Humble Testing Top Of Devonian In No. 1 Turner

Humble Oil & Refining Company No. 1 Turner, East Midland County wildcat, about 12 miles southeast of Midland, was to make a swabbing test in the top of the Devonian at 11,360-375 feet, through perforations in the 5-inch liner which had been run through that formation. There were some indications of

possible production in drilling samples from the interval, but operator was never able to get a satisfacory drillstem test on the horizon. Location is 660 feet from west and 1,980 feet from north lines of section 43, block 37, W. T. Holcombe, T-3-S.



V-2 Rocket Fails To Make Hoped-For Man-Made Meteorites

WHITE SANDS, N. M .- (AP)-A German V-2 rocket, trailing a long string of white fire, soared cometlike to a record 111 miles into the heavens Tuesday night, but its man-made meteorites were so puny they eluded most eyes.

A scientific evaluation of the meteorites experiment awaits development of film from cameras, some 300 of which were trained here and over the Southwest on the heavens over this Southern New Mexico ordnance proving ground.

The rocket shoot itself was termed the best so far by Lt. Col. Harold R. Turner, White Sands commandant.

Not only did the 14-ton (28,462 pound) missile crack the July 30 altitude record of 104 miles, but also it established a new speed of 5,350 feet per second-more than a mile a second and about five times the speed of sound.

Controlling Many Hotels In U.S., Hilton Nation's Greatest Host-To Paying Guests

NEW YORK -(NEA) - Conrad Nicholson Hilton, 54, a tall, graying, pleasant but extremely restless man, is the nation's greatest

host—to paying guests.

In the midst of the housing shortage, he controls 10,000 rooms in a dozen different hotels, from New York's swank Plaza and the equally plush Town House in Los Angeles to smaller Hilton hotels in Lubbock and Longview, Texas. But being host isn't what Hilton

finds most fascinating about the hotel business. "I like the negotiation, acquisition and financing of the properties best." he says. "I've always got the






