

Juarez, Mex.—A general attack on Juarez has begun.

The exodus of the people of Juarez was resumed. A cordon of troops has been thrown about the southern part of El Paso to corral the refugees. One hundred Chinese were first to cross and were detained by the immigration authorities.

The fighting started in the extreme southeastern part of the town near the Juarez race track. This was evidently done to prevent bullets falling in El Paso. Light artillery fire interspersed the small arms firing.

Colonel Del Arco was in command of the federal forces, which were resisting the Villa attack from the east side of the town. No report of the casualties could be obtained shortly after the fighting started. Artillery fire from Fort Hidalgo continued at intervals.

BRITISHERS ACCOMPLISH NON-STOP ATLANTIC FLIGHT

VICKERS-VIMY PLANE DAMAGED IN LANDING IN IRELAND, BUT FLYERS UNINJURED.

London.—The final goal of all the ambitions which flying men have ventured to dream since the Wright brothers first rose from the earth in a heavier than air machine was realized when the young British officers, Captain John Alcock and Lieutenant Arthur Brown, landed on the Irish coast after the first nonstop flight across the Atlantic ocean.

Their voyage was without accident, and without unforeseen incident so far as can be learned. It was a straightforward, clean-cut flight, achieved in six hours and twelve minutes—from Newfoundland to Clifden, Ireland, a distance of more than 1,900 miles.

Before coming to earth near the Clifden wireless station, Alcock circled the wireless airdrome seeking the best spot to reach the earth. But no suitable ground was found to be chanced it in a box.

The wireless staff rushed to the aid of the aviators. They found Brown fazed and Alcock temporarily deafened by the force of the impact. As soon as they were able to be escorted to the wireless station they telegraphed the news to their friends and then had breakfast.

S. A. in Need of Support

Dallas.—Only \$40,000 has been raised in the Salvation Army home service campaign for \$45,000, according to an announcement made by John W. Everman, active vice chairman of the campaign. "Overconfidence in the success of the campaign explains a number of the failures to subscribe generously. This misconception of the new status of the Salvation Army and the general overconfidence has resulted in forcing us to continue our campaign."

Chinese President May Resign Office.

Pekin.—In consequence of difficulties created by the popular movement against pro-Japanese members of the government the cabinet has resigned and President Hsu Shih Chang has also intimated his intention to quit office.

Insists Upon Passage of Poles

Coblentz.—An ultimatum demanding the immediate continuation of the movement of Polish troops across Germany has been sent to the German government by Marshal Foch.

Good Roads Association Will Meet

Austin, Texas.—The annual meeting of the Texas Good Roads Association will be held at Corpus Christi Friday and Saturday, July 4 and 5. This date has been selected on account of Friday, July 4, being a holiday.

DALLAS ENTERTAINS SOLDIERS OF 36TH

PARADE FROM COURTHOUSE TO CITY HALL THENCE TO FAIR PARK.

Dallas.—More than 2,000 bronzed "doughboys" from the battlefields of France are in Dallas. Troop trains bearing the men of the 111th engineer regiment and the 131st machine gun battalion entered the city early Saturday morning. The parade in the morning was from the courthouse on Main street to the city hall. From the city hall the men were taken in special cars to Fair park, where they were tendered an old fashioned picnic, with home cooking prepared by the mothers of the city.

By proclamation of the mayor a holiday was declared for the occasion. Every energy was bent in making the "doughboys" feel the pride that all Texas has in their exploits overseas. Not a stone had been left unturned by the thirty-sixth division reception committee in paving the way for a most royal welcome.

The path of the soldiers were showered with flowers, thrown from the hands of people of the city witnessing the impressive spectacle. Deeming this as an appropriate expression on the part of the people of the city, the committee requested all who attended to bring large bouquets of flowers from their homes for use in this way. Giving the soldiers a welcome commensurate with the spirit of the time, by cheering, blowing of horns and other loud demonstrations was also engaged in during the parade.

A picnic was held in machinery hall at Fair park, at 11 o'clock. Both the hall and the grounds were fittingly decorated for the occasion. On one side was placed a large banner, on which was inscribed "We Have Tried to Keep the Home Fires Burning." Bunting and flags were placed throughout the hall, and tables and a band stand arranged for the picnic. Home cooking, prepared with sedulous care by the mothers, wives and sweethearts of the soldiers, constitute the menu. "Making the boys feel that they are being welcomed back home," was the motto of the refreshment committee, and every effort was devoted to making the picnic as homelike as possible. The serving of the refreshments was under the supervision of the wives, mothers and sweethearts of boys who have served in France so that a personal interest pervaded the entire celebration.

The soldiers were admitted first into the picnic hall, after which provision was made for the families and friends of the men.

These returning Texans and their neighbors and comrades from Oklahoma represent spick and span outfits. Their very demeanor was a tribute to their soldierly qualities. The 131st machine gun battalion, commanded by Major Ellis Stevenson of Oklahoma City, had a record of its own. It was the second unit of the American army to throw consternation into the ranks of its Hun opponents from out of the mouths of Browning machine guns, and the Thirty-Sixth division was the only organization fully equipped with the pet death dealers of the United States army. The 131st was a fully motorized outfit, as was true of all divisional machine gun battalions. It was in the line eighteen days and performed wonderfully valiant service where a weakness appeared between the 141st and 142d infantry, flanks of the Thirty-Sixth division, and a French division. At a critical juncture Major General William R. Smith sent the 131st machine gun battalion to relieve the French and the Texas and Oklahoma gunners wrote fear in the hearts of the Germans from their Browning guns. The machine gunners marched in the parade without arms.

Knox Proposal Seems Defeated

Washington.—Senator Hitchcock has announced that an administration poll of the senate on the Knox resolution showed all democrats except Senator Reed opposed to the measure and eight republicans also opposed to it. This report, which will be made to President Wilson, may lead to a "show down vote," according to the belief of some democratic leaders.

Omsk Government Gets Recognition.

Paris.—The reply sent by the council of four to the note of Admiral Kolchak extends to him and his associates in the all-Russian government at Omsk the support set forth in the original letter of the council to Kolchak. This is interpreted here as meaning de facto recognition of the Omsk government.

18 Drown When Launch Capsizes.

Tuscaloosa, Ala.—The 60-foot pleasure launch Mary Francis, with 53 persons, mostly children, on board, turned turtle in the Warrior river three miles above Tuscaloosa. Eighteen persons are known to have been drowned and 15 others are missing.

Sign Resolution for Ratification

Austin, Texas.—Seven members of the senate finance committee have signed the resolution to ratify the national suffrage amendment by the legislature of Texas.

Home Ownership Amendment Lost

Dallas.—Practically complete returns on the election of May 24 show that the home ownership amendment was defeated by a majority of 386 votes, the totals being 150,714 for and 151,690 against.

THE LEGISLATURE AND THE NORMAL

When Dr. J. A. Hill, president of the West Texas State Normal College, appeared before the House Appropriations Committee yesterday in Austin, and asked for an appropriation for a state dormitory here, a heated discussion ensued, in which the location of the school was assailed, by several members. Representative Satterwhite, of the Amarillo district, made the assertion that if the town had failed to provide facilities for the students, the state had simply sold the school to Canyon for \$100,000. Then the old joker of moving the school to Amarillo was brought up.

When the rapid growth of the West Texas State Normal is taken into consideration, under war conditions, the same state of affairs would be found anywhere, even in Amarillo. Right now Amarillo does not have boarding facilities for its own population, and the landlords are charging oil town prices, a condition which would be impossible with a student population. Canyon would have had several new dormitories in the past two years if it had not been for building restrictions, and the Normal's enrollment has increased until it is now second if not first in the state. There is not a state school in the United States which has grown to the size of the local school, but what certain difficulties have been encountered in providing boarding facilities, and it has been necessary for the state to furnish one or two dormitories.

The returns to the investor are not large enough to attract private capital, in any instance, in building boarding houses. A student body must be furnished boarding accommodations at a minimum. The only practical way is for the state to furnish part of these accommodations, where profit is no consideration. And now it would seem that the certain legislators are not facing facts in this problem, but are allowing jealousy of Canyon to enter into their preponderance of the question. They would go to the futile expense of selling the school to a grasping town rather than build a dormitory which they have furnished to other schools.

It would be wrong to say that Canyon was not awake to its obligations to this school. It it were not so, the present growth of the school would be impossible. The city is doing everything in its power to improve civic conditions, and there is not a cleaner town, from a civic and moral standpoint, than Canyon, in Texas. The water is pure and the climate ideal. The legislator is offering an insult to the locating committee by inferring that the town was not given the school upon its civic and moral assets. The town can and will furnish ample boarding facilities for students, but the state should not discriminate against this institution, and deny it what it has furnished to other schools.

U. S. EMPLOYMENT SERVICE A VITAL FACTOR TO LABOR.

Terminating the action of Congressman Thomas L. Blanton in voting against the continuation of the present organized United States Employment Service, as "exceedingly unfortunate and untimely," Federal Director H. W. Lewis last night declared that the loss to the State of Texas and the United States would be tremendous.

"According to figures of the Department of Labor," stated Mr. Lewis, "there is an average of 900,000 idle men in the United States each year, idle in the sense that they are changing from one job to another and temporarily out of work. Assuming that a properly functioning Employment Service could keep this average down say just 100,000 or keep the

average of unemployed at 800,000 a year, and figuring a laborer's wage at a low mean average of \$2.00 per day it can readily be seen that the economical loss is \$200,000 per day to the country and that the lost production of this number of men each year would be enormous.

"Congressman Blanton's vote on the appropriation for the employment service was inconsistent with his emphatic statements to the press and his constituents that he was in favor of an employment service as a peace time agency," declared Mr. Lewis. Substantiating his statement that Congressman Blanton has reversed himself in his statements to the people whom he represents Federal Director Lewis quotes the following letter from Mr. Blanton addressed to the Abilene Chamber of Commerce in reply to an appeal from them to Congressman Blanton asking for the continuation of the Employment Service:

"I am just in receipt of your favor of the 27th and replying thereto will state that I am strongly in favor of the United States Employment Service being extended and perfected in a permanent way to render timely assistance in peace as well as war time."

"Replying on Congressman Blanton's support of the Employment Service the Chamber of Commerce at Abilene, with the cooperation of the spirited citizens, furnished the necessary funds for the continuation of the Abilene office of the Service until Congress could pass the needed appropriations," declared Mr. Lewis.

"Aside from the fight being waged by Congressman Blanton on the Service, the farmers of Texas are facing one of the largest labor shortages that has existed for many years, and one of the best remedies possible has been the Employment Service. Calls from every section of the state are coming into the District office asking us for labor. With our reduced force and lack of field offices over the state we are badly handicapped, however, we are making every effort possible to fill at least a portion of each of these calls for help."

All kinds of Eats, Drinks, Short Speeches, Stunts, and a Mammoth Parade with Floats representing every Business House in Canyon.

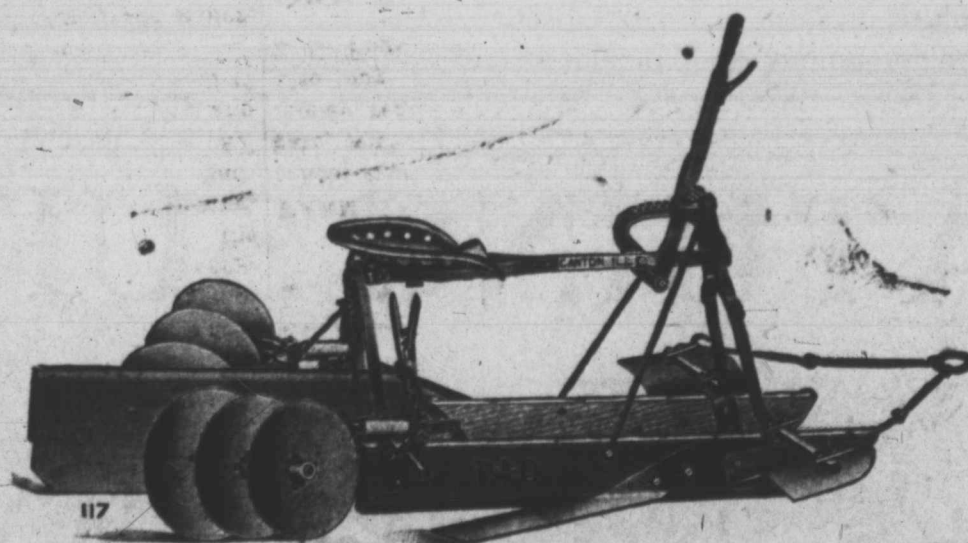
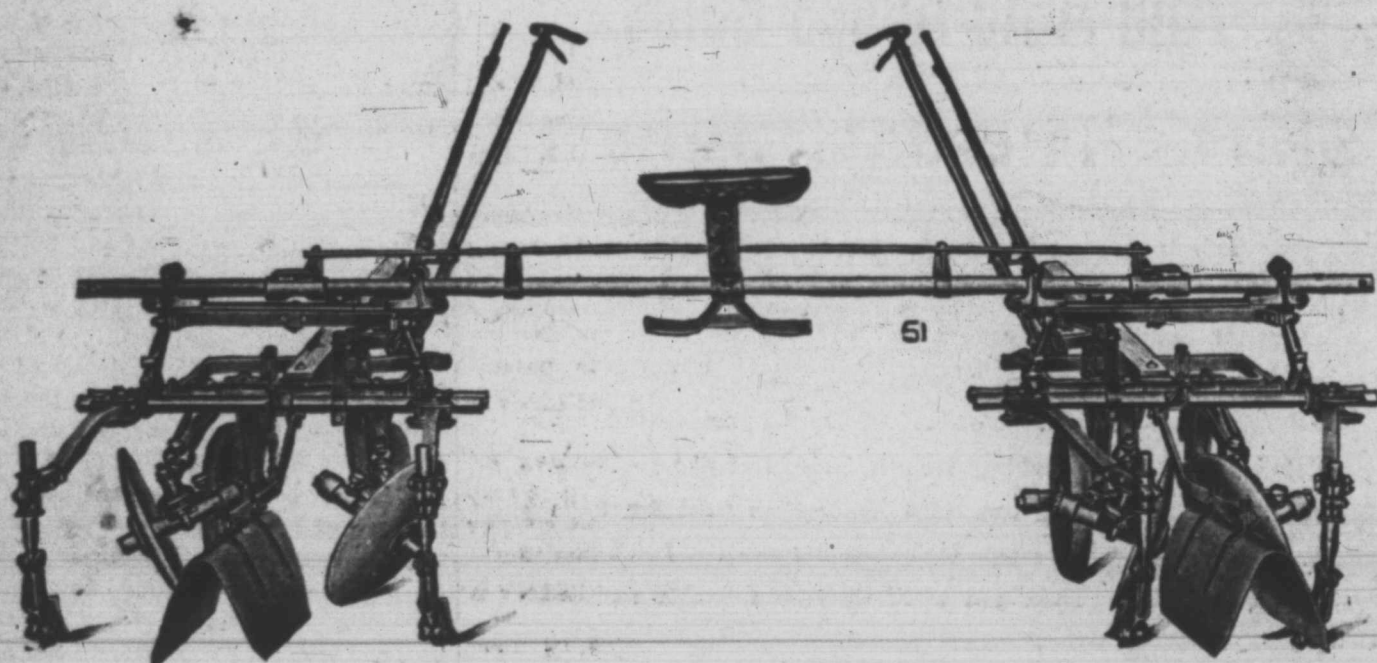
Every citizen of Randall County is requested to bring a basket dinner to be spread on the Court House lawn at 12:30 m.
