## Over Million Loaned In This County By F.L.B.

At the close of the year 1933 there were 160 applications on file with the Dimmitt National Farm Loan Association, according to the annual report of the Association given in their annual stock holder's meeting held January 9, 1934; by their secretary treasurer, B. D. Woodlee.

The 160 applications pending were seeking a total loan amount of \$998,400.00. In the year reported on, the Association had closed 63 loans which disbursed \$1,521,000.00 to various farmers throughout the county for refinancing of their loans.

Almost all of this work was accomplished in the last two quarters of the year 1933. In the last quarter, 46 loans were closed for an amount of \$1,315,000.00 and about 100 applications were taken in that quarter for \$432,800.00 worth of money to be loaned.

This sudden increase in loan applications and loans being closed in the last half of the year was due to the act of Congress, creating a special Emergency Loan for this purpose, to serve as a means of financing the land of the farmer, payment of delinquent taxes, second lien holder, long deferred taxes and various other pressing obligations that were harassing the farmer in his struggle to get back on his feet once more.

## CWA Payroll In Dimmitt Amounts To \$3,000 Weekly

Approximately 210 men of Castro county are now employed on the two CWA projects now under way in Dimmitt, with a payroll approximating \$3,000 weekly, according to a report made by the local CWA officials.

For the present only two projects are under way in Castro county; the reconditioning of Bedford avenue in Dimmitt with a caliche base and terracing and concrete work at school buildings. Each school in Castro county has been offered an opportunity to submit a project for improvement of its grounds and buildings, and many have already done so.

Other projects have been submitted for different types of work but as yet approval has not been obtained.

Under existing conditions, no more men are being employed on the projects now under way, as both are now filled with all needed labor. It is hoped, administrative officials say, that more work can be opened up in order that further employment may be afforded to needy Castro county residents.
