

TWO NEW PROJECTS STAKED IN DOLLAR HIDE REGION

Magnolia Petroleum Company has staked two new locations in the multi-pay Dollar Hide field of extreme Southwest Andrews Coun-

ty, for immediate drilling. Magnolia No. 3-C E. P. Cowden will be 660 feet from south and west lines of the southeast quarter of section 5, block A-55, psl survey. It is slated to go to at least 9,000 feet, to test into the Devon-

Magnolia No. 7-B E. P. Cowden will be 660 feet from north and east lines of the east half of the northwest quarter of section 4, block A-55, psl survey. It is slated to dig to about 9,000 feet, to try to develop commercial production from both the Devonian and the Silurian.

This project is a twin well to Magnolia No. 5-B Cowden, recently completed Ellenburger producer. That development showed for production from the sections which No. 7-B will explore.

DEEP PAY EXTENDER IS TO COMPLETE IN OPEN HOLE

Magnolia No. 6-B Cowden, one half mile south extender for the Ellenburger zone in the Dollar Hide field, and 3.300 feet from north and 1,980 feet from west lines of section 4, block A-55, psl survey, is on a total depth of 10,sult 003 feet in Ellenburger and is to complete and put on production. The seven-inch casing is cemented at 9,978 feet, and the open hole section will be the only portion of the Ellenburger which will be produced at this time.

Top of the formation was at 9.890 feet. The horizon between that point and the casing seat had cilities. shown for good flowing production -but that will be left cased off for the present.


Cagers Take Half Holiday Vacation



Eight Midlanders In Danger

Suppose a story in today's Reporter-Telegram started off like this:

"State, county and city officers redoubled their efforts to save the lives of eight persons in Midland County ho apparently are doomed to horrible, violent death."

Sensational? Well, such a story could be expected Wa o draw shocked gasps from every newspaper reader in he nation.

Yet the story is true. It won't gain nationwide, nor ven statewide attention. Perhaps not even everybody in Tex Midland County will notice it.

Cn the basis of statistics, eight healthy persons are in ann danger of bone-breaking, bloody extinction in Midland tern County between now and the end of this month.

In 1946, 13 persons were killed in automobile wrecks the county. Six met death inside the city limits. The ther seven were killed on highways in Midland County. sion

This year, only five persons have died in automobile in t rashes here; three were killed outside the city limits, two vithin the city. "Only five" This is a strange way to spea ay it, considering that any one of those who died meant neer everything to somebody else.

State highway patrolmen, the sheriff and his depuies, and police are hoping to see the year 1948 arrive in idland with no more fatalities on the road recorded. hey are working harder, longer hours than ever before his year, trying to catch reckless drivers elated by Christhas spirits or by ordinary spirits bought by the pint. The officers figure if they can stop such drivers in time, they may be able to save those eight precious lives. Over the nation as a whole, traffic deaths this year are expected to exceed those of last year. If this expectation is justified in Midland, then there are at least eight human beings in extreme jeopardy.

Perhans this is a sensational way to put it. Officers whose business it is to keep down traffic injuries and atalities would resort to sensationalism or practically any other means to halt the slaughter. Yet, about all they can do is plead with drivers to be careful.

Maybe Midlanders believe their highways are safer than others. State highway officers don't feel that way about it. In their headquarters at the State Department of Public Safety there is a large map, showing principal traffic arteries of the state. A 50-mile section of U.S.
