## Favorite Recipes Leftover Easter

With Easter a couple of weeks away，it＇s time to gather up egg recipes to make use of what the
Easter Bunny brings Depending on the types of eggs your family decorates，you will need recipes either for hard－cooked eggs or for＂scrambled＂eggs．
When I was a child，we dyed boiled eggs with Paas Easter egg dye every year．A whiff of white vinegar still brings back memories of little bowls filled with colored vinegar
and hard－boiled eggs． and hard－boiled eggs． German tradition of eggshell trees small trees or branches decorated with blown－out eggshells．I blew－ out eggs until my cheeks were sore
and decorated a tree full of and decorated a tree full of
eggshells． To blow an egg out of its
shell，wash and dry the egg．Then， make a small hole in the small end of the egg by pricking it several
times with a sterilized Prick the large end of the egg several times，making a larger hole than is in the small end．

Blow through the small end of the egg，letting the contents of the egg flow from the large end into a
cup or bowl．Rinse the shell in cup or bowl．Rinse the shell in
cold water and let it dry．The egg contents should be used imme－ diately or frozen．
Blown－out eggshells can be
dyed in the same dyes as hard dyed in the same dyes as hard－
cooked，but you probably will need to hold the egg down in the dye． Blown－out eggshells also can be decorated with glued－on paper，lace，
sequins，etc． sequins，elc．
If you use hard－cooked eggs for If you use hard－cooked eggs for
your Easter decorations，keep them refrigerated as much as possible． Do not use eggs that are cracked or that have been out of the refrigerator for more than two
hours． In fact，for a safe Easter，it is best to keep hard－cooked eggs in the
house and to use blown－out eggshells for the traditional Easter egg hunt．
Try the following recipes this
Easter season： Easter season：

CHEESE CASSEROLE 6 large red potatoes chicken soup $1-8$ oz．carton sour cream $1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper 4 hard－cooked egges，chopped
2 tablespoons dry breadcrumbs 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese Cook whole potatoes in
boiling water for $25-30$ minutes or
until tender．Drain and let cool．
Peel and cut into $1 / 4$－inch slices set aside．Combine soup，sour cream，curry powder and pepper： mix well．In a 12 ＂x8＂baking dish， arrange half of the potato slices；
sprinkle with half of the chopped eggs and top with half of the soup mixture．Repeat layers．Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes．
Sprinkle with breadcrumbs and

cheese．Return casserole to oven，
uncovered uncovered，and bake for another 5 minutes or until the cheese melts．

Who Gets Dividends
Many investors buy common stock for future growth and the current income they receive through
dividends. Dividends are usually paid
quarterly to stockholders of record. It's important, therefore, to plan your buying and selling in advance
if you want the stock's next if you want the stock's next

understand three important dates: the ex-dividend date, the record date and the pay date.

This is the date a stock This is the date a stock goes the time between the announcement and the payment of the next dividend. If you buy your shares during this interval, you're not
